

I wrote to you last week that I had a breakfast meeting with Adriana Trigiani of New York City. Adriana is well known for her very delightful and often very humorous novels that reflect her Italian American experience with best sellers, *Lucia, Lucia* and *The Shoemaker's Wife*. She has spoken at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel on two occasions and at the Lake Club three times. People were able to laugh at themselves as they related to their own Italian American ancestry. Adriana loves what she saw here in the Valley and its richness in ethnic diversity.

I met with her to suggest that she might consider a book to reflect the Italian experience in the Valley, for I am convinced that it is best seller material and that Adriana would be the perfect author. Being strongly rooted in her Catholic Faith, she highly respects priests and their calling. Pope Francis' Prepared Address to Catholic Educators, April 20, 2022

Dear Friends, ...

In an age awash in information, often transmitted without wisdom or critical sense, the task of forming present and future generations of Catholic teachers and students remains as important as ever. As educators, you are called to nurture the desire for truth, goodness and beauty that lies in the heart of each individual, so that all may learn how to love life and be open to the fullness of life. This involves discerning innovative ways of uniting research with best practices so that teachers can serve the whole person in a process of integral human development. In short, this means forming the head, hands and heart together: preserving and enhancing the link between learning, doing and feeling in the noblest sense. In this way, you will be able to offer not only an excellent academic curriculum, but also a coherent vision of life inspired by the teachings of Christ.

In this sense, the Church's work of education aims not only "at developing the maturity of the human person... but is especially directed towards ensuring that those who have been baptized become daily more appreciative of the gift of faith which they have received" (Second Vatican Council's Declaration *Gravissimum Educationis*, 2). Our faith is a great grace that each of us must daily nurture and help others to nurture as well. In the light of faith, educators and students alike come to see each other as beloved children of the God who created us to be brothers and sisters in the one human family. On this basis, Catholic education commits us, among other things, to the building of a better world by teaching mutual coexistence, fraternal solidarity and peace. ...

At the same time, Catholic education is also evangelization: bearing witness to the joy of the Gospel and its power to renew our communities and provide hope and strength in facing wisely the challenges of the present time. ...

I thank you and encourage you to continue in your important work, and I ask you, please, to pray for me. Entrusting all of you to the loving intercession of Mary, Mother of the Church, I cordially impart my Blessing as a pledge of joy and peace in Christ the Risen Saviour. And please do not forget to pray for me. Thank you!

BLESSING OF THROATS FOR THE FEAST OF SAN BIAGIO (ST. BLAISE) AFTER MASS | SAT. FEB 4 & SUN. FEB 5

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. —Prayer from the Blessing of the Throats

St. Blaise was the bishop of Sebaste in Armenia and suffered martyrdom under Licinius about AD 316. Records dating back to the early sixth century mention him being called upon to treat objects stuck in the throat but St. Blaise is also considered a protector against wild animals, a protector of cities, a patron of veterinarians, wool-combers, and the wool industry.

The blessing of the sick is an ancient custom of the Church. The annual blessing of throats is a traditional sign of the struggle against illness in the life of the Christian.


