ALL SAINTS DAY

All Saint's day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven. It should not be confused with All Souls' Day, which is observed on November 2, and is dedicated to those who have died and not vet reached heaven.

Although millions, or even billions of people may already be saints. All Saints' Day observances tend to focus on known saints-that is those recognized in the canon of the saints by the Catholic Church.

ALL SOULS' DAY THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

All Souls day is a holy day set aside for honoring the dead. The soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The immediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go.

Purgatory is necessary so that souls can be cleansed and perfected before they enter into heaven. There is scriptural basis for this belief. The primary reference is a 2 Maccabees, 12: 26 and 12: 32. "Turning to supplication, they prayed that the sinful deed might be fully blotted out...Thus made atonement for the dead that they might be free from sin." Through the prayers of the faithful on Earth, the dead are cleansed of their sins so they may enter into heaven.
