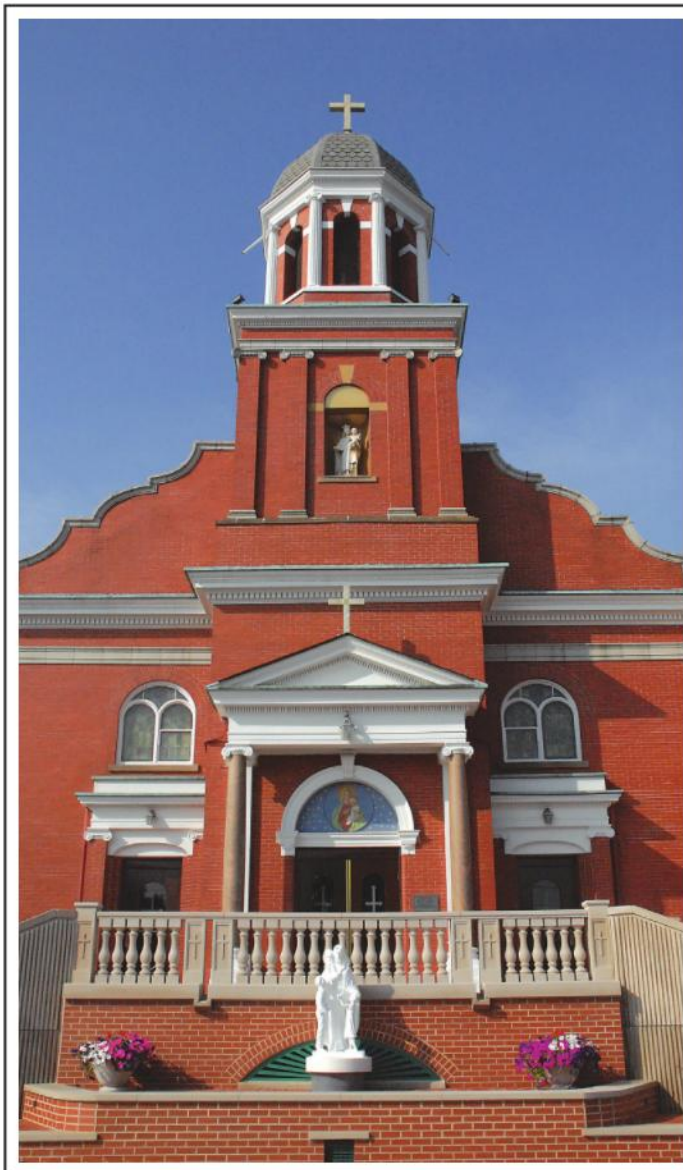

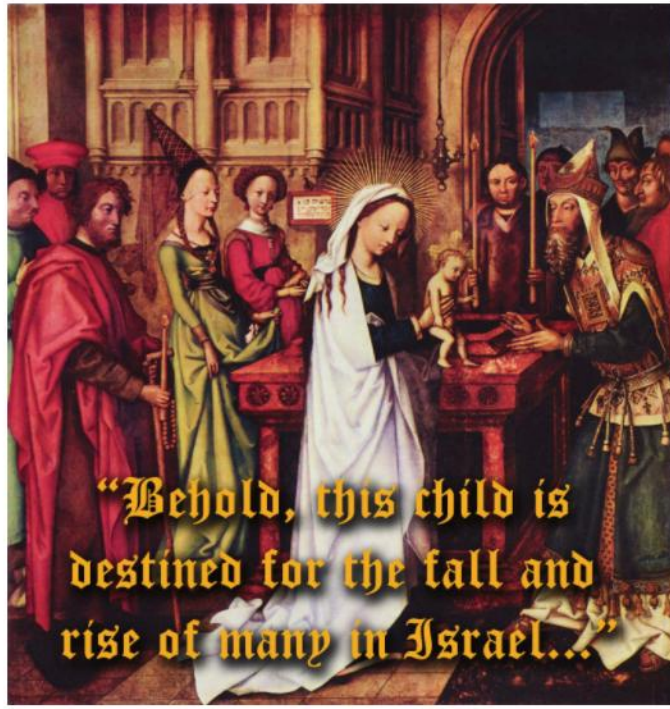

A Prayer For Pregnant Mothers

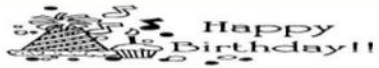

Craig's Corner
A note from our Music Director

As the season of Advent has blossomed into Christmas this week, I wanted to take the opportunity as your director of music to offer my sincere gratitude to all of those who played a role in making Christmas Vigil and Day Masses a wonderful celebration of our Lord's nativity. Of course this year's group was spread out over a few Masses to allow for physical distancing but it was still wonderful to be able to make music for the Nativity of our Lord together. Thank you to Susan Izzo, Christine Langer, Nicholas Mattiussi, Tom Miller, and Dena Tufaro.

