

OSTIA: is again available this Christmas season in the Rectory. There is no need to call ahead, just stop at the rectory between 9:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. to purchase at \$6.00 per box of fifty (50).

HOST:

1 cup lukewarm water

1 cup flour

1 tsp. + few drops of oil

Dash of salt

Beat mixture for 5 minutes. Let stand 5 hours, stirring every half hour. (This recipe is for use with an Ostia maker and if none is available, you may purchase the Ostia at the rectory.)

1 Bag of Hershey kisses or 1 large Hershey bar

1/2-3/4 lb. skinned almonds

1 pint of honey

OPTIONAL:

Orange extract, grated orange rind or vanilla.

Melt chocolate in double boiler or microwave. Add honey at the same time. When all is melted, add chopped almonds and flavoring. Remove from heat and fill host.

Craig's Corner A note from our Music Director

"Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I say rejoice!"

These words taken from the introit of our Mass today form the basis of the weekend each year on this third Sunday in our Advent season: Gaudete! The Latin word for rejoice. Our Advent season of preparation is past its halfway point and the celebration of the coming of Christ at Christmas is near.

This year has hardly felt joyful with a global pandemic, with constant tension in our communities and in our country, and so many other obstacles which seemed to dot the landscape of our world in 2020. How are we supposed to be joyful? The readings and our Advent message offers us some insight this weekend.

We hear Isaiah talk of the Spirit being upon him to bring good tidings to the poor and that his rejoicing comes from the Lord and the joy of God in his soul. Saint Paul tells the Thessalonians to rejoice always and pray without ceasing so that this same spirit Isaiah speaks of is not quenched. The spirit we were baptized into and that we received at Confirmation is alive in each one of us and this is given to us by Christ, as John tells those who are questioning him. John tells them that he is baptizing by water and we know that it is Christ who baptizes us in His spirit to dwell within us. This should be the cause of our joy! No matter what is going on in the outside world; no matter how differently we may have to celebrate Christmas this year, we are *still* celebrating the incarnation of Christ coming at Christmas, and our celebration is near. So the Church calls upon us to be joyful.

The refrain of our opening hymn starts our weekend right with that same word: "Rejoice, rejoice, Emmanuel. Shall come to you, O Israel." Christ is coming to us, and soon. Rejoice! For offertory, I combined that theme with the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe which takes place on the Saturday daily Mass of December 12. Here, Mary is our hope, where we find roses in winter, touched by her love. Through her, we know that with God all things are possible and must place our hope and trust in Him: also cause of our rejoicing. The Communion processional we've been using this entire Advent season thus far, "Wait for the Lord," also contains the verses from our scriptures this weekend of rejoicing.

As the rose candle is lit this weekend, and the vestment color of rose is worn, we remember to rejoice. While different this year, our Christmas celebration is near. Remember what we celebrate, and why. Keep the spirit of Christ alive in your hearts so that we can stay on the path that John began to prepare for Christ: making straight a highway for Christ.


Friday The Day Christ died for us

God News INSPIRATION FOR DAILY LIFE

3rd Sunday of Advent, Cycle B

Saturday December 19 Judges 13:2-7,24-25a Ps 71:3-6ab,16-17 Luke 1:5-25 John the Baptist came to "testify to the light." What does this mean?

We know that Jesus is the Light of Truth shining in the darkness to draw us to eternal life. And we know that his Spirit enlightens us in the truth so that we can be saved from the destructive forces of

our sins and follow our Savior to heaven. But what was the testimony of John? How did he testify to the light? And how does this affect our lives today?

John's testimony was: "I am not the Christ. I am a voice. A voice in the desert." His testimony brings us to the Light of Christ by challenging us with: "Where is your life arid and dry? Listen! Christ is coming to meet you there! Stop wandering around! Repent, change, do whatever is necessary to look for Jesus so that you can find him. He is coming to you!"

We've all experienced times when Jesus seems unavailable when we need him. What has opened your eyes to his presence? Whose voice has turned you back to God? It's time to do the same for others, to bring glad tidings to the poor, to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to those who are held captive in their sins, and to announce how to be blessed by a close friendship with the Lord.

We all have the same testimony and the same calling as John had: We are all supposed to be voices crying out loud enough to be heard above the din of the world. Many souls are

> lost in the wilderness of confusion, hopelessness, pain, heartache, and despair, not to mention sin.

> What kind of a voice do you have? Because we have Christ within us, our very lives are the voice.

Even if our vocal chords do not utter a single word, the way we live in the light is how we speak the truth of the light. The better we live the truth, the louder and clearer is our message.

What people choose to do with our message is up to them, but it's up to us to speak it so that they're given that choice.

Reflect & Discuss:

- How has your life been changed by your faith in Jesus? What evil has been conquered, what darkness has been overcome?
- 2. How has the Spirit of the Lord anointed you?
- 3. What gifts do you have that enable you to give to the poor (the financially poor or the emotionally starving or the spiritually hungry) or to heal broken hearts?
- 4. How has God used you to provide liberty to captives and release to prisoners?
- 5. How are these a testimony that teach others about Jesus?
