





Protect and guide Poe Francis, and the Church, that the light of the Gospel might reach the ends of the earth.


Send Your Spirit, O Lord, to renew the world, that the storm of the pandemic might be calmed, the poor consoled, and wars ended.

Craig's Corner A note from our Music Director

In Paul's letter to the Ephesians this weekend, he reminds us that we all have a specific call in life but that as Christians we are unified by one Lord, one faith, one baptism. At our baptisms, we were anointed with oil sealing our mission in the common priesthood of Christ. This doesn't necessarily mean ordained priests but our common mission to promote the Gospel. The ordained priesthood, of course is the priest acting in the person of Christ to bring the Sacraments to God's people and most importantly to celebrate the Mass with the community. We all partake in this Mass, not as innocent bystanders but as a community sharing in our common priesthood.

This weekend's account of the multiplication of the loaves and fish in the Gospel, prefigured by Elisha in the first reading from the second book of Kings. The loaves and fish account reminds us that God provides for us, even if it seems like so little. We are always fed with what we need spiritually, if we come to the altar to receive it. Our psalm and hymns this weekend revolve around this account and the importance of the Eucharist and being fed by the hand of the Lord. Padre Pio's famous prayer sung at offertory this weekend also reminds us that communion is the light which drives away the darkness of our souls. Let us pray going forward this week and beyond, that we continue to want to be nourished by God's word and Eucharist often so that we can continue to share in the common priesthood we all are called to be a part of.

Many people have asked about my final days as music director so I wanted to give a brief "schedule" of events coming up in the next week. As we have been announcing, we have a few wonderful evenings of sacred music coming up this week. My last weekend as the official music director of the parish will be next weekend, July 31 – August 1. 

real miracle is that Jesus got the people to share the food they had brought with them", and even this: "There wasn't enough food for everyone to have their fill, but what they had was offered to everyone, and the people were just so appreciative and willing to make sacrifices that they ate very little

and thus there was food left over."

Yeah, r-i-i-ight. As if God can't multiply food miraculously.

The multiplication of the loaves and fish into a meal that not only satisfied everyone but was more than what they needed is an important foreshadowing of the Eucharistic banquet we celebrate today. If we pay close attention to what's going on in Mass, and if we take it to heart, Jesus satisfies our hungers and gives us more than we need. What did you

need from him before you arrived at church? He's trying to give it to you or lead you to it -- in abundance!

Receiving all that he wants to miraculously give us requires that we trust him to provide for us. We have to expect the unexpected. We have to wait on his perfect timing. But rest assured that he wants to give us more than we need.

Maybe some of the folks on that ancient hillside wanted steak instead of fish, but what they received was a Messiah who filled their hearts with more than enough faith to grow spiritually, more than enough hope to be-

come stronger in their trials, and more than enough love to share as they went forth to reveal Christ to others.

In our Liturgies of the Eucharist, there's a lot more abundance to receive from Jesus than just a little wafer of his Body and a sip of his Blood. What do you really need from

Jesus? More faith? More hope? More love? It's a good idea to think about this on the way to Mass so that you can participate in Mass more expectantly.



- Why do you go to Mass? Was there ever a time when you didn't go, and if so, why didn't you? What motivated you to start attending Mass again?
- 2. How satisfied are you now? What's missing? How might God provide for those needs?
- 3. What is available from Jesus during Mass other than his real presence in the Host and Precious Blood of the Eucharist?
- 4. How are the various elements of Mass gifts from God that can help satisfy our spiritual, emotional, and even physical needs?
