

BAPTISMS

RECONCILIATION/CONFESSIONS

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica every Saturday morning at 11am or by appointment.

FIRST RECONCILIATION AND FIRST COMMUNION

Children entering the second grade or older who were baptized as infants and have received two years of catechesis can celebrate their First Communion. Please contact Leanna Pipala at our Faith Formation Office for more information. If you are an adult wishing to receive your First Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

CONFIRMATION

Preparation takes place every other year for youth in the eighth and ninth grades. For more information please contact Leanna Pipala at our Faith Formation Office.

ADULT CONFIRMATION

If you are an adult baptized Catholic who never had the opportunity to receive your Confirmation, or if you have adolescents at home who are of age and have not yet received the Sacrament, please contact our parish office.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are planning to be married at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica or St. Anthony Church, please contact the parish office at least six months prior to your wedding date. If you and your spouse were married outside of the church, please contact the parish office about having your marriage validated.

American Eucharistic Witnesses: A Priest for the Body of Christ–Venerable August Tolton (Part 1)

Born into slavery and baptized in northeast Missouri in 1854, Augustus Tolton's . . . father escaped to join the Union army after the Battle of Fort Sumter in 1861. A year later, . . . his mother Martha Jane . . . courageously made her own escape from slavery. Carrying a twenty-month-old baby girl in her arms, and with her two sons Charles and Augustus by her side, she plunged into the night towards freedom.



They made their way to the North. . . [where] Martha Jane settled with her three children in Quincy in a section of the small town where former slaves had taken refuge. . . In Illinois, . . . Blacks were permitted to attend church with whites only if they remained in the sequestered part of the church reserved for them, and when she attempted to enroll her children in the Catholic school, the white parents threatened the priest in opposition. In the end, the Tolton children were tutored privately by the School Sisters of Notre Dame.

A CHALLENGING ROAD TO THE PRIESTHOOD

Love for the Eucharist marked these young years of Augustus' life. . . . He was spiritually mentored by courageous parish priests, often serving at Mass as an altar boy, and he frequently could be found praying alone before the tabernacle in his parish church. . . . His parish priests . . . tried for nearly eight years to get him into an American seminary. Tolton was rejected by every one of them because he was black. Undaunted, the priests continued to help him. . . .

Finally, in 1878, the Franciscan College in Quincy accepted Augustus as a special student, and, two years later, the friars succeeded in getting him enrolled at the college seminary of the Propaganda Fide in Rome to be prepared as a missionary for Africa. During his studies for the priesthood, Tolton learned to speak fluent German, Italian, Latin, and Greek. He also studied various African dialects. Already known for his beautiful voice, the young seminarian became an accomplished musician. For the first time in his life, Augustus experienced racial harmony as well as the acceptance and love of the Catholic Church.

On Holy Saturday at St. John Lateran Basilica in Rome, April 24, 1886, Augustus Tolton was finally ordained a priest, celebrating his first public Mass inside St. Peter's Basilica on Easter Sunday. He was thirty-one. . . . Assuming he would be sent to Africa, it came as a surprise to Tolton when the Cardinal in charge of the Propaganda Fide told him that he was being sent back to the United States to his home diocese. Cardinal Giovanni Simeoni spoke frankly and sincerely to the new priest: "America needs Negro priests... America has been called the most enlightened nation; we will see now whether it deserves that honor." The Cardinal Prefect continued, "If the United States has never seen a black priest, it must see one now."



The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (soon to be OCIA)

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process for adults who desire to join the Catholic faith and for those seeking more information on the Catholic Church. RCIA can also be a method for Catholics to complete their reception of the initiation sacraments. The rite is designed for adults "who after hearing the mystery of Christ proclaimed, consciously and freely seek the living God." "By God's help they will be strengthened spiritually during their preparation and at the proper time receive the sacraments fruitfully."

WHO IS RCIA FOR?

- Non-Catholics who want to find out more about the Catholic Faith
- Those who want to join the Catholic Church through Baptism, or Profession of Faith
- Those who were baptized Catholic as infants but never received religious education, Confirmation, or First Eucharist.



WHERE DOES IT SAY THAT?



THIS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT...

THREATENS PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using "individual" instead of adult or woman, anyone under the age of 18 could have an abortion or make any other reproductive decision without their parents' consent or notification.

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Current Ohio laws* require abortion providers to explain procedure risks and ensure access to hospital transfer if needed. These health and safety standards could be seen as a "burden" and be eliminated, making it even less safe for women seeking an abortion.

ALLOWS ABORTIONS THROUGH 9 MONTHS OF PREGNANCY

In U.S. law,** "health" includes age or physical, emotional, or psychological well-being. This means a woman's age or emotional health could be cited to justify aborting a full-term baby. An abortionproviding physician would decide when a baby could survive outside the womb, leaving no clear protections for preborn children.

IS MISLEADING

Referring to "miscarriage care" promotes a myth that a "right to abortion" is necessary to preserve care for miscarriages and ectopic pregnancies. This is false. Catholic hospitals have always provided comprehensive miscarriage care and will continue to do so regardless of the outcome of this vote.

ARTICLE I, SECTION 22

The Right to Reproductive Freedom with Protections for Health and Safety

- Every individual has a right to make and carry out one's own reproductive decisions, including but not limited to decisions on contraception, fertility treatment, continuing one's own pregnancy, miscarriage care, and abortion.
- 2. The State shall not, directly or indirectly, burden, penalize, prohibit, interfere with, or discriminate against either an individual's voluntary exercise of this right or a person or entity that assists an individual exercising this right, unless the State demonstrates that it is using the least restrictive means to advance the individual's health in accordance with widely accepted and evidence-based standards of care.
- 3. However, abortion may be prohibited after fetal viability. But in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant patient's life or health.
- 4. As used in this Section, "Fetal viability" means "the point in a pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician, the fetus has a significant likelihood of survival outside the uterus with reasonable measures. This is determined on a case-by-case basis"; and "State" includes any governmental entity and political subdivision.
- 5. This Section is self-executing.
