
## MEASURE UP CAMPAIGN

## Craig's Corner A note from our Music Director

"Weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints" — we hear all of these mentioned this weekend in the second reading from Paul's letter to the Corinthians. In the early Church, it was tough being a new disciple of Christ's teaching since so much hostility was sent their way. This isn't much different two thousand years later as the Church still faces many divisions and hardships. The Lord tells Ezekiel in the first reading that he too, will face opposition when he was sent to the Israelites. And even Jesus, when he returns to His native place in today's Gospel, is not treated well there so that He cannot even perform many signs because of the lack of faith of the people. As is the case in so many scenarios in life, we often can learn from ours or others' mistakes.

The readings set before us this weekend can remind us of what *not* to be like in our Christian call of discipleship. However, in the psalm we sing "our eyes are fixed on the Lord, pleading for His mercy." Often times we are like those in the Gospel who lack faith for one reason or another, and turn away from the Lord. The psalm reiterates our necessity to rely on the Lord pleading for His mercy. We will surely endure hardships and weaknesses in our lives, just like Paul and the first disciples. But with our eyes fixed on God and His mercy, we will be stronger in our trials.

The music selections this weekend call attention to mercy as well as to the hardships faced through time. Our opening hymn, "Praise My Soul, the King of Heaven," specifically states that we are "ransomed, healed, restored, and forgiven" and that "he tends and spares us" rescuing us from all our foes because he knows our feeble selves and that "widely yet his mercy flows." This parallels the psalm, that if we reflect on Christ as our Savior, we won't lose our faith: he will keep us strong. Our offertory hymn, "The Church's One Foundation" calls to mind that through the past, the Church in all its tribulations and trials, has stood the test of time because Christ is at the head. In our communion hymn, Saint Francis' beloved text, we are also reminded that, as Christians, wherever hatred abounds, we must bring Christ's love to each other

However tough our Christian call may be, our music and readings this weekend remind us that with our eyes fixed on the Lord, we stay strong no matter what life throws our way. Where faith lacks, Christ's true presence cannot be shown as we saw in the Gospel this weekend. However, as our hymns remind us, when Christ is the head and where Christ is king, we can turn hatred into true love for all of our brothers and sisters.




## Rayen Avenue Hillside

# Good News INSPIRATION FOR DAILY LIFE

pens when we share our faith with those who knew us before we became alive in our faith.

Like Jesus, we are rejected, misunderstood, and disbelieved by people who don't understand why we changed. They

feel threatened by our example; they don't want to consider their own need to change. We sound like fanatics to them, and they use this as an excuse to remain uninfluenced by our testimony.

Jesus changed after he quit living an ordinary life in an ordinary town with an ordinary job to begin a ministry that would instigate persecution, and he invited everyone to follow his example. How crazy does that sound?

Making matters worse, he was now spending all of his time trying to change the status quo of everyone's normal life and their normal ways of relating to others and their normal attitudes about religion – even affecting the status quo of those who did not want to follow him and become like him.

People don't like to be challenged, especially when it means giving up what's familiar and comfortable. However, this is not a reason for us to keep silent. We have been called by Christ to share the good news about him.

We must make it known that conversion is important, or else we are sin-

> ning against him and against those who need to learn more about him.

> We fulfill this mission by sharing our personal conversion stories and our spiritual insights, and especially by making this an invitation rather than by demanding that others change.

If you're being rejected because of this, remember that Jesus understands how you feel. Let the sting of their rejection be replaced by an awareness that God is very pleased with you.

## Reflect & Discuss:

- In what ways has Jesus changed your life?
- 2. Who are the people that misunderstand these changes?
- 3. Now list those who do understand you: What can you do to enjoy their company more often?
- 4. When have you been rejected because of your spiritual growth? What have you learned about how to lovingly respond to their objections?
- 5. Have you ever walked away like Jesus did when he left his hometown?
