

ALONG THE WAY with MSGR. CARIGLIO 20TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME | AUGUST 18, 2024



Ten years ago, on May 13, 2014, His Holiness Pope Francis designated Our Lady of Mt. Carmel a Minor Basilica. It was a great honor to receive this designation as it recognized our historical value and the significant contribution Our Lady of Mt. Carmel has made in this community.

Along the Way, I decided as Rector of the Minor Basilica of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel to petition the Rector Cardinal Archpriest of St. Mary Major Basilica in Rome that we form a "spiritual bond" between the two Basilicas. The Papal Basilica

of St. Mary Major is the primary shrine in all the world dedicated to Mary, the Mother of God. The Cardinal, after studying the active nature of our Basilica in Youngstown, accepted my petition with open arms, on May 13, 2024.

This spiritual bond is a perfect way to spread true devotion to Mary as the Mother of God. As the first evangelizer, she brings all who are devoted to her closer to her Son, Jesus Savior of the World. And, in the words of St. Pope Paul VI, "We believe that the Holy Mother of God, the new Eve, Mother of the Church, continues to exercise her maternal role on behalf of the members of Christ" (CCC 975).

As a benefit resulting from this spiritual bond, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, grants to us from his Petrine Office, more opportunities for the Faithful to receive the privilege of a plenary indulgence, for ourselves or for a deceased loved one. "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church..." (CCC 1478). An indulgence is plenary as it removes all temporal punishment due to sin. Plenary indulgences help us to focus on always being prepared to meet Christ when we die so we can enter the fullness of Heaven without any delay.

CATHOLIC EDUCATION ASSISTANCE GRANTS

Scholarship grant applications are now available for the Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Catholic Education Assistance Fund. Applications may be picked up at the rectory during regular office hours. The Catholic Education Assistance Fund supports our parishioners who are sending their children to a Catholic school. Grants for Catholic elementary, high school, and college students is **\$500.00**. Applicants should complete the entire application and <u>hand-deliver it to the parish office</u> <u>by September 24, 2024.</u>

CONFIRMATION FOR ADULTS

The celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation for adults will be held on Sunday, November 24, 2024 at St. Columba Cathedral. This is a special opportunity for anyone age 18 or older to receive the sacrament. Please contact the Parish Office no later than **September 10** in order to register and verify eligibility to receive the Sacrament.

HOW DOES AN ADULT BECOME CATHOLIC?

There are two sides to becoming a Catholic as an adult – receiving instruction in the faith, and taking part in the services of a local Catholic community. A person can start with one or the other, but they will need to have completed sufficient instruction AND be attending regular services before they can become a full member of the Catholic Church.

Formal instruction in the faith generally begins in September and continues weekly through to June. Plenty of opportunities are given to discuss, study, and ask questions about the key teachings of the Catholic Church. This process is called the **Order of Christian Initiation of Adults**, or OCIA. It is available to:

- Non-Catholics who want to find out more about the Catholic Faith
- Those who want to join the Catholic Church through Baptism, or Profession of Faith
- Those who were baptized Catholic as infants but did not receive religious education, Confirmation, or First Communion.

Actually, anyone who wants to learn more about our Faith is welcome to join us, even those who are already Catholic.

EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL 20TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME | AUGUST 18, 2024



The National Eucharistic Congress, July 17-21, 2024

You could hear a pin drop. There were 60,000 people in Lucas Oil Stadium on Saturday evening who just moments earlier were fully caught up in the music of Matt Maher, a well-known contemporary Christian musician. But as soon as Jesus in the Eucharist was processed in the monstrance and took his place on the raised dais, there was a hushed and reverential silence. Those who were able knelt in adoration and all were fully attentive to the true star of the show.

There was a lot to take in during the 5 days of the Eucharistic Congress. I witnessed tens of thousands of Catholic men, women, and children all on fire with zeal for the Lord God of hosts. One of the goals that our bishops envisioned for this Eucharistic Congress is that seeds would be planted in those who attended who would go back to their parishes and let those seeds grow to renew the Church in America.

One of those seeds was planted in me on Thursday evening when Fr. Mike Schmitz, who is known for the highly rated Bible in a Year podcast, delivered his address. During his talk he told us that there can be no revival without repentance. Then he exhorted us to look into our own lives for areas that are in need of repentance, because even though we are all faithful and believing Catholics, it is possible for us to lose that love and fire for the Lord, to let it die down or even to let it be extinguished. And he challenged us to try to find what the fire extinguishers are in our lives, those things that slowly take away our burning love for the Lord that we all had at the beginning.

In the time since returning home I have continued to ponder that question. It is easy to grow complacent with the knowledge that I go to Mass every Sunday and assent to all the teachings of the Church. But I know that I am not yet the saint that God desires me to be. I take home from the Eucharistic Congress a renewed yearning to cut away the thorns choking God's grace in my life and to jettison those fire extinguishers I have lying around.



And for that, I am thankful for the experience and for Monsignor for his encouragement for us to go.



On Sunday, July 28, Bishop Bonnar publicly announced the affiliation that the Minor Basilica of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, Youngstown, now shares with the Papal Basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore (Saint Mary Major) in Rome.

St. Mary Major is the great pilgrimage church of the Eternal City dedicated to the honor of the Mother of God. Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica, Youngstown, is one of more than 300 Marian Shrines in the world that share this affiliation.

This affiliation allows us to share in St. Mary Major Basilica's spirituality, devotion to the Mother of God, prayers of intercession, and in particular, the precious grace of Indulgences granted by the Apostolic Penitentiary. The same spiritual benefits that one can obtain by making a traditional pilgrimage to St. Mary Major in Rome can now be obtained by making a pilgrimage to Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica, Youngstown.