This weekend's celebration of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph which always falls on the Sunday within the octave of our Christmas solemnity. This octave acts as a continuation of our Christmas Day Masses, so we get to sing our favorite Christmas hymns once again this weekend.

The responsorial psalm this weekend, Psalm 128 "Blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways" is the most common psalm for a wedding Mass. When I plan wedding Masses with couples preparing to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, I give this option first for the psalm and then review other examples. Most often, the couple chooses this option because its verses call specific attention to the blessing of the family: "Your wife shall be like a fruitful vine in the recesses of your home; your children like olive plants around your table. May you see the prosperity of Jerusalem all the days of your life. May you see your children's children."

We hear this psalm this weekend as our readings also center on the family on this feast of the Holy Family. As I offer catechesis to the couples preparing for marriage that this psalm is used for this weekend of the Church Year and that they are now to model their lives after that of the Holy Family. Let us take that with us this week as we go forth amidst the celebrations with our own families between Christmas and New Year's Day that we are always to model our lives after that of Jesus' family, humble like that of Mary and Joseph and of course in the light of our newborn Savior, Christ Jesus our Lord.

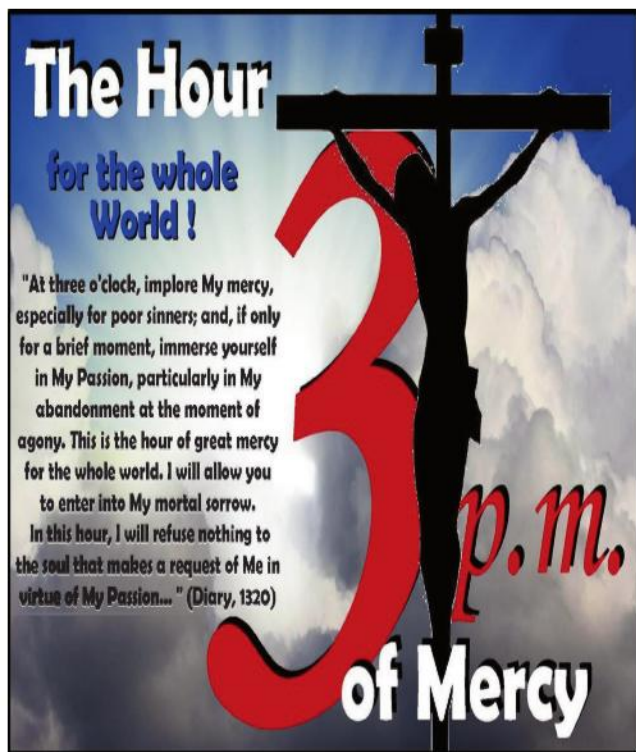

The **SWEET** candy symbolizes the sweetest gift of all, His **ETERNAL LOVE** for us.



"Joy mixed with drama marks the fifth [joyful] mystery, the finding of the twelve-year-old Jesus in the Temple." Saint John Paul the Great wrote this in *Rosarium Virginis Mariae*, his interesting encyclical about the Rosary.

He continued: "Here he appears in his divine wisdom as he listens and raises questions, already in effect one who 'teaches'. The revelation of his mystery as the Son wholly dedicated to his Father's affairs proclaims the radical nature of the Gospel, in which even the closest of human relationships are challenged by the absolute demands of the Kingdom. Mary and Joseph, fearful and anxious, 'did not understand' his words."

We, too, often fail to understand the words of Jesus. His teachings challenge us to accept a more difficult life, a life of doing good to our enemies, turning the cheek and going the extra mile, a life of courageously standing up for the truth and adhering to high moral standards that are

counter-cultural.

Our preference, when living this way is inconvenient or unpleasant, is to rationalize and make excuses for our worldly behavior. But once we truly understand the de-



mands of the Kingdom of God, we see their benefits and we obey gladly.

Without this understanding, we have to simply trust that the words of Jesus are right and true. Like Mary and Joseph, we need to ponder in our hearts what we don't understand, while moving forward and doing what Jesus wants us to do.

As challenging as this is, that's when we discover how amazing God is.

Reflect & Discuss:

1. What teaching of the Church have you rationalized away so that you don't have to obey it? Or what teaching of Christ in the Sermon on the Mount (see Matt. 5,6,7) or elsewhere in the Gospels do you excuse yourself from?
2. How much is your disobedience due to not understanding what is really being taught?
3. What will you do to seek and gain a better understanding?
4. How meaningful is the Holy Family to you? What is it about the relationships between Jesus, Mary and Joseph that appeals to you?
