





A note from our Music Director

This weekend I am featuring one of our long time choir members, Susan Izzo!

"My first exposure to vocal music occurred when I was a young child. My father would play Mario Lanza records and I would try to imitate the voices on the recordings. We also enjoyed listening to the Ray Coniff singers (which probably most of you today have never heard of). My siblings and I had fun singing and dancing in our living room. My parents loved to dance especially the Polka.

While singing in the choir at Boardman High School, our choir director, Mr. Errol Kehrberg, discovered my vocal talent. In my senior year I auditioned for and was accepted into the Boardman Chorale under the direction of Mrs. Etheleda Humphrey. Our chorale was fortunate in having the opportunity to travel to Mexico to enter a choral competition that year (1974). The Boardman Chorale earned a Gold Medal. Many attributed our First Place finish to my singing the solo part to Schubert's *Omnipotence* which we performed in the competition.

My high school directors encouraged me to take voice lessons and audition for the Dana School of Music. Thus after graduating Boardman High School in 1974 I began my journey as a vocal performance major at YSU.

I was so blessed and thankful for the many wonderful professors and musical opportunities at Dana! I sang in many operas, musical theatre productions, concert choir, Dana Madrigals, recitals, and other music events at YSU. I sang at the Youngstown Playhouse in "Hello Dolly".

My faith has always been most important to me. I had many opportunities singing in various churches throughout the Youngstown area; St. Christine parish, St. Columba Cathedral, First Covenant Church, St. John Episcopal Church, Jewish Temple Rodef Shalom, and my home sweet home, Our Lady of Mount Carmel Ba-

After graduating from YSU I went on to pursue a Masters Degree in Boston, Massachusetts at the New England Conservatory. I am grateful for all the experiences I enjoyed there in the big city.

After graduating the New England Conservatory I returned to the Youngstown area. Deacon Mark and I were asked to sing for the Italian Man of the Year Dinner honoring Joe Montana. Shortly after, Deacon Mark and I began dating. Even though both of us attended the Dana School at the same time, we never dated despite being in several operas, musicals, and vocal ensembles. We were even husband and wife in the opera *Die Fledermaus*. He didn't know when he proposed to me on November 22, 1985 that it was the Feast of St. Cecilia, Patroness of Musicians. I felt this was God's will for us; to be husband and wife and share our musical talents together.

Deacon Mark was our wonderful organist and choir director at Our Lady of Mount Carmel for 26 years. During this time, I enjoyed being a cantor and choir director under his direction. We also sang for many weddings here at Mount Carmel and throughout the Youngstown area.

Deacon Mark and I were blessed with one beautiful daughter, Theresa who, in her own right, is very talented in playing both clarinet and organ. Despite these talents, she decided to pursue a career in chemistry and biology.

I am looking forward to continuing as a choir member at our beautiful basilica under the direction of Nick Mattiussi. I am so grateful to God for the gift of my voice and hope that I can continue to praise His Name through song for many years to come.

Saturday November 20 1 Maccabees 6:1-13 Ps 9:2-4,6,16,19 Luke 20:27-40 Do you have an unending problem? Where's Jesus? In today's Gospel reading, Jesus speaks of his Second Coming. And here he hasn't even finished his first coming! How confusing it must have been to the disciples.

They grew even more confused after Jesus ascended to heaven but delayed coming back. They remembered him saying that "this generation" will not pass away until all these Second Coming events have taken place, yet time passed, the apostles began to die off, and Jesus still had not returned. The misery of living in this world continued

Think of your own unending problem. Don't you wish Jesus would hurry up with his Second Coming and destroy all evil? Notice what Jesus said: "When you see these things happening, know that I am near, at the gates." He didn't pin down a date.

So what was he trying to convey? His nearness!

For the past 2000+ years, we have all been part of "this generation" that will not pass away before his Second Coming. It's the generation of Christian humanity, the Body of Christ on Earth in the form of Church community, the generation of children who have been adopted by God the Father through the sacrifice and resurrection of God the Son.



The final era ("last days") of salvation began on the first Pentecost and will continue until the Second Coming of Christ. It's is the age of the Holy Spirit; Christ's earthly ministry is continued through us empowered by his Spirit.

The lesson in the fig tree is that we can discern when summer is near. In other words, we can discern – in good times and in bad – that Jesus is near to us in his Holy Spirit.

Jesus is right now at "the gate" of your next step on the journey to heaven. A gate is meant to be opened so that we can pass through it. Jesus is opening the gate right now for you – the gate of holiness, the gate of love. Step through it to live in the fullness of the mission he has planned for you here on earth.

Reflect & Discuss:

- What problems are you waiting to be rescued from? Is Jesus really taking too long, or does he have a bigger, better plan?
- 2. What will you do to become more aware of his nearness, his comfort, his joy and peace to help you endure the long wait?
- 3. What are the signs that the Church gives us that help us discern the nearness of Christ?
- 4. What other "fig trees" has Jesus given to you that increase your hope and patience and endurance?
