Preparation takes place every other year for youth in the eighth and ninth grades, with the next year being 2024-2025.

Along the WAY

Several persons have approached me regarding the beautification in progress to our lot on the corner of Watt Street and Wood Street. I am happy to give you some information at this time regarding this beautification project.

The lot will become a garden, which will surround a bronze statue of Our Lord Jesus sitting at a table. The chalice and paten are on the table before him, and twelve open seats are placed at the table, in honor of the twelve apostles.

The sculptor of our Eucharistic Lord, chalice and paten, is the internationally renowned Timothy P. Schmalz. He is a Canadian and devoted to the spread of our Catholic faith. His sacred art is displayed even at the Vatican. Within the City of Youngstown, you will find six other statues by the sculptor: *Homeless Jesus* (St. Columba Cathedral), *When I Was Sick* (St. Elizabeth Hospital), *When I Was Hungry* (First Presbyterian Church), *When I Was Naked* (St. John's Episcopal Church), *When I Was a Stranger* (Central YMCA), and *When I Was Imprisoned* (United Methodist). One very moving sculpture that Schmalz has done is *I Absolve Y ou*, which depicts St. Padre Pio hearing confessions. Among these many sculptures is *The Last Supper*, which you find in our garden.

This project began with a family from the parish wanted to do something special for the parish in gratitude for blessings received. I have been working with Phillip Pillin, Professor of Theology at Walsh University, and Angel and Joe from A & O Construction. With their help, the altar/table was designed of poured concrete and proportioned to best fit the lot area. We shall add stones to define the space and appropriate lighting and shrubbery. Besides the original benefactor, three more benefactors have come forward to help with the expense. We are now in the season of Winter, but I hope to do a dedication as we look forward to the Spring season.

In this year of Eucharistic Revival for the Catholic Church in the United States, I think this is project is providential. The garden is located between the St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry and the St. Vincent de Paul Dining Hall. As we reach out to the needy, we are reminded that Jesus alone is the Bread of Life. A wonderful way to go, along the Way...





THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Bambinelli Sunday

You are invited to bring your Baby Jesus nativity figurine to Mass and have it blessed!

Saturday, December 16th & Sunday, December 17th

Following the 4PM Mass at St. Anthony Church and the 9AM & 11AM Masses at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica

This wonderful tradition originates in the papacy of Pope St. John Paul II and is celebrated when the children of Rome and their families fill St. Peter's Square on Gaudete Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent, for the blessing of the Gesu Bambino, the 'little baby Jesus.' On this day the children bring from home their Christ-child figures, their bambinelli, from their own family nativity scenes. Some will even bring the bambinelli of friends and neighbors unable to attend. Then, during the noontime Angelus address, the Holy Father invites all to hold up their bambinelli for a special blessing of the Christ-child figures, the children and their families. Upon returning home the figure is set safely out of sight for the remainder of Advent until happily placed in the creche with the arrival of Christmas. What a beautiful, tangible way to keep the anticipated coming of the Lord Jesus into our homes and hearts central to our holiday preparations.

Following the blessing, put your 'bambinello' in a gift box, wrapped, and placed in a place of honor to await Christmas. Let this be the first gift your family opens on Christmas as together you place the blessed Christ-child figure in the manger and welcome Christmas into your home.
