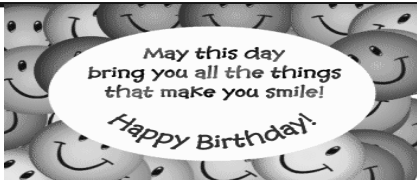

**FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT
TODAY'S FOCUS: THERE'S NO "I" ON GOD'S TEAM**

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Fasting means eating a lesser amount of food. Catholics 18 and not 60 years of age must fast. The days on which we must fast are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Days of abstinence are days on which we do not eat any meat at all. Dairy products, fish and seafood are allowed. All Catholics over the age of 14 must abstain. The days of obligatory abstinence as Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, both the laws of fasting & Abstinence apply and no meat may be eaten.
