



Fasting and Abstinence

Fasting means a lesser amount of food. Catholics 18 and not 60 years of age must fast. The days on which we must fast are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Days of abstinence are days on which we do not eat any meal at all. Dairy products, fish and seafood are allowed. All Catholics over the age of 14 must abstain. The days of obligatory abstinence are Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, both the laws of fasting abstinence apply and no meat may be eaten.

Craig's Corner A note from our Music Director

This weekend we enter the final two weeks of our Lenten observance, known as Passiontide. What the cross is to us as Catholics is a paradox to others. What is a symbol of torture and execution is our symbol of new birth and resurrection. The cross was excruciating for Christ. It was everything earthly death is, but it is not the end of the story. We know that. But to truly enter into these weeks before Easter, we have to put ourselves in the minds of the disciples who are listening to Jesus tell them of His coming death. We hear accounts this weekend of Christ once again prefiguring His death. Whether we hear the A readings (Saturday 5PM) or B, Jesus alludes to death quite a bit. The readings this weekend prepare us for earthly death and suffering - but also, even though we know how the Gospel ends, Jesus is still giving us hints that His death is in fact, good. He is the resurrection and the life. He will draw us to Himself. He is troubled. But He is there to offer His disciples hope and us, as if we didn't know how the Gospel ends.

This weekend's music is also twofold, to realize the suffering of Christ but also to provide hope and promise that death is not the final word. The hymns paint the readings of the Mass and reinforce the texts we hear during the readings.

I, as I have been all Lent, have used one of the 14 movements of Marcel Dupré's Stations of the Cross for Organ, to the theme of the weekend readings. This weekend, as we enter Passiontide, I chose the fourth station: the affliction of Mary. As our basilica is devoted to Mary, we ask Mary's intercession regularly. Now we enter this time where we put ourselves in her shoes and remember the distress she felt watching her Son be tortured and suffer. Mary never left Christ's side during those steps towards Calvary. She was a perfect model of motherhood - but had to endure the worst pain of all in watching her son be killed. The fourth movement of Dupré's stations takes the theme of Mary's sorrow into a melodic motif.

To fully feel the Easter mysteries we are preparing ourselves to celebrate, let us put ourselves in the shoes of the people we are reading about in these accounts this weekend and keep that in mind as we go into Holy Week. This is the perfect year for us to enter Easter with a renewed faith and fresh outlook since we weren't physically able to gather last year at this time. Let us put ourselves in Mary and the disciples' shoes. Think of them as we sing the texts of these readings and participate in the Holy Week Masses and celebrations this year. Fifth Sunday of Lent





FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

From An Observant Observer

The Last few weeks have brought more than a few visitors to our Basilica for Sunday Mass. There are many who travel to different places to see the Cathedrals and Basilicas in the area. One can always hear when in our Basilica, "How beautiful this Basilica is!" As parishioners, we may take for granted how beautiful this Basilica is as we attend Mass for one hour; although coming back in late May/early June of last year after being away for ten weeks may have caused some to see the Basilica in a renewed light.

There are many reasons we have a beautiful Basilica. The first step would be to look at the Rector, Msgr. Michael Cariglio. His love for the Blessed Mother – patroness of our Basilica- makes him extra attentive to the details of the Basilica. On his daily walks with Linguini, Msgr. rarely misses anything that might be out of line in the Basilica or the grounds.

The Basilica maintenance staff does just about everything around the buildings and grounds and there is much to take care of; it is all done with diligence and pride. The maintenance head knows where everything is; everything is stored, the liturgical seasonal colors, light bulbs, ladders, and candles, etc. From the Basilica itself, John Paul II Center to the Social Hall, the Rectory, to the hillside, the parking lot, to the St. Vincent DePaul Center, there is always something that needs work.

The parish office staff is there in the rectory Monday through Friday for the people. Our Lady of Mount Carmel Basilica is busy with phone calls, appointments, requests, to preparing the weekly bulletin, scheduling weddings, funerals, baptisms, etc. Sometimes the phone rings non-stop. It is no small wonder how everything manages to get done! The parish business manager/accountant makes sure that all the numbers add up and the bills and paychecks happen as needed! Our Parish Council often times has to make difficult decisions and keeps the best interest of our parish in mind.

There are the volunteers that count the collection on Sunday morning which is no small task and is done with precision! Volunteers come in on Monday morning to record all of the envelopes making sure proper credit is given.

The Religious Education director and assistants in the John Paul II Center make sure that everything is ready for the youth of the parish to stay on their spiritual journey in Faith – not a small task keeping track of public and Catholic school students, along with the lessons needed to hand on our Roman Catholic Faith. They are also responsible for the Faith formation for adults who desire to become Roman Catholic.

The parish caterer and staff make sure that all of the parish dinners are done correctly and with great food. Our social hall was recently remodeled; with the reputation for great food, this makes Mount Carmel 'the place' for a function that has food!

The Director of Music makes sure that the music for the Mass is appropriate for Sunday, Holy Days, etc. He is there for weddings and funerals, gets volunteers to sing in the choir and the extra musicians to make our Easter and Christmas Masses musically beautiful'

Often times, people will say, "Mount Carmel" is a rich parish and one has to agree. 


