

This past week went along at a rapid pace, but with many good things to tell.

On Tuesday, a group of about 12 gathered to hear about the Holy Land pilgrimage in October. Our scheduled presenter from Collette Travel, Mitch Mack, was under the weather so Dave Jones from Our Lady of Mt. Carmel navigated the slide presentation for us. The evening provided us with a good orientation of the pilgrimage. Mitch Mack, from Collette Travel, will be here on Tuesday, April 11 to register all who desire to sign up in person. I am looking forward to walking in the steps of Our Savior with all the pilgrims in October.

This past Saturday, Confirmation was conferred by Bishop Bonnar on our 23 young persons. They all were very prayerful and recollected for the Sacrament, together with their sponsors and families. Following the Mass, the Confirmandi gathered at St. Anthony Church (DeMarinis Hall) for a beautiful banquet catered by Avalon Downtown. Please keep them in your prayers. May the Holy Spirit remain alive in their hearts for the whole of life.

This Saturday and Sunday we marked the Solemnity of St. Joseph with the world famous Table of St. Joseph. I blessed the *sfingi di San Giuseppe* (St. Joseph Cream Puffs). The table is a sign of God's generosity through the powerful intercession of St. Joseph as the head of the Holy Family. We served 375 blessed cream puffs; a few extra calories that we will make up for during the Lenten Days ahead. I thank the committee's chairpersons Carol Rimedio Righetti and Cathy Zack for their outstanding leadership.

To top off the Solemnity of St. Joseph and Laetare Sunday (Be Joyful), the Mothers' of the Crucifix Bingo and Card Party was held at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel's Social Hall on Sunday. It was a record-breaking crowd with 240 persons attending. President, Cathy Zack and her committee were excelling. Thank you.

Also, the same afternoon, St. Anthony Church held their Spring Spaghetti Dinner with 534 dinners served. I heard from many about the wonderful Italian dinner and the most welcoming atmosphere. Thank you, Erich Kist, and all the volunteers. God's choicest blessings.

"There is No Limit to the Divine Mercy Offered to Everyone." Excerpts from Pope Francis' Angelus Address, April 6, 2014

Lazarus had already been dead four days, before Jesus arrived; and what he said to the sisters Martha and Mary is engraved forever in the memory of the Christian community. Jesus speaks like this: "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and whoever lives and believes in me shall never die" (Jn 11:25, 26). With this word of the Lord we believe that the life of whoever believes in Jesus and follows his Commandment after death will be transformed into new life, full and immortal. As Jesus is resurrected with his own body, though he does not return to an earthly life, so too will we be raised with our bodies which will have been transfigured into glorified bodies. He expects us with the Father, and by the power of the Holy Spirit, who raised him, he will also raise those who are united to him.

Jesus' act of raising Lazarus shows the extent to which the power of God's grace can go, and, thus, the extent of our conversion, our transformation. Listen carefully: there is no limit to the divine mercy offered to everyone! There is no limit to divine mercy which is offered to everyone! Remember this sentence. . . .The Lord is always ready to remove the tombstone of our sins, which keeping us apart from him, the light of the living.




Sealed With the Gift of the Holy Spirit

Salus Populi Romani

Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica was recently presented with a copy of this newly commissioned icon by Beri Berardi. This vision of *Salus Populi Romani* was written by Marek Czarnecki and includes Pope Liberius (left margin), who in 352AD laid the foundations of today's St. Mary Major Basilica in Rome, and Pope St. Gregory the Great (right margin) who first brought this image to St. Mary Major in 590AD, while the people of Rome were suffering from an ongoing plague.

On March 27, 2020, Pope Francis brought the original icon to St. Peter's Basilica as he, alone in St. Peter's Square, invoked the Mother of God for our health and well-being at the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic.

This Icon is dedicated to all fathers, living and deceased.

Add rinsed lentils and barley. Season with salt, pepper and crushed red pepper flakes (optional). Bring to a boil. Reduce heat. Cook for 25-30 minutes, until barley and lentils are soft. Sprinkle with cheese when serving.

Prayer Service at St. Columba Cathedral to Honor Legacy of St. Stanislaus Parish

Bishop Bonnar will lead prayer service on Sunday, April 2 at 1:00pm

The Most Rev. David J. Bonnar, Bishop of Youngstown, will lead a prayer service and program for the people who once belonged to St. Stanislaus Parish, Youngstown. The service will be in thanksgiving for the parish that served many

Polish families and others of the area from 1902 until it closed in 2021. The program will feature a short video history of the parish, a report on the parish archives, and will include the distribution of materials from the church - books, holy cards, memorial bricks, and devotional items, especially those that relate to the Polish culture that nurtured parish life for generations.

St. Stanislaus Parish was organized in 1902 when the Polish-speaking parishioners of St. Columba Parish had reached such a number that a Polish-speaking priest, Rev. Charles Ruszkowski, was appointed as administrator for them. They continued to meet in St. Columba Church until eighty families built their own church on Youngstown's South Side in 1904. As their numbers increased, they outgrew that structure and built the one presently on Williamson Avenue in 1925. The parish was active through the 20th century in honoring Polish cultural and religious traditions, and helping to resettle immigrants and refugees. Many in the community remember fondly their renowned weekly pierogi sales, which lasted for 40 years. Parish programming and Masses came to an end in 2020, and the church was formally closed in 2021.
