



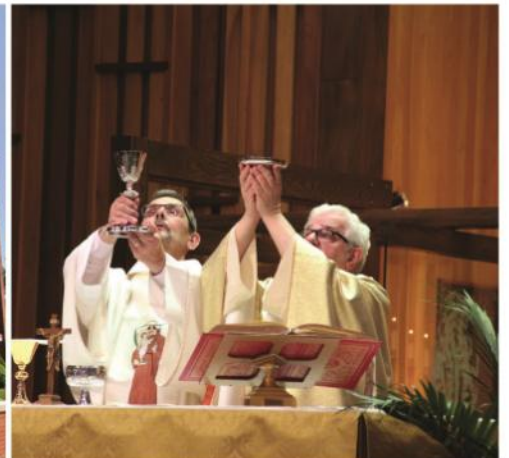

Pro-Life News:

Catholic Hospitals Don't Have to Perform Abortions, 'Transitions'

WASHINGTON — A federal appellate court on Aug. 26 blocked a push to force doctors to perform abortions or sex-reassignment surgeries.

The decision against such a federal mandate was made on religious-freedom grounds. "This ruling is a major victory for conscience rights and compassionate medical care in America," Joseph Davis, counsel at the legal group Becket, said on Aug. 26. "Doctors cannot do their jobs and comply with the Hippocratic Oath if the government requires them to perform harmful, irreversible procedures against their conscience and medical expertise," he said.

The court case is known as *Franciscan Alliance v. Becerra*. Franciscan Alliance, a hospital network founded by the Sisters of St. Francis of Perpetual Adoration. Becket is the alliance's legal representation. Nine states joined the suit, as did other groups, including the Christian Medical and Dental Association.

Critics of gender transition have cited scientific, moral and religious objections. Abortion opponents say the procedure kills an unborn human being, citing moral and scientific concerns as well as religious objections. The Catholic Church teaches, "Since the first century the Church has affirmed the moral evil of every procured abortion." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2271).

"For years, our clients have provided excellent medical care to all patients who need it," Davis said. "Today's ruling ensures that these doctors and hospitals may continue to do this critical work in accordance with their conscience and professional medical judgment."

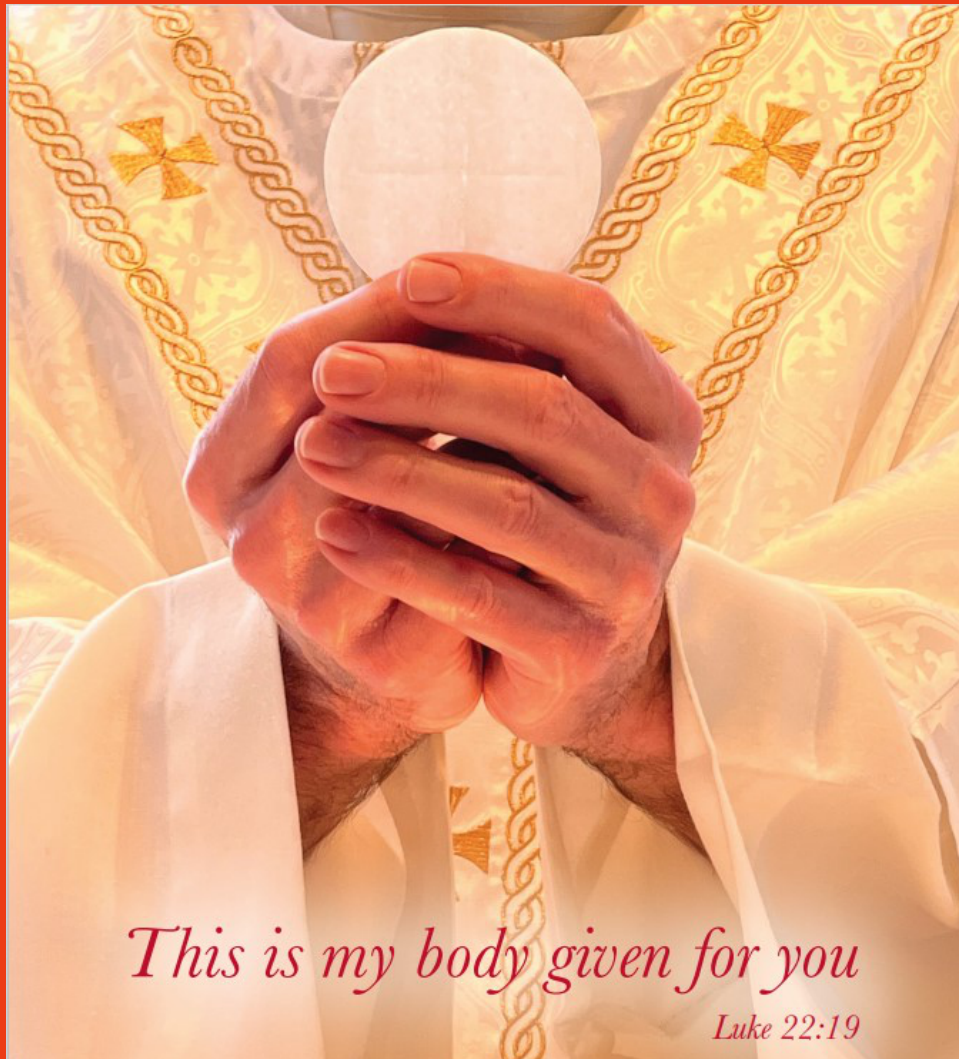

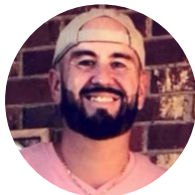
