

**Craig's Corner** A note from our Music Director

You know how when you do something a million times you tend to just let yourself go through the motions? That's how I felt recently when singing the hymn "How Great Thou Art" for a recent funeral. So in paying a bit more attention to the words as I was singing it the next time, I decided to do a bit more digging into where the text was inspired from. In doing some research, I found out that the hymn came from a Swedish poem entitled "O Store Gud" (which became the hymn tune name) in 1885 by Carl G. Boberg. The poem became a sung piece, which in the early 1920's, English missionaries Stuart K. Hine and his wife were in Poland where they learned the Russian version of the poem with the original melody. Eventually, Hine wrote English words, making his own arrangement of the initial Swedish melody getting the tune "How Great Thou Art" we know today.

I read further that the first two verses were inspired, from Hine's experiences in the Carpathian Mountains. Among the sympathetic listeners was a local village school-master. A storm was gathering, and when it was evident that they could no longer travel that night, the school-master offered his hospitality. The sound of the roaring thunder echoing through the mountains brought about the first verse. Pushing on, Hine crossed the mountain frontier into Romania and Bukovina. After the storm passed, continuing on, they eventually wandered through forest glades, hearing birds singing in the trees and thus the second verse.

These two verses show the ferocity of Nature while also the calm of Nature. How often after a big storm do we see quiet weather? I cannot think of a better hymn to paint the picture of our first reading, psalm, and gospel this weekend than these two verses! Job and the disciples in the two different accounts encounter a storm and it is God's mighty hand which calms the scene. The psalmist echoes the thankfulness of those who are relieved after the mighty act of God calms the storms. This is echoed in our offertory hymn, "Be Not Afraid." Jesus asks the disciples why they are afraid and why they showed a lack of faith with Him around. This is in an early chapter of Mark's gospel and even at the end of this passage, Mark states that the disciples were amazed that the winds and seas obeyed Christ. The disciples were still new to Jesus' miracles. But even we after so many years of living out our faith often times forget that God is in control and we shouldn't be afraid of the storms that sometimes pass through our lives.

These two hymns this weekend acknowledge the mighty power of God but remind us that we should not be afraid. Even after the storms, we can wander through forest glades, hearing the gentle breeze and no matter what we face, still proclaim "O Lord, how great Thou art!"





It's hurricane season where I live in Florida. Some people believe that destructive storms are punishments from God. While it is true that people deserve to be punished for their immorality, Jesus took the Father's righteous wrath upon his own body, accepting torture, shedding blood, and dying, so that all sinners could be saved from the justice we deserve.

Jesus wants to calm our storms, not cause them.

Hardships are not punishments. They are the best occasions for growing closer to God. All of us have seasons of storms in our lives. Each of them are invitations to realize that Jesus is walking with us through it all, whether we deserve his help or not. They're opportunities to learn more knowledge, gain more wis-

dom, and grow stronger in true faith. It's a time of becoming more humble. Because of our increased need to rely on God, we discover more about his love, but only if we stop insisting that God should behave like a magic genie that we control to resolve our problems the way we think it should happen.

Some of the storms in this world continue raging because we don't do enough to bring the presence of Christ into them. After we've gained from our experiences, we're supposed to help others endure the storms of their lives. We have the earthly hands that Jesus wants to use to calm their storms. And then, surprise! It is in this outreach that we realize that our sufferings have not been in vane; this calms our stormy clouds of despair and regret.

Often, we create storms by making sinful decisions, but God doesn't want us to get punished. He sends plenty of red-flag warnings and then, if we get into a hurricane anyway, Jesus invites us to calm the turmoil by reconciling with him.

Whether the storms brew by sin or by nature, if we cry out like the disciples in Sunday's Gospel reading — "Lord, don't you care that we're perishing?" — Jesus replies, "Why are you scared? How little faith you have! My peace is already here."

#### Reflect & Discuss:

- What's stormy in your life right now? From where did this turmoil come?
- What do you need Jesus to save you from today? Choose an action that extends trust to him. What will you do this week to quiet yourself and find the peaceful presence of Christ?
- 3. How has Jesus calmed the waves or led you to a peaceful shore when you suffered through a stormy time in your life?
- 4. When did you recognize his presence beside you? What happened that revealed his helpfulness?
