Along the WAY

This past week, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica hosted a Lenten talk by a well-known expert on the theology of religious exorcisms and demonology, Adam Blai. There was in attendance over 130 persons. In no uncertain terms, the speaker emphasized the teachings of the Catholic Church: Satan is real and his cohort of demons prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. He strongly warned the group about the dangers of dabbling with the occult, for example: involvement in wicca, fortune telling, ouiji boards, etc.

It is important to make use of the gifts that our Catholic faith gives us: Sunday Mass, frequent confession, having a Crucifix predominantly displayed in your home, and holy water. These are realities that the devil abhors because they are tremendous sources of grace, goodness, love, and forgiveness that comes from Christ Jesus, Our Lord.

Try to put into your daily prayer the *Prayer of St. Michael the Archangel* to defend you in your battle and your spiritual warfare against evil, hate, and the satanic. A good way to go, as we go along the Way...

The Catholic Faith: Our Best Defense Against the Demonic Summary notes from Adam Blai's talk

1. God is in charge - While the devil and demons exist, the devil's activity is not the center of the story. God is. Sometimes God allows us to be tempted by the devil to encourage us to mature in our faith.

2. Obedience to God's law protects us from the demonic - Disobedience to the First Commandment: *I am the LORD your God, you shall have no other gods before me,* is a common trait among possessed individuals. Seeking comfort, information and power (*my will be done*, rather than *Thy will be done*), people turn to the occult, breaking their friendship with God. Necromancy, the practice of communicating with the dead, while popular in our media, is one of the few practices cited as an abomination to the Lord in the Bible (cf. Deut. 18:12). No angel, saint, or soul in purgatory striving for eternal life with God, would participate in it.

3. Jesus' authority has been given to his apostles and the Catholic Church. Following Pentecost, the apostles received staggering authority over unclean spirits. This authority has been passed on to the Bishops. Regular participation in the Sacrament of Confession stops demonic problems before they set in; the Sacrament closes doors before they are opened wide, and restores our true relationship with God. In the Eucharist, Jesus makes himself present to us, giving us everything we need.


