



STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT:

In today's Second Reading, St. Paul has some sobering words for us including that "the world in its present form is passing away." This should not be of any concern to the Christian steward, for the Christian steward is not concerned with owning worldly possessions. When we begin to recognize that all good things belong to the Lord, not only do we become more grateful for what we have, but we also become more willing to share what we have with others.

"Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men."





This weekend, the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is referred to as the Sunday of the Word of God. As we continue through the first month of the new year and begin our weeks of ordered time, the Church brings attention to Christ as the incarnate Word made flesh, and opens up the Scriptures to us. We hear this vividly through our readings today. In the first reading, the Word of God is delivered to Jonah and the people of Nineveh who are called to turn from their evil ways and to focus on God. In the Gospel, by the Sea of Galilee, more disciples are chosen to follow the Word and follow Christ himself in human form so they can learn from Him and, eventually to spread the Word and build up the beginning of the Church after the Resurrection and Ascension.

Our music this weekend also paints the scenery where the disciples first heard the call of Christ in this weekend's Gospel: in nature alongside the water. Often times, especially in winter, the calmness and stillness of the outside world is so peaceful. To be nurtured by the Word of God, we often need a quiet place to feel His presence and mute out the rest of the world. Christ calls his first disciples, who are fishermen, out of the water to follow Him.

This weekend's prelude is a pastorale, which is a musical piece which often represents some type of outdoor scene, or that which revolves around Nature. Our entrance hymn sets the stage for the Gospel reading directly stating the account of calling fishermen to become disciples of Christ. But the text takes it one step farther and puts us also in the account. Christ is also asking US to follow Him. He does not need money nor weapons for fighting, but only asking that we might follow. The offertory anthem also blends these themes together, stating the calling of the disciples by the Sea of Galilee but also hearing the voice of God through the small voice of calm, not that of an earthquake or fire. Answering God's call is the prayer of the psalmist we sing at communion, and we have to ask ourselves if we truly live by these words we sing, "Here I am, O God, I come to do your will."

Jesus' words, "repent and believe in the Gospel" should hit us in a special way as we celebrate this Sunday of the Word of God. It is my hope that our music this weekend, and every weekend, lifts you up to the power and glory of God so that we can pray as does our responsorial psalmist, "guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Savior." May we be guided by the Word of God today and every day as we continue our Christian journey.



fully to God. "Now is the time of fulfillment" – not just 2000 years ago, not at the Second Coming of Christ, but right now in your life when and where you need Jesus the most.

"The kingdom of God is at hand" – what you need from the Lord is right here, at hand, ready for you.

"Repent, and believe in the gospel" means "Come follow Me and learn from Me to become like Me." For the first disciples, it meant dropping whatever they were doing to spend so much time with Jesus that their whole lives were forever affected.

And this is what it means for you and for me: We have to put aside our own agendas and overly busy schedules to spend more time following Jesus wherever he leads us.

In the modern world, we have become more dependent on our technological devises than on Jesus. Many of us cannot even go on vacation without remaining accessible to their employers via the cell phone. Somehow, we need to find a way to take a stand against this.

It's one of the social justice teachings of the Church: We are actually called by God to rebel against working on Sundays and other days of rest. Why? Because we need to spend that time with Jesus quietly being re-

stored and re-energized.

Unfortunately, Jesus doesn't walk through the door and circle dates on our calendar and write "Rest with Jesus" on it so that we can

plan ahead. We have to follow his lead at a moment's notice – every moment. To experience the kingdom of God on the earthly side of heaven, we have to be willing to drop everything to follow Jesus into unfamiliar places at unexpected times. We have to learn to follow his lead even in situations where his way is the surprising way.

Reflect & Discuss:

- What's on your to-do list? What keeps you busy? What are your goals for the future? What are you dreaming of?
- If Jesus has a different plan for your day or for your life, how easily could you switch over to new ideas and plans?
- What are some of the nets you've abandoned in the past in order to follow Jesus? How difficult was that to do?
- 4. Are you happy about it now? Why? How was this an experience of the kingdom of God on earth?




