OSTIA: is again available this Christmas season in the Rectory. There is no need to call ahead, just stop at the rectory between 9:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. to purchase at \$6.00 per box of fifty (50).

HOST:

1 cup lukewarm water

1 cup flour

1 tsp. + few drops of oil

Dash of salt

Beat mixture for 5 minutes. Let stand 5 hours, stirring every half hour. (This recipe is for use with an Ostia maker and if none is available, you may purchase the Ostia at the rectory.)

FILLING:

1 Bag of Hershey kisses or 1 large Hershey bar

1/2-3/4 lb. skinned almonds

1 pint of honey

OPTIONAL:

Orange extract, grated orange rind or vanilla.

Melt chocolate in double boiler or microwave. Add honey at the same time. When all is melted, add chopped almonds and flavoring. Remove from heat and fill host.

CRAIG'S CORNER

In lowliness you came on earth, to rescue us from Satan's snares: O wondrous love that healed our wounds, by taking on our mortal cares!

Great judge before whom all shall stand, have pity on your children's plight;

Rise up to shield us with your grace, Deliver us from Satan's might! There are a couple common themes we get in these verses of the hymn "O Lord of Light." The first is the obvious, where this Advent hymn recalls our preparation for the celebration of the coming of Christ at Christmas: in lowliness you came on earth. The bigger theme here though is the why Christ came to earth. Twice we hear why in these two verses: to rescue and deliver us from Satan. Christ was the Savior, directly stating that we needed someone to save us from original sin. That was true 2000 years ago and is still true today. So while we do prepare to commemorate yet again the coming of Christ at Christmas, we have to remember that this event already took place. Christ did come to save us once. While we in this given moment as we begin the Advent season once again, must place ourselves in that mentality of preparing spiritually to commemorate the event of Christ's birth, Advent is also a time where we prepare for the second coming of Christ as well: an event that has not yet taken place.

We have been delivered from Satan's might but the Church gives us this season to once again prepare our hearts and lives if we've faltered somehow. Just last week I talked about and we heard about what Christian discipleship is and how we are to treat our neighbors. The season of Advent gives us another chance to, while preparing to commemorate Christmas yet again, to turn from evil and sin so that as we hear in our reading's today, are alert and ready for when Christ comes again. It should come as no surprise to us, that the psalmist gives us insight into this as well: "Lord make us turn toward you, let us see your face and we shall be saved." Save, rescue, and deliver us from Satan's might as the hymn above states. Make us turn towards Christ so we can be saved. The action is already done, it happened 2000 years ago, but we are here now. We must be prepared for the second coming also. Be watchful, be alert!, our gospel tells us today. He's not telling us this because Christmas is coming. Christmas already happened. He's telling us this because we don't know when the second coming will be. THAT is what we must be prepared for. Yes, it is important that we prepare for the liturgical season of Christmas ahead and that is one reason why we have Advent. It is, as the December days grow shorter, a season of light as we light the candles of the Advent wreath, which is what I based our hymns on this weekend. Let us bring that light with us each day of this season as we prepare our hearts for the Christmas holiday, but even more importantly, prepare ourselves for that hour we do not know: when Christ will come again.





Saturday December 5 Isaiah 30:19-21,23-26 Ps 147:1-6 Matthew 9:35--10:1,5-8 As we prepare for Christmas, of course we're thinking about how to show fondness and appreciation to the special people in our lives by choosing gifts that will be meaningful to them. And yet, assuming that we can actually find (or make) something that will be appreciated, will the gift really make a difference in the long run?

Since Christmas is the celebration of the birthday of Jesus, let's give him a gift, too – a long-lasting gift. But what can we give to someone who already has everything?

Or does he?

What gift can you give to Jesus that will have an eternal impact, a gift that no one else can give him, a gift he doesn't already have? Here's the answer: What have you been withholding from him?

Today's first reading reminds us that God is our Father. The responsorial Psalm asks the Father to help us turn to him.

The second reading gives thanks to God for all that he has done for us. So – what gift can you give to God to express your appreciation for what he has given to you?

In the Gospel reading, we're reminded of the need to prepare – to actually do something that makes a difference – for the coming of Christ. This not only refers to his Second Coming; it's also about the day when he comes for us as we breathe our last earthly breaths. And it's about the way he wants to come to you this



Christmas. And it's about the way he is coming to you right now, today.

There's something new that he wants to give you. When he offers it, will he find you doing what's right (as in the first reading)? Will he find you using your spiritual gifts (as in the second reading)? Will he find you alert and ready to do his bidding (as in the Gospel reading)?

Advent is an opportunity to take notice of the gifts he gives us and become aware of the gifts we can give to him that he doesn't already have. It should make an eternal difference – for him and for us.

Reflect & Discuss:

- List the gifts that God has given to you. Then think about how much appreciation you have given to God for the gifts on that list. Do you know how much he appreciates your appreciation?
- Name ways that Jesus comes to us today.
- 3. What will you do this Advent to become more aware of Jesus coming to you?
- 4. How will this make you more ready for Christmas?
