

Along the WAY

This past week the Basilica hosted the celebration of Columbus Day with a special dinner which featured a very nice meal, music, and seven scholarship awards for students who are attending YSU. The events recognized several families in attendance as well as the contributions of the Knights of Columbus and the Oblate Sisters. Anthony DeTomasi's grandchildren, who travelled from Chicago for the event, were also recognized. DeTomasi commissioned the marble statue of Christopher Columbus, which was recently relocated to the Bocce Court area of the Basilica grounds. The celebration was a genuine tribute to Christopher Columbus and the perennial spirit of discovery.

On Tuesday I travelled to Cleveland to be part of the Annual Convention of the Canon Law Society of America. Bishop Robert Barron gave a very good presentation on the topic of sodality, the call of the Pope to listen to all the members of the Church, but always in the context of the true and authentic teaching of the Gospel and the true teaching of the Catholic Church handed on to her from the Apostles. Whenever the true Church of Jesus seeks to save souls in a modern world, she must be led by the Holy Spirit and not by the mere trends of society.

This past Sunday, St. Anthony Church hosted their annual Fall Spaghetti Dinner. God's choicest blessings on all the volunteers who made this event a success. The money raised will help pay the bills. A report will be printed with the details soon.

The Essence of Our Call

The Second Vatican Council called all Christians to preach the Gospel to all people. To the Catholic laity, the Council enjoins the special task of *penetrating the secular world*, tenderly, lovingly, by putting this Gospel message into their political, economic, and everyday lives. This is a tremendous task! It can bring the light of Christ into the darkest corner of our fragmented, confused, searching, angry, and frightened world. But it demands of us that we put aside all nonessentials, that we stop all the word games, all the useless discussions. Yes, we must now come to the essence of things!

The essence is this: we must begin to live by *faith* and not by mere "religion." We must have an encounter with God and allow him to enter our very depths. We must remember that God loved us *first*, and that our religion is truly a love affair between God and us, us and God; it is not merely a system of morals and dogmas.

We must love God back, passionately! Through the *other*. We must love our neighbor, not only as ourselves but with the heart of God. Christ said to his disciples, "By this shall men know that you are my disciples, that you love one another *as I have loved you*." To love with the heart of God, we must empty ourselves totally of self, to allow Christ to love through us. Without him we cannot love anything or anyone, not even ourselves.




