



"As the bread of life is broken, the cup of love outpoured; we are one in Christ our Savior and sent to serve the Lord."

These words, taken from our offertory text this weekend, signify our Christian call of service and discipleship. In our Catholic Tradition, the central aspect to our faith is the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. This hymn combines our Eucharistic celebration with the nourishment we receive in the Eucharist to strengthen us to live the Gospel of Christ in the world. Our invitation to communion at Mass announces Christ as the "Lamb of God," taken from the Gospel this weekend where John announces Christ to the first disciples and tells them, "Behold, the Lamb of God." Our prelude and communion hymn this weekend reference Christ as the title of Lamb. We also hear the call of Samuel in the first reading, and the psalm (and opening hymn) where the reply is heard, "Here am I Lord, I come to do your will." The disciples heard this call, dropped everything to follow Christ, and eventually began the Church following the ascension of Christ and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

The communion hymn text above not only connects to the readings and our call to discipleship this weekend, but also combines these texts with the episcopal motto of our new bishop, David Bonnar. We sang this hymn this past week at his ordination to the order of bishop. His motto, "that all may be one" was chosen to underline the unity of the Church and its shepherds.

His coat of arms contains a wide array of symbolism. The left side of the shield signifies the Diocese of Youngstown. The golden dove is in honor of the patron of the diocesan cathedral, Saint Columba, and is also taken from the arms of Pope Pius XII who created the diocese in 1943. The golden anvil symbolizes the industrial landscape that has dominated much of northeastern Ohio. The silver wavy bar represents the Mahoning River. Two arrowheads recall the first residents of the area and is flanked by a cross taken from the arms of the Diocese of Cleveland from which the Youngstown diocese was formed, symbolizing the faith passed on from one community to another and from generation to generation.

The right side is Bishop Bonnar's personal coat of arms. The chequy blue and silver fess appears in the Diocese of Pittsburgh's coat of arms representing his diocese of origin. The seven point blue star recalls the Blessed Virgin Mary, whom Bishop Bonnar entrusts his new pastoral ministry. The pomegranate represents the motto of the bishop that all the grains of this fruit are united in an only body, the mystical body of the Church. The field of gold, the first among the noble metals, symbolizes the first of the virtues – the faith – which makes all believe in the salvation given by the Lord.

As we open up our ordered time this weekend following the Christmas season, we, under the direction of our new diocesan shepherd, go forth each Mass, nourished by the Eucharist and going forward as one regardless of our differences. We must answer the call of the Lord, the Lamb of God, to take our common oneness in Christ and our call to discipleship out in the world each day.



Like Jesus did to Simon Peter, he says to each of us: "What are you looking for?" When you pray, and when you look at a crucifix, or when you see a picture of Jesus, what exactly are you looking for?

Jesus says: "Come and see and see!" Come and see what? His love? His healing power? His supernatural ability to answer our prayers? Whatever we're looking for, the reason we're seeking it is because we don't yet have it.

Jesus is the fulfillment of every promise by God the Father. Jesus is the fullness of love, the provider of mercy, the divine healer, the perfect mediator of all our prayers and concerns, and everything else we truly need. So, why does it feel like something is still missing? Why do our lives feel incomplete? Why do our prayers seem unanswered?

The answer is revealed in what happened after Peter began to follow Jesus. We read about it in Samuel's response to God's invitation. We proclaim it in the Responsorial: "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."

Peter was privileged to witness first-hand the wondrous miracles of Jesus. He personally experienced God's love through the gentle eyes of Jesus, the tone of kindness in his voice, and the forgiveness that was visible in his smile.

Yet with all of this, Peter did not really

find all that he was looking for (remember how easily he felt afraid or confused or uncertain) until he was on the giving end of it. He didn't discovered the fullness of Jesus until Jesus was no longer present in the flesh and

Peter accepted the call to continue Christ's earthly ministry.

The same is true for us who have never seen Jesus' actual eyes or heard his actual voice. We find what we're seeking when we give it to others. Why? Because then we discover that we really had it all along! This is the miracle of "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."

Reflect & Discuss:

- What do you need from Jesus that he doesn't seem to be providing yet? At the core, what is it you're really seeking?
- How can you find it by doing the will of God? Figure out something to do, then do it and see what happens.
- 3. Describe a time when you gave away what you thought you did not have (money? time? patience? hope? love?) How were you doing the will of God?
- 4. What happened to your own needs afterward?




