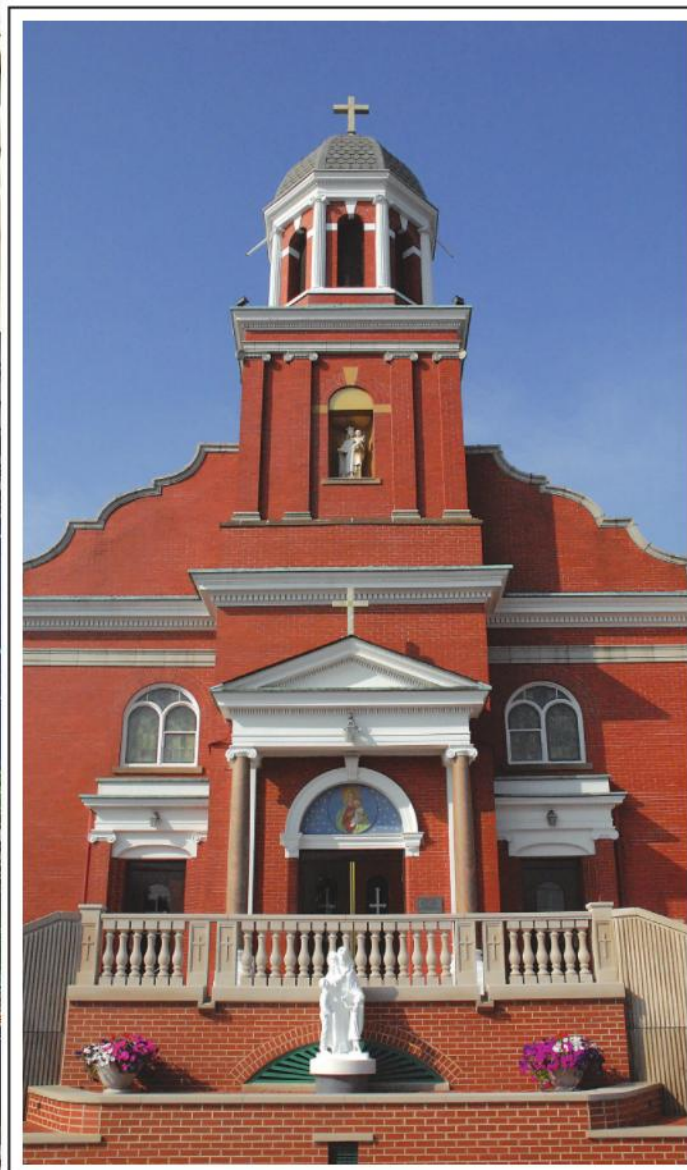

Dispensation From The Obligation To Attend Sunday Mass

The Catholic faithful who reside in the Diocese of Youngstown and all other Catholics in the diocese and especially those who are sick, or at high risk of becoming sick continue to be dispensed from their Sunday obligation until further notice. The Easter Duty obligation is extended for a period of one year from the end of the Easter Season 2020.

CRAIG'S CORNER

Today we are given two images of Christ our king of the universe. This solemnity which ends the Sundays of our Liturgical Year portrays Christ as the powerful king who defeated death and will destroy every other authority and power (today's second reading) while also portraying Christ as the calm shepherd who separates the lambs from the goats (the first reading, psalm and Gospel). He tells us what he expects of us directly as he had many other times we have heard from Matthew's Gospel this year, in our love of neighbor: to care for those less fortunate, to clothe the naked, to feed the hungry, to care for the sick; all the qualities which Christ reminds us of as our Catholic social teaching tells us is part of our Christian discipleship. While Christ can be a gentle shepherd, his message and the result of our inaction is more powerful than any authority and power that take place in this present age we live in right now. This weekend, I chose music to specifically state this simple, calm, yet profound, strong, and powerful truth.

First, the prelude this week is taken from the melody of a common paraphrase of Psalm 23, "Shepherd me, O God, beyond my wants, beyond my fears, from death into life." This psalm (which we hear the full text of in the responsorial psalm) is of course the calming nature of Christ in His role as shepherd. Our opening hymn and closing hymns respectively, *Festival Canticle* and *To Jesus Christ our Sovereign King* dives more into the kingship and the powerful figure of Christ. It is He who is to receive our praise, power, riches, wisdom, strength, honor, blessing, glory and might. He is the world's salvation – something which we can attain through no one other than Him. Our offertory and communion texts are taken directly from the Gospel as we follow Christ's teaching of clothing the naked, feeding the hungry, caring for the sick and imprisoned, and so on. Finally, our postlude uses the powerful "emperor" visual for Christ based on the imagery we hear in the second reading.

While we come to the end of our Liturgical Year this week, one thing that never changes in our celebration of the Mass no matter which year we are in, is that the Eucharist is central to our faith and must be that which nourishes us so that we can be spiritually sustained to fulfill our call to Christian holiness. As our communion hymn combines our Gospel message this weekend and our celebration of the Mass, let us always remember as we are about to embark on yet another journey of Liturgical Year from Advent through Easter into Ordinary Time 2021, we may always share our lives in remembrance of Him: our calming shepherd, and our powerful king and Savior.

