

Along the WAY

The Blest Ashes on the first day of Lent remind us of our mortality and our need to repent from our sinful ways, whatever they may be. Despite this, there is a certain peace that comes with our communal observance of Ash Wednesday as even the little ones come forward for blest ashes. It reminds me that we are all in this together. We share the hope of coming closer to our Lord as we prepare for our celebration of the great Paschal Mysteries that bring salvation to the whole world. To all of you, young and old, lots of blessings and graces in this Season of Lent.

This Ash Wednesday our Apostolate for Perpetual Adoration once again began praying in the Little Flower Chapel. Presently there are about sixty persons who commit to a Holy Hour before the Most Blessed Sacrament once a week. Monsignor Michael J. Cariglio, Jr., Pastor and Rector

Excerpts from Pope Benedict XVI's Angelus on March 20, 2011

After Jesus had foretold his Passion to the disciples, "he took with him Peter, James and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain apart. And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his garments became white as light" (Mt 17:1-2). According to the senses the light of the sun is the brightest light known in nature but, according to the spirit, the disciples briefly glimpsed an even more intense splendour, that of the divine glory of Jesus which illumines the whole history of salvation. . .



[... The] Father himself proclaims: "this is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him" (Mt 17:5). The Transfiguration is not a change in Jesus but the revelation of his divinity: "the profound interpenetration of his being with God, which then becomes pure light. In his oneness with the Father, Jesus is himself 'light from light'" (Jesus of Nazareth: From the Baptism in the Jordan to the Transfiguration, Doubleday, New York, 2007, p. 310). ...

Dear friends, let us too share in this vision and in this supernatural gift, making room for prayer, and for listening to the Word of God. Further, especially in this Season of Lent, I urge you, as the Servant of God Paul VI wrote, "to respond to the divine precept of penitence by some voluntary act, apart from the renunciation imposed by the burdens of everyday life" (Apostolic Constitution Pænitemini, 17 February 1966, III, c: AAS 58 [1966], 182).

Let us invoke the Virgin Mary so that she may help us always to listen to and follow the Lord Jesus, even to the Passion and the Cross, in order to also participate in his glory.

Favorite Meals for LENT

Pasta con gamberi e piselli By Cathy Mastropietro

- I lb pasta (angel hair, spaghetti, linguine) I/4 tsp baking soda I lb medium shelled, deveined shrimp Kosher salt Fresh cracked black pepper I/4 cup olive oil
- 2 Tbs unsalted butter 4 cloves minced garlic I/4 cup white wine I cup frozen petite peas (thawed) I/3 cup grated Parmesan
- I-2 Tbs chopped parsley

Marinate shrimp in I tsp salt, 1/2 tsp pepper and baking soda in refrigerator for I5 minutes. Add pasta to large pot of boiling water and cook to al dente. Drain but reserve I cup cooking water. Meanwhile, in a large hot skillet add olive oil then layer shrimp. Reduce heat to medium. Cook until crust is formed (approx. 2 min). Flip and add butter and garlic. Cook I-2 mins. Add wine and simmer for a minute. Add peas and pasta. Toss. Salt and pepper to taste. Add Parmesan as desired, toss using pasta water as needed. Garnish with parsley. If desired sprinkle with lemon juice.

An Examination of Conscience for Lent

The Word Among Us, Lent 2023, pg. 69

Every Lent, God calls out, "return to me with your whole heart" (Joel 2:12). Why? Because he is "gracious and merciful, . . . Abounding in steadfast love" (2:13). And where best to experience this mercy than in the Sacrament of Reconciliation? The following questions can help you prepare to do just that. So pray through them, and ask the Holy Spirit to show you where you need his merciful touch. Then turn to the Lord and let him cleanse you and fill you with his abundant grace.

"Return to me," God says. "Let me bring you into my heart of love."

- Does God have first place in my life, or have I allowed other things to become "idols"?
- Do I pray regularly? Do I express my gratitude to the Lord for his gifts and blessings?
- Have I been disrespectful of God or taken his name in vain?
- Have I been faithful in honoring the Lord on the Sabbath by going to Mass?

Act of Contrition

O my God, I am sorry and repent with all my heart for the wrong I have done and for the good I have failed to do, because by sinning I have offended you, who are all good and worthy to be loved above all things. I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid the occasions of sin. Through the merits of the Passion of our Savior, Jesus Christ, Lord, have mercy.

"Return to me," God says. "Let me teach you to be merciful."

- Do I need to forgive someone? Do I need to ask someone else for forgiveness?
- Have I gossiped or spoken unkindly about someone? Have I betrayed a confidence?
- Have I given in to anger, frustration, or impatience with the people close to me?
- Have I engaged in sexual immorality?
- Have I cared for the poor and less fortunate?
- Have I cheated, lied, or acted out of greed?
- Am I praying for the people I consider my "enemies"?

Penance - our repentance, sorrow and resolution to amend our life with God's help.

Confession - the act in which we tell our sins to a priests.
