




#### Fasting and Abstinence

Fasting means a lesser amount of food. Catholics 18 and not 60 years of age must fast. The days on which we must fast are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Days of abstinence are days on which we do not eat any meal at all. Dairy products, fish and seafood are allowed. All Catholics over the age of 14 must abstain. The days of obligatory abstinence are Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, both the laws of fasting abstinence apply and no meat may be eaten.

#### Craig's Corner A note from our Music Director

During the Eucharistic Prayer of Mass, after the celebrant elevates the host and chalice, he decrees: "the mystery of faith." At this point, we as a congregation reply with one of three responses. The one we will be singing on Sundays during Lent acclaims, "Save us, Savior of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free." During Lent we prepare ourselves to celebrate the saving acts of Christ's Cross and Resurrection by fasting, prayer, and works of charity. Just as we prepare ourselves for Holy Week and Easter, we hear this weekend how Jesus was tempted by the devil and fasted forty days to prepare for his public ministry.

The text of the hymns sung this weekend directly state how we need to open our hearts to this fasting, just as Jesus fasted in the desert. Lenten texts shouldn't make us sad, but instead should instill a longing and a sense of penance within us. Our opening hymn states, "teach us to discipline our wills and follow, Lord, your way," while our offertory text acclaims, "keep, o keep us, Savior dear, ever constant by your side: that with you we may appear at the eternal Eastertide." There is nothing sad about these texts; rather, they instill in us a deeper prayer to better our lives as we journey our way toward Easter. Mark's gospel is quite concise this weekend and goes into what we heard just a few weeks ago: Jesus' message of His ministry: "The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the Gospel." The latter sentence, "repent and believe in the Gospel" is one of the options for the priest to say as he distributes ashes on Ash Wednesday as we begin Lent. So just as Jesus' first words in the gospel tell us to repent as He begins His ministry, so He tells us at this the beginning of our Lenten journey also to repent.

In the devotion of the Stations of the Cross, the first two stations tell of the beginning of Jesus' journey; starting with the condemning crowd and then Jesus taking up the cross. As I mentioned a few months ago, I was planning on performing a concert of 14 organ pieces representing the 14 stations this Lent. With the current restrictions of gatherings still in place, I have decided to move the concert back towards later in Easter or even a summer concert when hopefully we can gather a few more people into the church building. But until then, I will be using some of the movements for Lenten postludes. This weekend, as we begin the Lenten season, the postlude will be Station #2: Jesus Receives the Cross. The stations are a way of following along Jesus' journey to the saving acts of redemption just as we begin our journey towards the Easter season. I wish you all a blessed and holy Lent: a time of repentance, a time of intensified prayer, and a time of journeying towards our celebration of Easter.



Saturday February 27 Deuteronomy 26:16-19 Ps 119:1-2,4-5,7-8 Matthew 5:43-48 Today's Gospel reading shows us the first thing that Jesus did after his baptismal anointing in the Jordan River: He wrestled with temptation.

His baptism had marked the moment of his complete surrender to the Father's will. As he arose from the water, he began a new life of ministry.

The Father responded by telling him that he was very pleased, and the Holy Spirit filled his humanness. Jesus as God already had the Holy Spirit (he and the Spirit were the same God), but Jesus the fully human Son now came fully alive in the Spirit. We can imagine how this experience in the Jordan River gave him the feeling of an elated spiritual high. And the next thing that happens is an attack of the devil.

The same pattern repeats itself in our lives. As soon as we experience new growth
in our faith, or a new calling to do the Father's will, we
run smack into a situation that tests the strength and
sincerity of our faith. However, if this didn't happen, how
would we find out that we've spiritually matured? How
would we know that we are ready to make a significant
difference for the kingdom of God?

Sometimes without consciously thinking it, we decide that if we're going to be tested and we might lose, wouldn't it be better not to start something new?

Well, that's another temptation!



Lent is the perfect time to examine the temptations that we face every day and turn them into new growth that will strengthen our faith.

Every time we face a sin seek God's become giveness, we stronger. And if we take it a step farther by walking into the confessional with it, we powerful also receive graces directly from Jesus, through the priest, that will render temptations much more powerless.

And this makes us more useful to God in the mission of conquering evil in the world and helping his kingdom spread into the lives of the people around us.

Think of temptations as blessings in disguise: Use them as opportunities to become more like Jesus and grow powerful in the faith.
