





This three-in-one collection supports the national and local work of the Catholic Campaign for Human Development, the Catholic Communications Campaign, and the Catholic University of America/Newman Campus Ministries collection next weekend for the ministries of the **CHURCH AT HOME**.





#### Craig's Corner A note from our Music Director

The first ecumenical council of the Catholic Church occurred in the year 325AD in Nicaea (which is in present-day Turkey). This council was called to convene Church leaders and discuss the doctrine of what we know of as the Trinity. It was in response to the Arian heresy proposing that Jesus was not divine but rather a created being. Eventually the end result of the council was the creed that we still say today at Mass, the Nicene Creed, condemning Arius and affirming our belief in the Trinity: one God in three equal persons. The location of Nicaea also became the hymn tune name for our opening hymn this weekend, "Holy, Holy, Holy," because its text praises the Trinity.

Another Trinity text is the *Te Deum*. Many scholars agree that the text of this hymn goes back to Nicetas, Bishop of Remesiana / Romatiana in what is now Servia, born around 335 and died in about 414. It is sung or recited often at the end of the Liturgy of the Hours most Sundays and feasts of the year outside of Advent, Lent, and Holy Week. It is also used for days of special blessing, such as the election of a Pope. Most Christians would recognize the English metrical translation to be that of the hymn, "Holy God, We Praise Thy Name." Jean Langlais was a Twentieth Century composer who often took these old Gregorian chant melodies and made them very new in his organ and choral works. Jean's *Te Deum* is the postlude this weekend (except 11AM if it is outside).

As I elude to on multiple occasions, the texts and hymns of the Mass aren't just something we are supposed to pass by, especially when it's something we hear every time we assemble. Consider the opening of the Mass when the priest says, "the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all." Each Mass we are invited right there to be in the presence of the Trinity and we offer that same greeting to the priest in our response of "and with your spirit." Saint Athanasius interprets this line perfectly by stating, "For grace and the gift of the Trinity are given by the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit. Just as grace is given from the Father through the Son, so there could be no communication of the gift to us except in the Holy Spirit. But when we share in the Spirit, we possess the love of the Father, the grace of the Son and the fellowship of the Spirit himself."

This Spirit is that which we celebrated last week at Pentecost. This weekend is a fitting weekend to celebrate this mystery of our faith of one God in three persons now that our celebration of the Paschal Mystery is complete. Our Christian love is rooted in the Trinity, strengthened by the Spirit empowering us to go forth from our celebrations renewed in the Eucharist to give praise to God in what we say and what we do in our week ahead.

# The Extraordinary Story of St. Anthony's Brief

This devotion began in the 13th Century. It seems that a certain woman was grievously afflicted, so much that she determined to put an end to her life by drowning. While on her way to carry out this sinful purpose, she passed a Franciscan Church. It happened to be the Feast of St. Anthony. She entered the church and while I prayer, she seemed to see St. Anthony standing near her, hold in his hand a piece of parchment. He gave her this parchment, telling her to arise and keep it and she would be cured. When the vision passed she found the parchment in her hand and looking at it saw it bore these words...

"Ccce Crueem Domini; Fugit partes adbersae! Dicit Leo de Tribu Fudae, Raoiz David, Alleluia, Alleluia." These words mean:

"Behold the cross of the Lord; fly, all hostile powers, The Lion of the Tribe of Juda, Root of David, hath conquered, Alleluia, Alleluia."

The woman returned home cured of her terrible affliction, which was no lea than possession by a demon. The king of the country where this incident occurred, hearing of it, induced the woman to give him this parchment. When she had parted with it, the affliction returned. Finally the woman's husband through whereupon she completely recovered. The Franciscan Fathers realized the power of this parchment and a protection against all dangers. The word /brief is in this sense used to indicate a document of importance. Another incident proving powe of St. Anthony's Brief is to be found in the experience of the crew of a naval vessel which was caught in a terrific storm. The crew being Catholic, had recourse to St. Anthony. The chaplain wrote out the words of the Brief on a piece of paper and cast it into the sea. Immediately the sea calmed down and vessel was saved.



The reason why it's so important to be baptized in the name of the full Holy Trinity, as Jesus instructs in the Gospel reading, instead of only through Jesus our Savior as a few Protestant sects do, is because God in his fullness – all three Persons of the triune nature of God – wants to have a personal relationship with

you, a true friendship.

Are you aware of living in a special love relationship with each Person of the Trinity? Can you sit and chat with God as Father, God as Savior, and God as Holy Spirit? When you're feeling hurt, can you sit in the Father's lap and receive his comfort? When you're fighting temptation, can you feel the strength of Jesus coming to your rescue? When you're worried or confused or struggling to have faith, are you aware of the Spirit's gentle guidance?

The Father of Jesus is our own, very special Divine Daddy or Abba in the reading from Romans. Is he a fearsome punishing authority who barely understands you? No, he gladly adopted you during your baptism, because he's a doting daddy who provides for our needs.

The Holy Spirit assures us of this. God's Spirit embraces us and comforts us and teaches us everything



we need to know so we can live in the joy of a life that's full of love. And in that love, Jesus sacrificed himself for us so that we can be free from the punishment of sin and live holy lives with the

help of his Holy Spirit.

God is a trinity of helpers, healers, strengtheners, faith-builders. He wants you to live in the fullness of his divinity! He wants you to benefit from all that he is.

As baptized Christians and as sacramental Catholics, we lack nothing that really matters!

### Reflect & Discuss:

- 1. Who is the easiest Person of the Trinity for you to feel close to?
- Why do you not feel as close to the other two? What will you do to remedy this? (Hint: ask the Holy Spirit to help you with it!)
- How does the Holy Spirit help you know that Jesus is with you always, just as he promised he would be?
- 4. And how does this help you understand the goodness of being adopted by God the Father?

In your answers, it's best not to refer to the Father as "God", since Jesus is also God and so is the Holy Spirit. To prevent confusion, it's good to say "the Father" or "Daddy-God" when talking about the Father.


