

BAPTISMS

RECONCILIATION/CONFESSIONS

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica every Saturday morning at 11am or by appointment.

FIRST RECONCILIATION AND FIRST COMMUNION

Children entering the second grade or older who were baptized as infants and have received two years of catechesis can celebrate their First Communion. Please contact Leanna Pipala at our Faith Formation Office for more information. If you are an adult wishing to receive your First Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

CONFIRMATION

Preparation takes place every other year for youth in the eighth and ninth grades. For more information please contact Leanna Pipala at our Faith Formation Office.

ADULT CONFIRMATION

If you are an adult baptized Catholic who never had the opportunity to receive your Confirmation, or if you have adolescents at home who are of age and have not yet received the Sacrament, please contact our parish office.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are planning to be married at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica or St. Anthony Church, please contact the parish office at least six months prior to your wedding date. If you and your spouse were married outside of the church, please contact the parish office about having your marriage validated.

Along the Way

Among the blessings of this past week was certainly our participation in the universal Church's celebration of the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. The 11am Sunday Mass was followed by solemn procession of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, with the Blessed Sacrament in the Monstrance. The faithful gathered in great number to adore Christ, really and truly present in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

The Unity of the Mystical Body

The unity of the Mystical Body: the Eucharist makes the Church. Those who receive the Eucharist are united more closely to Christ. Through it Christ unites them to all the

faithful in one Body - the Church. Communion renews, strengthens, and deepens this incorporation into the Church, already achieved BAPTIZED INTO ONE BODY, WHETHER by Baptism. In Baptism we have been called to form but one Body (see 1 Cor. 12:13). The Eucharist fulfills this call: "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it

not a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread" (1 Cor. 10:16-17).

If you are the Body and members of Christ, then it is your sacrament that is placed on the table of the Lord; it is your sacrament that you receive. To that which you are you respond "Amen" ("Yes, it is true!") and by responding to it you assent to it. For you hear the words, "the Body of Christ" and respond "Amen." Be then a member of the Body of Christ that your Amen may be true.¹

The Eucharist and the unity of Christians. Before the greatness of this mystery St. Augustine exclaims, "O sacrament of devotion! O sign of unity! O bond of charity!"² The more painful the experience of the divisions in the Church which break the common participation in the table of the Lord, the more urgent are our prayers to the Lord that the time of complete unity among all who believe in him may return.

August Special Election

A special election will take place in Ohio on August 8, 2023 to vote on Issue 1, which asks voters if Ohio should "Require that any proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Ohio receive the approval of at least 60 percent of eligible voters voting on the proposed amendment."

As our bishops remind us, "In the Catholic Tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation" (*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, No. 13). We urge you to register and vote in the upcoming election:

July 10: Deadline to Register to Vote or Update Voter Information.

July 11 – August 6: Absentee and Early In-Person Voting Tuesday, August 8th: ELECTION DAY

Please note: The bishops of Ohio do not have a position on Issue 1 in August, as it does not have direct moral content. The August election is different from the proposed November 2023 ballot initiative that would expand and enshrine abortion, which the Ohio bishops oppose, and other issues on which the bishops take a position. The Catholic Conference of Ohio is the official voice of the Catholic Church in Ohio on public policy,

advocating for the dignity of life at all stages, immigrants, Ohioans in need, and Catholic a education - www.ohiocathconf.org.



During the final twenty minutes, give everything over to the Lord. Give to Him every area of your life that you are concerned about, all your fears and worries, all the people you love. Give them to Jesus.
