



#### **Outdoor Sunday Mass**





Moses ratifies the covenant by offering a thanksgiving sacrifice and by sprinkling blood over the people. The new covenant, the law's oblation, is ratified in the blood of Christ, the unblemished offering poured out for us.



#### Craig's Corner A note from our Music Director

This Sunday's Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ parallels our celebration of Holy Thursday, but since Holy Week is often overshadowed by the Passion of the Lord, early Church leaders wanted another day to also celebrate the Lord's institution of the Eucharist to call extra attention to the mystery at the altar which we celebrate each Mass. After the noon Mass this weekend, we mirror the transfer of the Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday with our procession of the Eucharist with benediction.

While many composers of our day today continue to write hymns and pieces for our celebration of the sacraments, we cannot lose the texts of the ancient Church which got us to this point in the rich history of our faith. Our benediction hymn, *O Salutaris Hostia*, comes from the final two stanzas of a larger hymn written specifically for Corpus Christi Sunday by Saint Thomas Aquinas back in the 13<sup>th</sup> Century. The text is associated with the ritual of benediction, as it states:

O saving Victim, opening wide, The gate of heaven to man below! Our foes press on from every side; Thine aid supply, thy strength bestow.

To Thy great name by endless praise, Immortal Godhead, one in Three; Oh, grant us endless length of days, In our true native land with Thee. Amen

Parts of our other music this weekend also mirrors the Holy Thursday celebration. The hymn *At That First Eucharist*, which celebrates the institution of the Eucharist is the subject for the weekend's prelude and is our communion hymn. The offertory hymn, *Praise to the Lord*, praises Christ our high priest who is the source of the gifts we place on our altar in the Eucharistic feast each Mass. The opening hymn, *Festival Canticle* recounts the passage from the Book of Revelation where Christ is the Lamb once slain who lives forever, to whom all honor and glory are to be revered. It connects this canticle with our Eucharistic feast: the feast of victory by which we remember Christ's institution of the Eucharist but in a bit more lively fashion than what we do on Holy Thursday.



Saturday June 12 Immaculate Heart of Mary 2 Corinthians 5:14-21 Ps 103:1-4,9-12 Luke 2:41-51 This Sunday's scriptures speak of the value of the Eucharist: "the blood of the covenant" and "the cup of salvation". What does the Eucharist mean to you?

Christ came to earth to serve us as our high priest. Unlike the Jewish priests of the Old Testament, who atoned for the people's sins with the blood of goats and calves, Jesus absolved our sins with his own blood. He said: "This is my blood of the covenant, shed for many." This is the *new* covenant. With it he achieved what no other high priest could do: He obtained for us eternal redemption.

Only the blood of God himself could accomplish this, because no matter how good our intentions are, and no matter how holy a priest might be, we all fall back into sin again and again. Only Jesus, the perfectly holy human whose divinity conquered death, could open the doors to eternal life.

Jesus paid a very high price to atone for our sins. What if we come to Mass with unrepented sins? Our desire to avoid the hard work and humility of changing is larger than our desire to let Jesus transform us. It's larger than our desire to enjoy all the benefits of the Eucharist.

To receive his body and blood in the Eucharist without letting it atone for our sins is to snub and reject the terrible price that Jesus paid when he died for us. To avoid



his presence in the Sacrament of Confession because it makes us feel uncomfortable is highly disrespectful of the suffering that he endured for us.

If we accept the ongoing atonement provided for us in

the Eucharist without accepting the need to repent of any sin, we are insulting Jesus while denying ourselves an opportunity to let him save us that sin.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ has the power to "transubstantiate" us into his likeness. We should always leave Mass different than when we arrived. This is God's plan! His work as our high priest isn't yet finished.

## Reflect & Discuss:

- 1. What sins have been most difficult for you to overcome?
- 2. Why? Who or what is replacing Jesus as the god you imitate?
- 3. What will you do this week to give Jesus the opportunity to save you from these sins?
- 4. How did you learn that the consecrated bread and wine at Mass are truly the real Body and Blood of Christ? What makes you sure of it today?
- 5. How does this affect your attitude about your sins?
