

As I write these few thoughts about going Along the Way this past week, I think of the two funeral Masses offered at St. Anthony Church. Both departed souls were very strong in their Catholic faith, and I consider them Heaven's gain and our loss. But it is a consolation to me and to their families, to let go of a loved one who lived their life close to God and the Church.

In the face of grieving and loss, there were also many very fine experiences this week. Roseann Sereday's family and friends showed her their love at a surprise birthday party for her. The Oblate Sisters celebrated their *Bella Sera*, a fine fundraising event, which helps the Sisters with their expenses. This year 360 persons attended, and they really enjoyed helping the Sisters. As always, the Sisters were very grateful.

On Sunday, at the 11am Mass, we commissioned the lay Catechists for the teaching of the faith to our young. At the same Mass, the St. Elizabeth School of Nursing celebrated the 50th Anniversaries of sixteen of their alumni. That comes to 800 years of service to the nursing ministry! What a blessing they are for the Catholic Church!

Also on Sunday, our Knights of Columbus celebrated the recent merging of Youngstown Council 274 and Immacolata Council 15086. The new entity is known as Immacolata

Youngstown Council 274. We blessed the donated statue of Christopher Columbus, the great explorer to the Americans in 1492, at the Bocce Court. We also blessed two war memorials of Knights of Columbus members who lost their lives in the two World Wars. All this took place during the Knights of Columbus annual Bocce Tournament which benefits our Catholic Schools. It was a record response.



This past week I spent a little time in Ravenna, doing some "Spring" cleaning at the Cariglio family home. That was just a beginning and will be continued.


