

RECONCILIATION/CONFESSIONS

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica every Saturday morning at 11am or by appointment.

FIRST RECONCILIATION AND FIRST COMMUNION

Children entering the second grade or older who were baptized as infants and have received two years of catechesis can celebrate their First Communion. Please contact Leanna Pipala at our Faith Formation Office for more information. If you are an adult wishing to receive your First Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

CONFIRMATION

Preparation takes place every other year for youth in the eighth and ninth grades. For more information please contact Leanna Pipala at our Faith Formation Office.

ADULT CONFIRMATION

If you are an adult baptized Catholic who never had the opportunity to receive your Confirmation, or if you have adolescents at home who are of age and have not yet received the Sacrament, please contact our parish office.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are planning to be married at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica or St. Anthony Church, please contact the parish office at least six months prior to your wedding date. If you and your spouse were married outside of the church, please contact the parish office about having your marriage validated.

American Eucharistic Witness: Sacrifice and the Testimony of Francis Cardinal George (Part 1)

Growing up in Chicago, Francis E. George was drawn to the priesthood from as early as five years old. In fact, it was a common occurrence in the George home that young "Frannie," as Cardinal George was called then, would playact the Mass with his sister, Margaret. But after they almost set the house on fire, they were forbidden from using candles. Cardinal George's earlier interest shifted to a tug at his heart toward a vocation to the priesthood after receiving his First Holy Communion on May 6, 1945. Almost four decades after his 1963 ordination . . . George wrote about its great impact. "Each time the Eucharist is celebrated," he wrote, "the universe changes. It is for the world to catch up to these changes and for the Church to be Christ's instru-



ment in effecting them." . . . Each of us has the opportunity to change the world in our own embodiment of the Eucharistic mystery.

GLORIFYING THE LORD AS LIVING SACRIFICES

. . . [Cardinal George's] life illustrates time and again that suffering has a purpose and is transformative when it is joined to Christ's in the Eucharist. . . . Through his wisdom and witness, Cardinal George regularly articulated how our call to glorify Christ has sacrifice as a constitutive element. He once wrote that we "need to become ever clearer and more intentional about how we are to witness to the Lord and give him glory through the offering of our lives, the joining of our self-sacrifice to his." . . . George taught and showed us this, firstly, because he lived this way.

It began when—at age thirteen, after polio struck—his life's ambition seemed to hang in the balance. He learned that the disability that resulted from the virus meant he would not be ordained a priest in his home Chicago archdiocese. The effects of the polio dogged him for the rest of his life. But he regarded it as a gift in the end, for it taught him how to live like Christ: not just a unity in his suffering but also an enablement to make an offering of his life for the good of others. While in the hospital for months as a teenager, as Margaret recalled, "Frannie" would occasionally fall silent and be found looking up at the Cross. He was learning then, as ought we all, that our lives should be an oblation that finds meaning through the hope in Christ and his sacrifice. This was where he learned to give himself away for others.

Sacrament of Confirmation for Adults


Sunday, November 19, 2023 4:00 pm St. Columba Cathedral

The celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation for adults will be held on Sunday, November 19, at 4:00pm at St. Columba Cathedral. This is a special opportunity for anyone (age 18 or older) who has not received the sacrament to join with other adults in the diocese.

Candidates must register with our parish and be eligible to receive the sacrament by verifying baptism and marital status. A preparation program will be held at our parish. Sponsors must be baptized, confirmed, practicing Catholic and may not be the candidate's parent.

IMPORTANT PARKING INSTRUCTIONS FOR SATURDAY ONLY

On Sat. July 29, the City of Youngstown will be hosting the YLive Concert outdoors at the Covelli Center in downtown. As a result, the South Ave and Market St. bridges will be closed to traffic from 6:30pm to Midnight. It is important that all parishioners are aware of these traffic issues and also are asked to act as ambassadors to inform friends and family who will be attending the festival. It is suggested that those intending to enjoy the festival from the South areas of the county, should arrive before 6pm. Alternatively, the best traffic routes to the festival will be the following:

From the West: Use 680 Expressway to the Madison Ave Expressway using the Eastbound exit at Wick Ave/Andrews Ave.

From the East/South: Use 680 Expressway to Rt 422 exits, using the Westbound exit at Wick Ave/Elm St. From Wick Ave, head south on Wick, turning east on Rayen Ave and follow festival parking signs.

Our Lady of Mt. Carmel has secured parking at the IBM/Commerce Building, Levinson Tire and YMCA parking lots, as we do each year exclusively for festival attendees. In order to ensure that only those attending the festival are parking in those areas, all cars entering those lots between 4-7pm on Saturday only, will be required to purchase festival gate tickets upon entering the lot for every person in the vehicle. Festival volunteers will be staffing the entry gates to these lots. This will ensure that those attending the festival are parking in the lots and will also make the gate entry process easier. As usual, shuttles and golf carts will take attendees from the lots to the gates.

THESE INSTRUCTIONS ONLY APPLY TO SATURDAY, JULY 20 FROM 4-7PM. We hope that downtown will be filled with visitors stopping by the festival before they head to the concert.
