



Craig's Corner A note from our Music Director

One of the highlights of my year since I was a kid is the Saint Anthony novena. Hearing of the multiple miracles of this highly devoted saint and Anthony's pure love and devotion to Christ and the sacraments in his ministry as a priest and doctor of the Church has only allowed me to deepen my faith and I know his intercession has worked wonders for many other devotees through the years as well.

Saint Anthony was born in Lisbon, Portugal near the end of the twelfth century. Shortly after ordination to the priesthood, he transferred to the Friars Minor to devote himself to spreading the faith among African people. He had his greatest success preaching in France and Italy by converting hardened heretics. He was the first member of this Order to teach theology to his brethren and his sermons are notable for their learning and gentleness. He died at Padua in 1231.

The hymn to Saint Anthony, which we sing for all of our novenas is our opening hymn again this weekend as we celebrate Saint Anthony's feast as a parish partly devoted to him in addition to our patroness of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. The words of this hymn call attention to Anthony's devotion to the Child Jesus and asking the sweet infant Jesus to hold our personal petitions close to His heart.

Anthony's gentleness should ring deeply in our hearts as well as the spirit of Christmas and the child Jesus should also prevail in us every day of the year, not just at the holidays. Our offertory hymn, the *Italian Hymn* as it is often called, "Come, Our Almighty King" praises Christ as the Incarnate Word – coming down to us in flesh at Christmas. As we close our Masses with the hymn "For All the Saints" we also should wish to strive for holiness which Saint Anthony and all the saints achieved. With a gentle heart, we too go forth to preach the Gospel in our actions each week.

In one of Saint Anthony's sermons he states that those of us *"filled with the Holy Spirit speaks in different languages. These different languages are different ways of witnessing to Christ, such as humility, poverty, patience, and obedience; we speak in those languages when we reveal in ourselves these virtues to others. Actions speak louder than words; let your words teach and your actions speak."*

It is my pleasure to be able to celebrate the feast day Mass with the joint choir of Saint Anthony-Our Lady of Mount Carmel basilica and to celebrate the feast at Saint Anthony Church for the 10AM Mass this weekend. I thank RJ Gavalier and Jaden Karr, faithful musicians at St. Anthony Church each week for coming to the basilica this weekend to celebrate the 9AM and 11AM Masses.

This week, something is going to happen that will give you the opportunity to touch someone's life with God's love. Watch for it.

If you consciously choose to make the most of the situation, you might feel challenged, perhaps a bit nervous or intimidated, but you will experi-

ence the joy of making a difference for the kingdom of God. And you might be surprised at how well you do!

God has been preparing you for this situation for a long time. Your trials, your spiritual education, your personal purification process, your prayer-time insights, your Christ-centered conversations with others – all these and more have been part of the preparation.

You are like the seed in the Gospel passage. Life's circumstances have fertilized

you, watered you, and tilled your soil. Over time, the seed sprouted, the plant grew, and the flowers began to produce good fruit.

Every day, we all encounter small and sometimes large opportunities to serve the kingdom of God. We don't have to be full-time volunteers nor paid employees of the Church to work in the mission of Christ. If we are willing, he touches the world through us in our homes, our workplaces, our parishes, in the grocery store, in the traffic tie-ups, on the Internet, and everywhere we go. Have any of your seeds sprouted into a tree that withered from neglect or got chopped down by others? This happens to all of us. The good news is: In every dead tree at least one fruit remains, shriveled up and hanging



from a lifeless branch, but secretly holding a very valuable seed.

We are to take those ugly, dead fruits and plant them in the

freshly tilled soil of today. A new tree will grow and it will become taller and stronger and more abundantly fruitful than the tree from which it came, because the decay from the original tree is now additional fertilizer in the soil.

In everything that happens to you, remember: You have good fruits to share; God has been nurturing their growth. You *are* ready!

Reflect & Discuss:

- 1. What are some of the ways you have grown in your faith? How can this help others?
- Realizing that the good fruit that come from your growth is Jesus working through you to make the world a better place, how do you feel about this?
- Describe various ways that we continue the mission of Christ in our ordinary lives.
- 4. What produces new growth in us so that we become more useful to Christ?