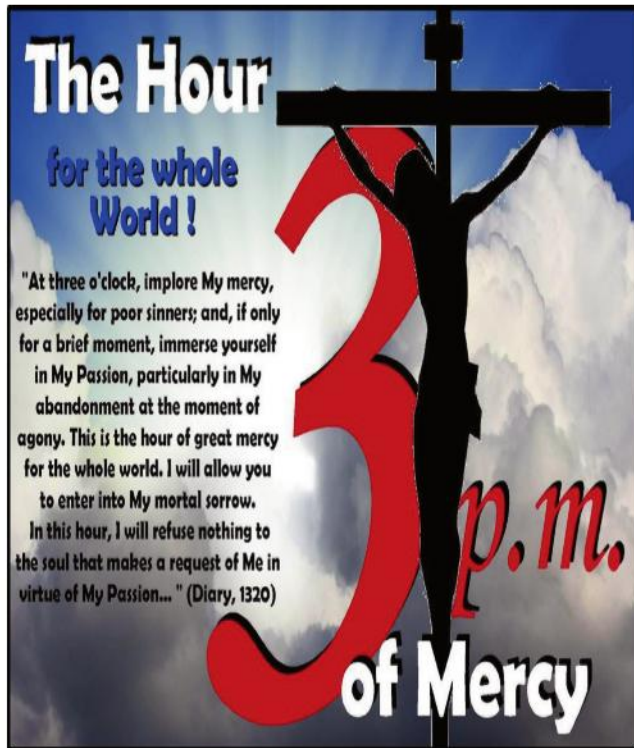

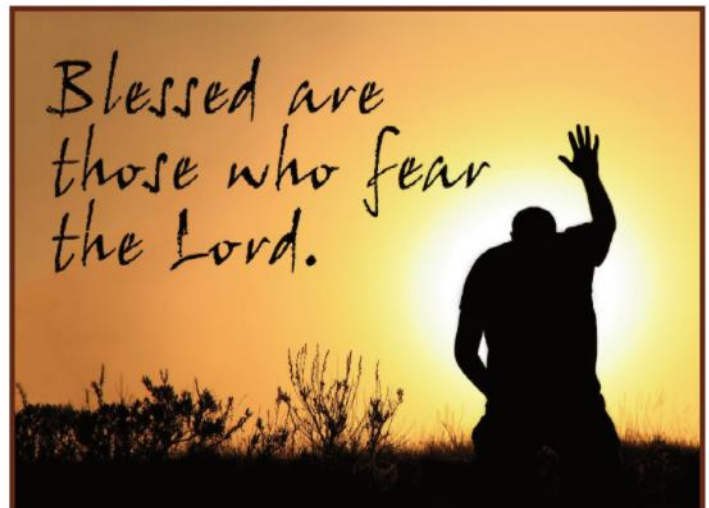

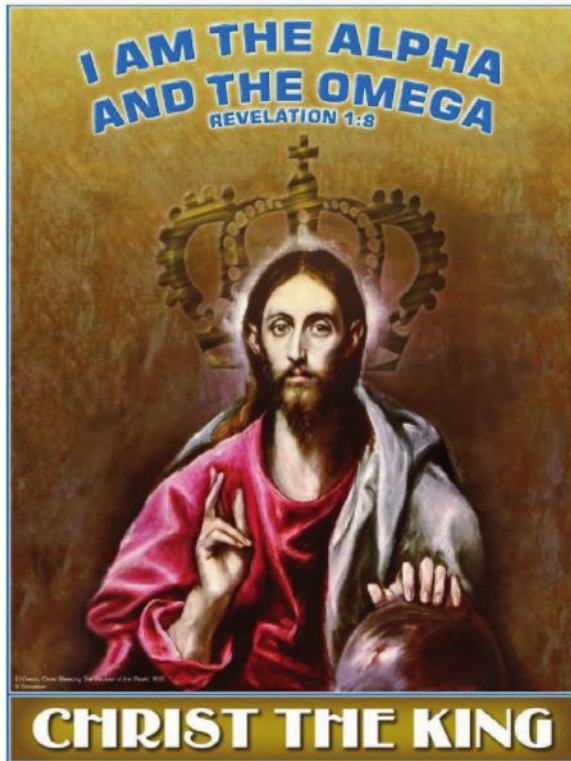

We don't usually think of shepherds as kings, but the scriptures this Sunday describe the kingly powers of Jesus as our Good Shepherd. A good king cares for his subjects the way a shepherd cares for his sheep.

Kings increase the size of their reign and accomplish their work over the whole territory through their subjects. That's why Jesus says, "Whatever you do for one of the least of mine, you do for me."

For example, our Good Shepherd-King wants to distribute food to the hungry, all the way to the farthest reaches of his kingdom. How does he get it done? He gives an abundance of food to some of us and commands us to take it to those who need it.

What happens if we don't fulfill the King's commands? Do the starving people think the King is benevolent? No, they can only see his goodness

when we do as he tells us to do.

Look at the people who are around you. Each one is an opportunity to give the King a good name.

What about the people whom you like least of all? What about those who've made you feel angry or intimidated or hurt? Well, ask this: What is he/she hungry for? If the answer's not obvious, ask the Holy Spirit. Observe that person long enough to identify the emptiness or pain or fears that are buried under the surface.



Then ask this: What abundance has God given to me that this "least one" is lacking and needs from Christ our King? Can I show him/her the King's benevolence despite my feelings?

When we say no to opportunities to share what we have, we are behaving like one of the goats whom the Good Shepherd-King separates from the sheep. And when we say yes, despite

the feelings that could make us goat-like, the King's good reputation spreads, and we are all blessed.

Reflect & Discuss:

1. What good things do you have in abundance? How readily do you share them?
2. Who is of least importance to you? How can you take your focus off of what you don't like about them so that you can give them what God wants to give to them through you?
3. Have you ever done something good to someone who didn't deserve it? How did this affect your relationship with Jesus?
4. What abundance do you see in each member of your family or faith sharing community that, when shared, blesses others?
