

Excerpts from *REDEMPTORIS CUSTOS*on the Person and Mission of Saint Joseph an Apostolic Exhortation by St. Pope John Paul II, August 15, 1989

1. "Joseph did as the angel of the Lord commanded him and took his wife" (cf. Mt 1:24).

Inspired by the Gospel, the Fathers of the Church from the earliest centuries stressed that just as St. Joseph took loving care of Mary and gladly dedicated himself to Jesus Christ's upbringing, he likewise watches over and protects Christ's Mystical Body, that is, the Church, of which the Virgin Mary is the exemplar and model.

17. In the course of that pilgrimage of faith which was his life, Joseph, like Mary, remained faithful to God's



call until the end. While Mary's life was the bringing to fullness of that fiat first spoken at the Annunciation, at the moment of Joseph's own "annunciation" he said nothing; instead he simply "did as the angel of the Lord commanded him" (Mt 1:24). And this first "doing" became the beginning of "Joseph's way." The Gospels do not record any word ever spoken by Joseph along that way. But the silence of Joseph has its own special eloquence, for thanks to that silence we can understand the truth of the Gospel's judgment that he was "a just man" (Mt 1:19).

One must come to understand this truth, for it contains one of the most important testimonies concerning man and his vocation. Through many generations the Church has read this testimony with ever greater attention and with deeper understanding, drawing, as it were, "what is new and what is old" (Mt 13:52) from the storehouse of the noble figure of Joseph.

31. Recalling that God wished to entrust the beginnings of our redemption to the faithful care of St. Joseph, she asks God to grant that she may faithfully cooperate in the work of salvation; that she may receive the same faithfulness and purity of heart that inspired Joseph in serving the Incarnate World; and that she may walk before God in the ways of holiness and justice, following Joseph's example and through his intercession.

Dear Parish Family of Our Lady of Mount Carmel - Saint Anthony of Padua,

As you know, I recently returned from a week-long pilgrimage to Rome. I, along with seven other Diocese of Youngstown seminarians, travelled with seminarians from the Diocese of Cleveland and the staff and faculty of the seminary.

The highlight of the trip of course was our meeting with the Holy Father, Pope Francis. In his message to us, he laid out three goals for all of us in ministry: listening, walking together, and witness. One thing he mentioned over and over again was the Italian word "tutti." He kept reinforcing *tutti* – reminding us to not only associate with those whom we agree with or love, but to minister to *all* of God's people. He reminded us, "walk with your flock: sometimes ahead to mark the way, sometimes in their midst to encourage them, sometimes behind, to accompany those who may be struggling." After his words to us, we were able to shake his hand and receive a rosary. A moment never to forget.

While that was of course the most unique part of our pilgrimage, it was not the only highlight. We toured a number of churches, the Vatican museums, the Sistine Chapel, the Colosseum and Roman Forum. We had many great meals which nourished us very well for the amount of walking we did each day. Seeing St. Peter's Basilica for the first time was breathtaking and surreal. An iconic place which had only been on TV and in postcards for me my whole life was now a reality before my eyes. Entering the basilica, I was brought to the famous Pieta statue, then the alcove containing the

brought to the famous Pieta statue, then the alcove containing the body of Saint Pope John Paul II. It was a lot to take in. Soon after, I went to the grotto where the body of St. Peter is, and a



stone's throw away – the body of the recently deceased Pope Benedict XVI. We toured other churches as well, including the gravesites of my middle name, Saint Justin, and St. Cecilia the patroness of musicians. I prayed before the tomb of St. Monica, mother of Saint Augustine, for my mom, grandma, Godmother and all



of the mothers of our parish. I even got to be the organist for our closing Mass at the Casa Santa Maria – another true blessing and unique experience.

He kept reinforcing tutti – reminding us to not only associate with those whom we agree with or love, but to minister to all of God's people.

This short letter will never be enough to describe all of the graces and blessings this trip brought to me, my brother seminarians, and to our seminary community. While it was a true gift to have been able to partake in this journey of a lifetime, nothing will ever take the place of our home here in Youngstown at our beautiful parish. I will be unpacking the fruits of this trip for weeks to come. In the meantime, know I kept each of you as my parish

family in my thoughts and intentions everywhere I went on this pilgrimage. Pope Francis also reassured each of us that he was praying for our individual families and parishes, too.

As I continue on this journey discerning my possible call to priesthood, I ask for your prayers as *tutti* – all of us – walk together towards our ultimate goal of heaven with God in the company of Saint Anthony and our Blessed Mother.


