

BAPTISMS

RECONCILIATION/CONFESSIONS

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica every Saturday morning at 11am or by appointment.

FIRST RECONCILIATION AND FIRST COMMUNION

Children entering the second grade or older who were baptized as infants and have received two years of catechesis can celebrate their First Communion. Please contact Leanna Pipala at our Faith Formation Office for more information. If you are an adult wishing to receive your First Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

CONFIRMATION

Preparation takes place every other year for youth in the eighth and ninth grades. For more information please contact Leanna Pipala at our Faith Formation Office.

ADULT CONFIRMATION

If you are an adult baptized Catholic who never had the opportunity to receive your Confirmation, or if you have adolescents at home who are of age and have not yet received the Sacrament, please contact our parish office.

If you are planning to be married at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica or St. Anthony Church, please contact the parish office at least six months prior to your wedding date. American Eucharistic Witness: Sacrifice and the Testimony of Francis Cardinal George (Part 2)

. . . After pursuing seminary studies with the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, a missionary congregation of French origin, George would go on to be a leader in the congregation. As such, he was an agent for reform and renewal, and he led his brothers and those they served closer to Christ.

THE LEGACY OF CARDINAL FRANCIS GEORGE

Later in life, amid the busyness of his office as Archbishop in Chicago and many other extra positions he held, including vice president and president of the U.S. bishops' conference, George faced a new set of sufferings as the result of bladder cancer. "The privileged way of giving glory to Christ in the



Church is to suffer martyrdom," he wrote on the occasion of his tenth anniversary as Chicago's archbishop in 2007. "Not yet called to bloody martyrdom, we... need to become ever clearer and more intentional about how we are to witness to the Lord and give him glory through the offering of our lives, the joining of our self-sacrifice to his." Through every imaginable difficulty, Cardinal George truly persevered in giving witness to the Lord through the offering of his life.

When asked about his legacy at the end of his time as archbishop, George diverted the question back to Christ. "At some point, Christ will question me: 'What have you done with my people? Are they holier because of your ministry? Are they more generous? More loving toward others?' In short, you are my legacy." . . . Through pain, suffering, and sacrifice, he persevered and made an offering of his life for others. This is Eucharistic living.

Cardinal George once observed that "no matter what the world thinks of us, no matter how our position in society might shift, we are at the center of God's plan for the whole world. And what we do in celebrating the Eucharist is the most important thing that happens in this world." He added, "Every time the Mass is celebrated the center of the universe is on this altar, and that's what keeps us all going." That's certainly what keept him going. That's what enabled him to live as he once taught: "The only thing we take with us when we die is what we have given away." That's what shaped, defined, and gave meaning to his life. That's what made him a man of pastoral availability, who poured out his life in service to Christ and the Church.



well as any new student beginning their Catholic School experience this fall. The LEAST any child can receive is \$650 for an elementary student and \$950 for a high school student.





At the end of February the Catholic Bishops of Ohio jointly issued a letter in which they warn Catholics and all people of good will that "In Ohio, the dignity of life in its earliest stages is threatened by groups proposing an amendment to Ohio's Constitution for the November 2023 ballot that would enshrine and expand abortion at the expense of protections for preborn children and women" and they encourage us to vote against this amendment.

In the meantime, another amendment to the Ohio Constitution is being proposed in a special election on August 8: Issue One, which would "require that any proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Ohio receive the approval of at least 60 percent of eligible voters voting on the proposed amendment." Our Ohio Catholic Bishops have taken a neutral stance on Issue One on the August ballot since it does not have any direct moral content.

To summarize, while the Catholic Bishops of Ohio are encouraging us to vote NO on the abortion amendment on the November ballot (remember, "NO" in NOvember), they are not taking a position one way or another on Issue One on the upcoming August ballot.
