

### **Sacrament Information**

#### BAPTISMS

Infant and child baptisms take place at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Basilica after the 11am Sunday Mass, and at St. Anthony of Padua after the 4pm Vigil Mass. Expectant parents are asked to attend a parent preparation class to help your family prepare for your child's baptism. Please call the Parish Office at 330-743-4144 to schedule the Baptism.

#### **RECONCILIATION/CONFESSIONS**

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica every Saturday morning at 11am or by appointment.

#### **FIRST RECONCILIATION AND FIRST COMMUNION**

Children entering the second grade or older who were baptized as infants and have received two years of catechesis can celebrate their First Communion. Please contact Leanna Pipala at our Faith Formation Office for more information. If you are an adult wishing to receive your First Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

#### **CONFIRMATION**

Preparation takes place every other year for youth in the eighth and ninth grades. For more information please contact Leanna Pipala at our Faith Formation Office.

#### **ADULT CONFIRMATION**

If you are an adult baptized Catholic who never had the opportunity to receive your Confirmation, or if you have adolescents at home who are of age and have not yet received the Sacrament, please contact our parish office.

#### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are planning to be married at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica or St. Anthony Church, please contact the parish office at least six months prior to your wedding date. If you and your spouse were married outside of the church, please contact the parish office about having your marriage validated.

#### **ANOINTING OF THE SICK**

If a member of your family is in the hospital or in a nursing home and is in need of either Anointing of the Sick or Communion, please call 330-743-4144.

## **Eucharistic Mini-Pilgrimage Guide**

L Go in peace! The journey you are making is under the eye of the LORD. Jupges 186



## **1. CHOOSE A PILGRIMAGE DESTINATION AND TIME FRAME**

WHERE: Choose a holy site that will help you grow closer to Jesus in the Eucharist. This could be a church, shrine, or monastery. See if your diocese has a list of local pilgrimage sites.

WHEN: Make sure the site will be open when you intend to arrive. Plan your journey around the celebration of the Mass or Eucharistic adoration.

**TRAVEL:** Decide how you will be traveling—walking, driving, by train, etc. Make arrangements beforehand so that you can be fully present to your pilgrimage experience.

WITH WHOM: Will you be traveling alone or with a community such as your family, parish, or youth group?

## 2. YOUR INTENTIONS FOR THE PILGRIMAGE

Pray for the special intentions that you and your loved ones have. You might also carry in your heart intentions for the Church, the world, or your local community. Be very specific and write them down. Jesus wants to bring healing, wholeness, and peace!

## **3. SPIRITUAL PREPARATION**

PRAYER: Invite family and friends to join you in prayer.

PATRON: Pick a patron saint for your pilgrimage as your heavenly companion for the journey.

## 4. SETTING OUT/TRAVELING TO YOUR DESTINATION

**PRAYER:** Make your pilgrimage a time of prayer and thanksgiving. Consider vocal prayers like the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet, or reading from Scripture: Mark 14:22-24, John 6:35, John 6:51-57, Acts 2:42, 1 Corinthians 10:16-17, 1 Corinthians 11:23-28.

## 5. ARRIVING AND PRAYING FOR YOUR INTENTIONS

As you come to the threshold of your pilgrimage destination, do so with the knowledge that Jesus is waiting to encounter you in the Eucharist.

**PRAYER:** Spend some time in silent adoration, thanking God for this pilgrimage and praying for your petitions. Pray individually and as a group.

LITURGY: If possible, participate in Mass, offering the Mass for your petitions.

## 6. RETURNING

**SHARING:** Spend some quality time before you leave or on the way home sharing the graces of your experience with one another. If you are traveling on your own, journal about these graces or share them with a friend.

## 7. POST-PILGRIMAGE

After your pilgrimage, pray about how the experience changed you. Ask Jesus to show you how he wants to be more present in your life through this pilgrimage.

If you carried the intentions of others, share something about what the pilgrimage meant for you with them.

Encounter with Jesus leads to mission. Make an act of service or kindness to share in the saving mission of Jesus.

A Eucharistic pilgrimage is a testimony to the world that Jesus is alive in the Eucharist, and he accompanies us—all of us—on our pilgrimage through life.

# OUR LADY of MOUNT CARMEL Triduum Prayers

#### **OPENING PRAYER**

O Immaculate Virgin Mother, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, you seek to implant faith and devotion in your people to the most Holy Trinity. Today as the Mother of Divine grace, open for us the treasure of heavenly mercy.

