



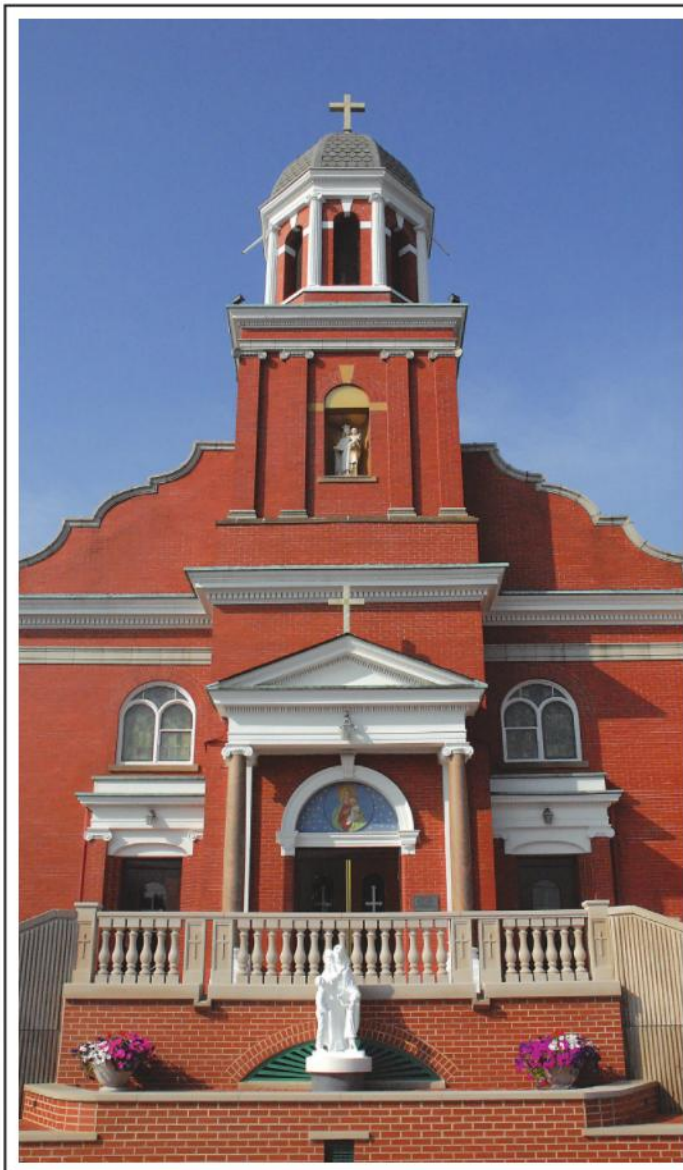

CRAIG'S CORNER
A note from our music director

Fresh off our discourse on the end times in last weekend's Gospel, we again follow a similar path this weekend as we hear Paul tell the Thessalonians to stay alert and prepared by not being people in darkness, but rather be people of light. The reading from Proverbs and our Psalm offer insight into how to make this possible in our families and in our homes. These readings are very similar or identical to what are proclaimed at many wedding Masses. Psalm 128 "Blessed are those who fear the Lord" is one of the most common wedding psalms. Just like those who bring about doing good, reaching out their hands to the poor, extending their arms to the needy, Proverbs states that these qualities are more valuable than pearls. We of course know this is Christ's message to us in the Gospels as well.

This weekend's Gospel also prepares us again for the end times. Jesus uses another parable to explain the coming of the Kingdom of God and His second coming. He compares it to a man and his servants to whom he gives talents (in this case talents are a denomination of money) and each servant reacts differently. Two of them double their money while the third buries it in the ground scared of what will happen. In the end, of course the master is pleased with the ones who made more with what they were given while he is deeply angered at the one who did nothing and earned no interest. The same goes for the Kingdom: Christ gives us many tools and words to live by and we can either cultivate them or bury them in the ground and not build up the kingdom on earth. We must be like what we hear in the other readings, by living out our call of Christian discipleship extending our arms to those in need and staying prepared for Christ's coming when we are called again to the Father. Hopefully he tells us what the master told the servants in today's Gospel: "well done my good and faithful servant."

Thus our music this weekend focuses on our call to building the Kingdom. Our entrance hymn blends all the readings together this weekend by reminding us we are the light of the world, sharing our bread with the hungry, feeding the lost and the homeless. As we approach Thanksgiving, our communion hymn "Ti Ringrazio, O Mio Signore" (I Give Thanks to You, O My God) this weekend should remind us that we must give thanks to God for all we have and all that we can share with our brothers and sisters in Christ. That is our call to discipleship and a good way for us to prepare ourselves for the second coming. We must stay alert, never tiring of helping others, never tiring of building up God's kingdom on earth so that we will not be caught off guard when we are called to the eternal kingdom of heaven. I once again this weekend want to thank and welcome Alec Ring from St. Peter and Paul Church for taking over the organ bench for the Sunday 9 and 11AM Masses while I take some time out of town for a few days.

