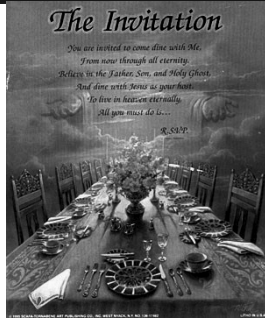

**THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
TODAY'S FOCUS: ANSWERING THE INVITATION**

To find or know healing and mercy from God, we have to respond to the ever-present invitation from God to trust, and to have faith.

Faith is not a psychological trait that we manufacture within ourselves. God is the source of faith. Faith is first a gift, a (sometimes subconscious) movement of the Holy Spirit rising within us. That inner beckoning becomes a dance of call and response between us and our Creator. Faith grows as our yes responses grow. Faith shrinks as our no replies compound. In the grace of God, to which of these will we say yes today—the urges toward fear, doubt, and despair, or the beckoning toward faith and hope?

**THE FEAST OF SAINT THOMAS, APOSTLE
JULY 3RD**



Saint Thomas the Apostle was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus according to the New Testament. Thomas is commonly known as “Doubting Thomas” because he doubted Jesus’ resurrection when first told of it.; later, he confessed his faith(“My Lord and my God”) on seeing Jesus’ crucifixion wounds.

According to tradition accounts Saint Thomas is believed to have traveled outside of the Roman Empire to preach the Gospel, traveling as far as the Malabar Coast which is in modern day India.

Thomas was the only witness of the Assumption of Mary into heaven. The other apostles were miraculously transported to Jerusalem to witness her death. Thomas was left in India, but after her first burial, he was transported to her tomb, where he witnessed her bodily assumption into heaven, from which she dropped her girdle. In an inversion of the story of Thomas’ doubts, the other apostles are skeptical of Thomas’ story until they see the empty tomb and the girdle



WITH A FATHER’S HEART:

Last week we celebrated Father’s Day but our Holy Father Francis proclaims the greatest father was Joseph, whom all four Gospels refer to as the father of Jesus.

Matthew and Luke, the two Evangelists who speak most of Joseph, tell us very little, yet enough for us to appreciate what sort of father he was, and the mission entrusted to him by God’s providence.

We know Joseph as a lowly carpenter, betrothed to Mary. He was a “just man”, ever ready to carry out God’s will as revealed to in the law and through four dreams. After a long and tiring journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem, he beheld the birth of the Messiah in a stable, since “there was no place for them elsewhere. He witnessed the adoration of the shepherds and the Magi who represented respectively the people of Israel and the pagan peoples.

Joseph had the courage to become the legal father of Jesus, to whom he gave the name revealed by the angel. In the Temple, forty days after Jesus birth, Joseph and Mary offered their child to the Lord and listened with amazement to Simeon’s prophecy concerning Jesus and his Mother. To protect Jesus from Herod, Joseph dwelt as a foreigner in Egypt. After returning to his own country, he led a hidden life in the tiny and obscure village of Nazareth in Galilee, far from Bethlehem.
