



Stations of the Cross Every Friday at 11:30 a.m. and 7:00m p.m. **Fasting and Abstinence**


Fasting means a lesser amount of food. Catholics 18 and not 60 years of age must fast. The days on which we must fast are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Days of abstinence are days on which we do not eat any meal at all. Dairy products, fish and seafood are allowed. All Catholics over the age of 14 must abstain. The days of obligatory abstinence are Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, both the laws of fasting abstinence apply and no meat may be eaten.

Craig's Corner A note from our Music Director

In his Wednesday audience earlier this month, Pope Francis spoke on how we as Catholics encounter the real presence of Christ through the sacraments. He said, "Every time we celebrate a baptism, or consecrate the bread and wine in the Eucharist, or anoint the body of a sick person with Holy Oil, Christ is here. It is He who acts and is present as when He healed the weak limbs of a sick person, or when at the Last Supper, He delivered His testament for the salvation of the world," He continued that it is of utmost importance that we fully participate in the divine mysteries, especially through Mass because it is not something we merely go through the motions of, but rather being totally present *with* Christ. He explained further by saying, "'this thought helps us all when we go to Mass: I go to pray in community, I go to pray with Christ who is present. Christ is present and in the liturgy, you pray with Christ who is next to you.""

Christ IS with us when we celebrate the sacraments. Two sacraments that are brought to our attention today are the Anointing of the Sick and the Eucharist. The theme of sickness is prevalent in our readings this weekend. The leper, who was breaking protocol by being in public with the disease, and also outcast by the community for being "unclean" because of his sickness, comes to Jesus for healing. Jesus could have said no, since in that time touching someone with leprosy was against societal norms. But rather, Jesus showed His compassion while still adhering to the Law of Moses (which we heard in the first reading) by telling the now-cleansed leper to go show himself to the priests so he could return to community life. In this weekend where in society on Valentine's Day we talk about love, we can think of Christ's compassion in this account, and therefore extend that compassion and love to our neighbors.

The Church today extends Jesus' compassion in the sacrament of the sick. But furthermore for those of us who need spiritual healing, we receive Jesus through the sacrament of the Eucharist. We are preparing this week to enter the season of Lent, the most important time for this spiritual healing. This weekend's music lifts up the word alleluia, a word we take out of the Mass during the Lenten season. In the second reading, Paul reminds us that all we do should be to give glory to God. Our opening and closing hymn All Creatures of Our God and King directly reiterates that all things: all creation is under God's care. Our communion hymn, Ti Ringrazio reminds us to give thanks to God for all we have, for we are nothing unless under His care. Yes, even the bread we break at communion is Him as the pope reminds us, His sacrifice, His compassion, His friendship are right beside us. For in our offertory anthem, we again are reminded too, that "when two are three are here together, He is in the midst of us.'

So as we prepare to begin the most penitential season of the year, as we come to Christ for healing of all types, especially during a pandemic, we are reminded by the pope of how significant in-person worship is. It is not just going through the motions. Rather, it is an encounter with Christ truly next to us in the presence of the Eucharist. Let us work harder this Lent to more fully participate in the prayers, psalms and music this season and beyond, for as the pope reminds us, "A Christianity without liturgy, I would dare say is perhaps a Christianity without Christ, without the whole of Christ. Christ makes himself present in the Holy Spirit through the sacramental signs: hence the need for us Christians to participate in the divine mysteries."





Thus the name 'Valentine' was born.


Preparing for Confirmation

glory of God.

This should be part of our daily prayers every morning: "Holy Spirit, help me to do everything today for the glory of God. Amen!"

By making it a daily habit to start the day this way, the glory of God becomes integrated into our character. When we remember to see our activities through the lens of "whatever you do, do it for the glory of God", we become stronger in avoiding all kinds of sins. It sanctifies each moment of every day.



Often, we see religious activities as separate from our normal activities. We take "time out" from our schedules to go to church. We stop what we're doing when we want to pray. We think that only Clergy and Religious can be religious all of the time and that a layperson who is like that is a "fanatic". But why?

Why should we limit "for the glory of God" to only what is "holy" - Mass attendance, religious rituals, prayers, the works of ministry, etc.? We can sanctify every moment by remembering that whatever we do, we want to please God with it.

Reflect & Discuss:

- What have you done already today that glorifies God?
- What is planned for later today. and how can that be offered to God?
- What will you do to remind yourself daily to do everything for the glory of God?
- Describe ways that we can glorify God in normal, everyday activities
- How do you turn mundane tasks into a gift for God?
- When is it most difficult to glorify him?
- How can even our lapses into sin become blessings that glorify God?

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
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