Look upon us your children with the benign eyes of your Motherly love. Show us your love for we need your help. As you have proven yourself to so many others, true Mother of mercy, so, be my Mother and hear my prayer as I invoke you with my whole heart.

#### TRIDUUM PRAYER

O Holy Mother, Queen of heaven and earth, daughter of our heavenly Father, Mother of the Divine Son, and spouse of the Most Holy Spirit, hear my petition which I so earnestly desire in conformity with the divine plan (*mention your petition*). I ask this of you, through your Immaculate Conception, your Divine Maternity, your many triumphant joys and your many triumphant sufferings. I ask this of you, through the loving heart of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, His bitter passion and death on a cross, His glorious resurrection and most holy name.

Gracious Lady - guiding star of humanity, Mother of every grace, in you I place my confidence, in you rests my hope. Take my prayer before the throne of the Almighty Father and obtain for me the request I desire.

Holy Mother render us worthy to venerate you. Give us virtue against the enemy. Pray for us, Our Lady of Mount Carmel. That we may be worthy of the promises of Christ.

#### **FIRST DAY**

Our Lady of Mount Carmel, we are awed by your divine motherhood. Our God so loved us that He gave us His only Son, and His only Son, gave us not only His very life, but His Mother to be our mother. Unworthy as I am in your sight, O Holy Mother, I trust in you and invoke you. I believe that those who honor you in life will enjoy lasting peace. Then hear my prayer and take up my cause. Amen. Hail Mary ... (3 times)

#### SECOND DAY

As we cannot turn our back to the cry of our children so Holy Mother, you do not turn a deaf ear to our prayer. One glance from your eyes, one smile from your motherly face, and the Infant Jesus was secure in your love. Give to me this security so that I may endure the challenges of this life. Accompany me, Mother, with the strength of your silent perseverance and take my request before the Almighty Father. Secure in your protection and concern I am confident in my prayer. Amen. Hail Mary ... (3 times)

#### THIRD DAY: FLOWER OF CARMEL

O most beautiful flower of Mount Carmel, Fruitful Vine, Splendor of Heaven, Blessed Mother of the Son of God, Immaculate Virgin, assist me in this necessity. O Star of the Sea, help me, and show me herein you are my Mother. O Holy Mary, Mother of God, Queen of Heaven and Earth, I humbly beseech you from the bottom of my heart, to assist me in this necessity; There are none that can withstand your power. O show me herein you are my Mother.

O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to you. (3 times)

Holy Mother, I place this request in your hands. (3 times)

#### MEMORARE (PRAYED EACH DAY)

Remember O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to your protection, implored your help, or sought your intercession was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence I fly unto you, O Virgin of Virgins, my Mother. To you do I come, before you I kneel, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions but in your mercy hear and answer me. Amen.

#### THE SABBATINE PRIVILEGE

The Blessed Virgin of Mount Carmel has promised to save those who wear the scapular from the fires of hell; she will also shorten their stay in purgatory if they should pass from this world still owing some debt of punishment.

This promise is found in a bull of Pope John XXII. The Blessed Virgin appeared to him and, speaking of those who wear the Brown Scapular, said, "I, the Mother of Grace, shall descend on the Saturday after their death and whomsoever I shall find in purgatory I shall free so that I may lead them to the holy mountain of life everlasting."

The Blessed Virgin assigned certain conditions that must be fulfilled:

1. Wear the Brown Scapular continuously.

2. Observe chastity according to one's state of life (married/ single).

3. Recite daily the little office of the Blessed Virgin or observe the fasts of the Church together with abstaining meat on Wednesday and Saturdays, or with permission of a priest say five decades of Our Lady's Most Holy Rosary, or with permission of a priest substitute some other good work.

A special election will take place in Ohio on August 8, 2023 to vote on Issue 1, which asks voters if Ohio should "Require that any proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Ohio receive the approval of at least 60 percent of eligible voters voting on the proposed amendment."



#### July 11 – August 6: Absentee and Early In-Person Voting

#### Tuesday, August 8th: ELECTION DAY

**Please note:** The bishops of Ohio do not have a position on Issue 1 in August, as it does not have direct moral content. The August election is different from the proposed November 2023 ballot initiative that would expand and enshrine abortion, which the Ohio bishops oppose, and other issues on which the bishops take a position. The Catholic Conference of Ohio is the official voice of the Catholic Church in Ohio on public policy,




