


PLENARY INDULGENCES

CATHOLIC EDUCATION ASSISTANCE GRANTS

Scholarship grant applications are now available for the Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Catholic Education Assistance Fund. Applications may be picked up at the rectory during regular office hours. The Catholic Education Assistance Fund supports our parishioners who are sending their children to a Catholic school. Grants for Catholic elementary, high school, and college students is \$500.00. Applicants should complete the entire application and hand-deliver it to the parish office by September 24, 2024.

CONFIRMATION FOR ADULTS

The celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation for adults will be held on Sunday, November 24, 2024 at St. Columba Cathedral. This is a special opportunity for anyone age 18 or older to receive the

sacrament. Please contact the Parish Office no later than **September 10** in order to register and verify eligibility to receive the Sacrament.

HOW DOES AN ADULT BECOME CATHOLIC?

There are two sides to becoming a Catholic as an adult – receiving instruction in the faith, and taking part in the services of a local Catholic community. A person can start with one or the other, but they will need to have completed sufficient instruction AND be attending regular services before they can become a full member of the Catholic Church.

Formal instruction in the faith generally begins in September and continues weekly through to June. Plenty of opportunities are given to discuss, study, and ask questions about the key teachings of the Catholic Church. This process is called the **Order of Christian Initiation of Adults**, or OCIA. It is available to:

- Non-Catholics who want to find out more about the Catholic Faith
- Those who want to join the Catholic Church through Baptism, or Profession of Faith
- Those who were baptized Catholic as infants but did not receive religious education, Confirmation, or First Communion.

Actually, anyone who wants to learn more about our Faith is welcome to join us, even those who are already Catholic.

The National Eucharistic Congress, July 17-21, 2024

God. . . What are you preparing me for? That was the first thought I had at 5am on Wednesday, July 17, the day I left Youngstown for the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. I knew that God was preparing me for something, I just didn't know what. By Saturday, July 20, I was no longer questioning what I was supposed to do for the Lord. To be honest, I knew that what God was asking of me really had nothing to do with me.

I accepted this journey to the Eucharistic Congress 4 months earlier, and God was ready to execute His plan. Only, His plan wasn't focused on ME, but on how He wanted to use me to share His love with another person in my life. God's plan was becoming clearer each day, and I was excited to leave the Eucharistic Congress, and get to work!

The Eucharistic Congress concluded with a call to everyone to evangelize, to **Walk With One** person, and bring them to Christ. In theory, if there were 60,000 people at the Eucharistic Congress, and each one of us went home to walk alongside even just ONE soul, how much God could accomplish through us!

The person that came to my mind loves the Lord. They even had a small prayer altar a long time ago where they would pray for souls. They loved St. Pope John Paul II. But life crept in, and things got clouded. During the Congress, it became clear to me that God wanted me to say to this person: "God loves you! He sees you've been hurting, and He misses the relationship that you once had, in the Eucharist! He wants you to come home! Back to the house you grew up in! Back into His Catholic Church!"

It was so clear, the message I am supposed to share. But, I must share it! The Eucharistic Congress was powerful, and extremely motivating. It has motivated me to get out there and intentionally walk with one soul, to bring them back into Communion with Him. God loves each of us, His sheep! And when one is lost, He sends His people to bring them back into His fold.

Who do you know who needs to hear the message of God's love? Is there even just one person that God is asking you to walk with? Walk With One.

As the National Eucharistic Congress concluded, the Catholic Church in the United States began the third year of Eucharistic Revival: The Year of Mission. This pillar encourages us to integrate our love for Christ into every aspect of our lives, transforming daily actions into continuous acts of worship and service. As we love Christ more, our lives become configured to his, reflecting his sacrificial love. When we live a Eucharistic life, we join in Christ's self-offering, allowing his love to flow through us to others.

Walk with One 中中中中

In the Scriptures, we hear over and over how Jesus invited people one by one to follow him. He also invites us to follow him more deeply and, just like him, to "walk with one" person to a new or renewed experience of God's love.

Evangelization typically happens in one-on-one moments that are not planned or scripted. As Pope Francis has noted, "Anyone who has truly experienced God's saving love does not need much time or lengthy training to go out and proclaim that love" (*Evangelii Gaudium*, no. 120).

You might be asking yourself: Where do I start? How might I invite someone to move forward in their faith? Here's a simple four-stage process of accompaniment that focuses on a "heart-to-heart" approach:

- 1. Identify someone in a spirit of humility
- 2. Intercede for that person in communion with the Holy Spirit
- 3. Connect in Eucharistic friendship
- 4. Invite that person on a path most suitable for him or her

The first two steps are detailed below:

STEP 1

Identify someone in a spirit of humility:

Prayerfully begin to discern whom God is calling you to accompany.

Before you begin the process of inviting someone into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ and the Catholic Church, spend time in prayer, inviting the Holy Spirit to guide you in this process. Ask the Holy Spirit to show you the person that he wants you to accompany. Consider going to Eucharistic adoration or committing to a period of silent prayer in a church to allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you.

STEP 2

Intercede for that person in communion with the Holy Spirit:

Pray for the grace to be able to accompany the person whom the Lord has laid on your heart.

Now that the Lord has identified a person whom you know, commit to pray for them for a specific period of time, asking God to open the opportunity for a conversation. Pray for any struggles the person might be facing with brokenness or sin, and for any obstacles that might impede this person from drawing closer to Jesus and exploring the Catholic faith more deeply. Consider offering a holy hour or a novena of prayer for that person.

Visit <u>www.eucharisticrevival.org/walk-with-one</u> for more information. The bottom line is this: if you can open your heart to speak about how Jesus has touched your life, your heart will touch the heart of whomever the Holy Spirit leads you to accompany.

By virtue of our Baptismal calling, the Lord is sending each of us to give witness to his saving love.





Visit from the International Pilgrim Virgin Statue

On the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary, Thursday, August 15, the International Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Our Lady of Fatima spent the day at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Basilica. Hundreds of people visited the Basilica to pray before this remarkable statue.

The statue was sculpted to reflect Our Lady's posture when she revealed herself to the three Fatima children in 1917. Since 1947, it has traveled the world to bring the graces of Fatima and Our Lady's message of hope, peace and salvation to millions of people. The statue reminds us that Our Lady really appeared to the children in Fatima for an important purpose: to seek our help in saving sinners. "God does not wish sinners to perish but rather that they be converted and live." The curator of the statue reminded us that the best way to save souls is to offer up, every day, the sacrifices that are demanded by the duties of the moment entrusted to us.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church on Devotion to the Blessed Virgin

"All generations will call me blessed": "The Church's devotion to the Blessed Virgin is intrinsic to Christian worship." (Luke 1:48; Paul VI, Marialis Cultus 56). The Church rightly honors "the Blessed Virgin with special devotion. From the most ancient times the Blessed Virgin has been honored with the title of 'Mother of God,' to whose protection the faithful fly in all their dangers and needs.... This very special devotion ... differs essentially from the adoration which is given to the incarnate Word and equally to the Father and the Holy Spirit, and greatly fosters this adoration." (Lumen Gentium 66). The liturgical feasts dedicated to the Mother of God and Marian prayer, such as the rosary, an "epitome of the whole Gospel," express this devotion to the Virgin Mary (Paul VI, Marialis Cultus 42; Sacrosanctum Concilium, 103). 