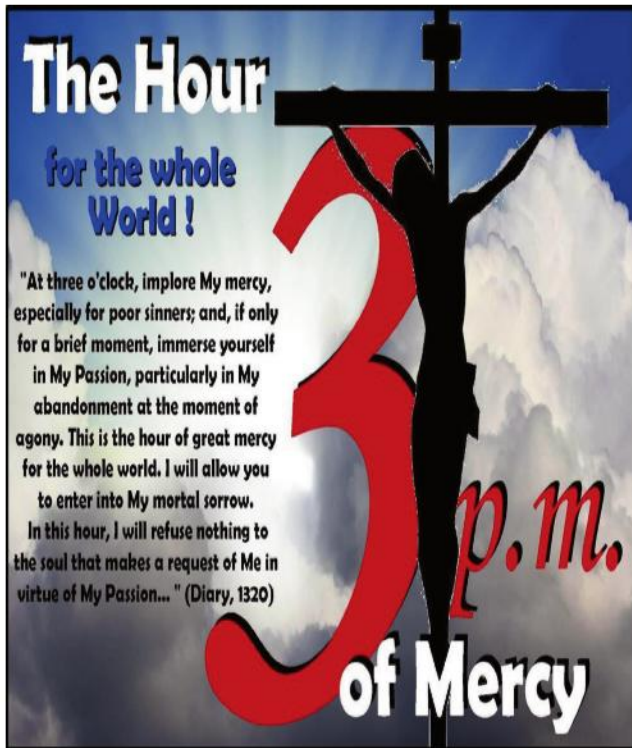

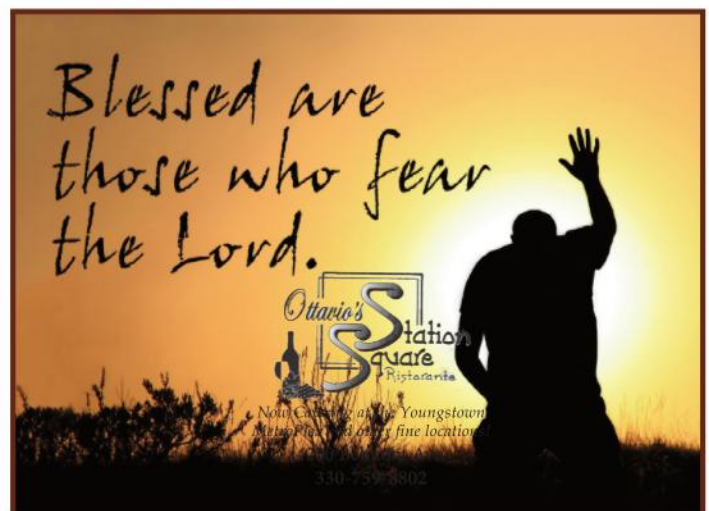

This Sunday's Gospel reading reminds us not to bury the gifts that God has given us. To do so is to be a "wicked, lazy servant!"

Ouch.

We all have at least one buried talent. There's more we could be doing for the kingdom of God, but we think: "Not me. I'm not gifted enough" or "Someone else can do it better" or "God can't be telling me to do *that*" or "I don't have the time, the financial resources, the know-how, or good enough health".

There's no holy excuse for wasting anything good that God has given us, but sadly it happens quite often, because we don't realize how necessary our talents are for the Church and our joint mission of spreading Christ's influence upon the world.

What's pushing your gifts and talents aside? What's interfering with your usefulness to the kingdom of God? Now is the time to open wide your potential and release your tal-

ents into God's plans!

We are all gifted "enough" to make a difference for God's kingdom, because our abilities come from him.

We're his servants, and it's up to him, not us, to decide what we're capable of doing. Even the homebound and the bedridden have a divine purpose that can be ac-



complished in their circumstances and sufferings. Often, these precious people are very powerful prayer warriors and have some of the soundest wisdom on earth.

Have you wondered: "If God is so good, why does he allow evil?" The answer is: It's *we* who allow it! We are the Body of Christ on earth. We are his hands and feet and vocal chords. Jesus wants to make our world more heavenly; he does it through us.

Reflect & Discuss:
