

FIRST RECONCILIATION AND FIRST COMMUNION

Children entering the second grade or older who were baptized as infants and have received two years of catechesis can celebrate their First Communion. Please contact Leanna Pipala at our Faith Formation Office for more information.

CONFIRMATION

Preparation takes place every other year for youth in the eighth and ninth grades, with the next year being 2024-2025.

Adult Confirmation

If you are an adult baptized Catholic who never had the opportunity to receive your Confirmation, or if you have adolescents at home who are of age and have not yet received the Sacrament, please contact our parish office.

Along the WAY

On Tuesday during Holy Week, after the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral, I took Linguini to the veterinarian for him to go to sleep. Putting a pet to sleep so as not to prolong suffering is, of course, very different from how we morally treat a human who is the subject of prolonged suffering. We are not morally permitted to employ any means to actively take a human life. When one of our loved ones is nearing the end of their life and is suffering, we keep them as comfortable as possible, until God takes away the final breath.

However, as the Catechism teaches, it is contrary to human dignity to cause animals to suffer needlessly (CCC 2418). Linguini's diabetes made him totally deaf and nearly completely blind. He was running into walls and doors, and he became very confused. His body, after thirteen years and ten months, was marked with tumors, and his rear hips were gravely filled with arthritis. He was hurting and trying to tell me that it was time.

Putting Linguini to sleep took a matter of fifteen seconds and was very peaceful for him. I have buried his ashes in a respectful place behind our rectory. Though I shall miss him very much, I remain ever grateful for the very good dog that he was to me and to many others who cared for him. Linguini was a good and gentle, loving dog, and certainly his life was "a job well-done."

Thank you, Linguini, with love and may St. Francis take very good care of you! For some reason, thirteen years and ten months was all too short, but these things happen as we go Along the Way.

EUTHANASIA AND ASSISTED SUICIDE

51. There is a special case of human dignity violation that is . . . unique in how it utilizes a mistaken understanding of human dignity to turn the concept of dignity against life itself. This confusion is particularly evident today in discussions surrounding euthanasia. For example, laws permitting euthanasia or assisted suicide are sometimes called "death with dignity acts." With this, there is a widespread notion that euthanasia or assisted suicide is somehow consistent with respect for the dignity of the human person. However, in response to this, it must be strongly reiterated that suffering does not cause the sick to lose their dignity. . . . Instead, suffering can become an opportunity to strengthen the bonds of mutual belonging and gain greater awareness of the precious value of each person to the whole human family.

52. Certainly, the dignity of those who are critically or terminally ill calls for all suitable and necessary efforts to alleviate their suffering through appropriate palliative care and by avoiding aggressive treatments or disproportionate medical procedures. This approach corresponds with the "enduring responsibility to appreciate the needs of the sick person: care needs, pain relief, and affective and spiritual needs."^[94] However, an effort of this nature is entirely different from—and is indeed contrary to—a decision to end one's own life or that of another person who is burdened by suffering. Even in its sorrowful state, human life carries a dignity that must always be upheld, that can never be lost, and that calls for unconditional respect. Indeed, there are no circumstances under which human life would cease from being dignified and could, as a result, be put to an end. . . . [H]elping the suicidal person to take his or her own life is an objective offense against the dignity of the person asking for it, even if one would be thereby fulfilling the person's wish: "We must accompany people towards death, but not provoke death or facilitate any form of suicide. . ."

RESPECT FOR THE INTEGRITY OF CREATION

2415 The seventh commandment [You shall not steal] enjoins respect for the integrity of creation. Animals, like plants and inanimate beings, are by nature destined for the common good of past, present, and future humanity....

2416 *Animals* are God's creatures. He surrounds them with his providential care. By their mere existence they bless him and give him glory. Thus men owe them kindness. We should recall the gentleness with which saints like St. Francis of Assisi or St. Philip Neri treated animals.

2417 God entrusted animals to the stewardship of those whom he created in his own image. Hence it is legitimate to use animals for food and clothing. They may be domesticated to help man in his work and leisure....

2418 It is contrary to human dignity to cause animals to suffer or die needlessly. It is likely unworthy to spend money on them that should as a priority go to the relief of human misery. One can love animals; one should not direct to them the affection due only to persons.

Beautiful Light: A Paschal Mystagogy LIVE




