





Craig's Corner A note from our Music Director

From calming the sea last weekend and teaching His disciples about the importance of faith, to this weekend seeing the faith of two followers who look to Jesus for healing, we are reminded of the importance of our faith and the power of Christ's role in our lives. Our music this weekend focuses on the power of the name of Jesus as well as of His healing ministry to us even this day.

I would be remiss if I didn't take most of my space in the bulletin to extend my heartfelt thank you to you all for the generous outpouring of support you showed me last weekend as Monsignor announced my acceptance into the seminary to begin my studies for the priesthood for our Diocese of Youngstown. Words simply cannot describe how humbled I was to stand before you all as I begin these next steps.

My entire life has been centered on our basilica parish, from growing up sitting in the front row, to being an altar server, an assistant organist, to your minister of music. Monsignor Cariglio has been such a positive influence in my life and I hope to emulate his example moving forward. As we have celebrated Masses together and talked here and there, we have formed a good working relationship (not just because of our Pittsburgh sports common interest) and I am very excited that he has assigned me to Saint Mary's Seminary in Cleveland beginning this August. I am humbled that, when he met my parents, he told them how in just a short time of knowing me and watching me on TV, how dedicated I am to all of my roles in our diocese, our parish, and our community. I pray that I will excel just as well in my seminary studies as I go forward.

I am excited for these next steps but also will miss singing with our parish family every weekend. In honor of our great group of people I have worked with in my time as music director, a few of us are planning a special concert to take place on Thursday, July 29. I am also planning a solo organ recital on Tuesday of that week, July 27. We will have more details on these as we get closer. Again, from the bottom of my heart, thank you! Be assured of my prayers for you all as I move forward, and as I mentioned last week too, there's a 100% chance I need all of your prayers as well.



Wouldn't it be great if we could actually touch and feel the hem of Jesus' clothing, like the woman in this Sunday's Gospel reading? To be near enough to Jesus Je

sus to be healed spiritually, physically, and emotionally. How can we, more than 2000 years after he ascended to heaven, get so close to him?

It is possible, and it's exactly what Jesus wants. It comes from developing a better understanding of who Jesus really is and how much God really cares. The synagogue leader understood, which is why he could say: "Please, come lay your hands on my daughter that she may live." He understood Jesus beyond what was in front of his eyes.

Knowing Jesus is to know divine life, which transforms our earthly life into something much more like his and then takes us to heaven. The first reading, remember, states clearly that death is not part

of God's plan. Jesus drives this point home by allowing the girl to die before he reaches her house. Certainly God could have kept her alive until he got there! But he wanted to show us that he could restore life and that he has the power to rescue us from death.

If we fear death, we don't recognize the nearness of Christ. We can touch the hem of his garment, but we



don't see it, and so we don't believe it. In this case, we're like the mourners that Jesus had to chase out of the house before working his miracle.

If we fear that our trials are leading

to disastrous conclusions, we've forgotten how powerful Jesus is, and we've forgotten that he cares enough to rescue us. We need to move ourselves closer to Jesus. We have to press on through the crowd of distractions and doubts, with our eyes fixed only on Jesus and our hands reaching out to him in prayer.

If we fear that God doesn't care enough to help us, we need to spend more time learning why Jesus gave up his life for us and why the Father sent him to us.

Reflect & Discuss:

- Do you believe that Jesus wants to work miraculously in your life?
- How has the disbelief of the people around you infected your thinking and reduced your faith?
- 3. Describe a miracle that you saw or experienced. How long did it take?
- 4. What blessings occurred during the time of suffering?
- 5. How was all of this an expression of God's love?


