







The Extraordinary Sacrificial Offering



Craig's Corner A note from our Music Director

I have mentioned numerous times in these short "musical sermons" (as one of our parishioners called my column one day) how the Responsorial Psalm provides a perfect commentary to the rest of the readings for our celebration of Holy Mass.

To that end, this weekend our Psalm speaks of the Lord's healing power. It connects our Gospel reading where we continue to hear accounts of Jesus' healing ways: healing the sick and again healing those oppressed with demons. The text of the psalm also refers to the healing of those who are brokenhearted, which connects to our first reading from Job. Job is miserable, very disheartened and is dealing with much restlessness and no hope or forward motion in life. In the second reading, Paul tells the Corinthians of his purpose to proclaim the Gospel and the accounts of Christ. He is, in the words of the psalmist, to praise the name of the Lord, whose name is great and mighty in power.

The common theme of our readings that the psalm binds together this weekend is healing and purpose. When we put our focus on the Christ and his healing mission and power, we find our purpose and mission. When we lose sight of this, we often get discouraged or allow the demons to take over in our lives like Job did. In our opening hymn, Christ be our Light, we get both sides of the coin. The verses speak of the darkness and peril of the world but transition into quite the opposite when Christ is mentioned. Consider the verse, "longing for light, we wait in darkness; longing for hope many despair. Your word alone, has power to save us; make us your living voice." The refrain we sing of course, states that Christ is the light, and we ask Him to shine in our hearts and in the Church: not the building itself, but the church as an institution that each of us individually com-

We come to the altar of God each time we come to Mass to be nourished and to be healed. We need spiritual healing from sin. The Sacrament of the Eucharist is one way God lives in us. The verse of our communion hymn *O Sacrament Most Holy* directly states this by saying, "O come all you who labor in sorrow and in pain; Come eat this bread from heaven, your peace and strength regain."

Our purpose and mission is the same as Paul and Christ: to proclaim the Gospel and to get rid of the demons and darkness of the world. Sometimes we can best relate with Job this weekend, but if we want to truly follow our mission of Christian discipleship, let us look nowhere else but to this weekend's psalm, praising the Lord for he heals those who are brokenhearted.



Saturday February 13 Genesis 3:9-24 Ps 90:2-6,12-13 Mark 8:1-10 Today's reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians describes my own ministry of writing this and other bulletin articles:

If I preach the Good News, this is no reason for me to boast, because I have an obligation to do this, and woe to me if I do not do it! If I do so willingly, I'm rewarded for it, but if unwillingly, I'm merely fulfilling my responsibility of stewardship. What then is my reward? That, when I share the Good News, I am able to offer it free of charge so that all may benefit.


Saint Paul was not saying it's wrong to charge a fee. In fact, Jesus said that the worker deserves his wages (Luke 10:7). But Paul knew that what matters most is being a good steward of the gifts that God has given us.

What are the gifts that God has given you? We have all been entrusted with an obligation to continue the ministry of Christ on earth in our contemporary world. A Chris-

tian who does not follow Christ in ministry has a lazy faith, or a self-focused faith, an unlively faith.

Using your gifts, talents, wisdom, knowledge, compassion, etc., generously for the benefit of the faith of others is an alive faith. The immediate reward is a joyful awareness of being in partnership with Christ.

The Gospel reading shows us the generosity of Peter's mother-in-law in sharing her talent of hospitality. And it



shows us the determination of Jesus to preach the gospel widely and tirelessly.

Both are examples of good stewardship. All gifts and talents and financial earnings are blessings from God that are meant to be shared. This is how to feel fully alive in the faith!

- 4. How can you become a better steward of God's gifts?
- 5. Name any service that you provide: How important is it to you that you keep doing it no matter what?
