

Thank God that as a team, we are winning the Victory of Christ, as we together go Along the Way.


PLENARY INDULGENCES

The National Eucharistic Congress, July 17-21, 2024

Sr. Teresina Rosa and Sr. Karen Marie Barile from the Oblate Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus were among the approximately 1,300 consecrated religious who journeyed to Indianapolis for the National Eucharistic Congress in July. Sr. Teresina shares her experience below:

I was very much impressed and overwhelmed by the presence of so many young people at the National Eucharistic Congress in July. I wish you could see how much love they had for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. They were engaged and very devoted.

Each evening, we gathered in Lucas Oil Stadium for a Holy Hour of Adoration. The Blessed Sacrament was placed in a very large monstrance, set in the center of this massive stadium. During these Holy Hours, the stadium was dark, except for the light shining on and radiating from the monstrance. It moved me very much to worship God during these Holy Hours with so many people.

It was also very memorable for me to participate in the Eucharistic Procession through the streets of Indianapolis, with so many people. The group that impressed me the most was the Spanish group. They possessed a joy, a holiness, and a connection to the Eucharist deep in their hearts that was evident.

The number of people that were there gave me hope for the future. I came home energized because I know that there are a lot of people praying, a lot of people who are in love with the Eucharist. Because of this, our Church is going to be strong, and the love of God is going to grow.

The Year of Mission

As the National Eucharistic Congress concluded, the Catholic Church in the United States began the third year of Eucharistic Revival: The Year of Mission. We will be drawn to compassionate service, living our call to be his hands and feet to our neighbors and bring his presence to the margins.

Walk with One ++++

Everyone can evangelize.

We are all called to evangelize, and the Holy Spirit equips us for this mission. The Lord is asking each of us to step out of our comfort zone and evangelize one-on-one with someone.

There is someone in your life *right now* whom Jesus longs to call to himself. He wants to spark a relationship with them and bless them with his sacraments. The *Walk with One* initiative is a simple four-stage process of accompaniment that can assist you in saying yes to being God's instrument in the life of another person.

- 1. Identify someone in a spirit of humility
- 2. Intercede for that person in communion with the Holy Spirit
- 3. Connect in Eucharistic friendship
- 4. Invite that person on a path most suitable for him or her

Imagine how our families, neighborhoods, and country will be transformed if every active Catholic answers this call!

STEP 3

Connect in Eucharistic friendship:

Look for ways to accompany the person you have prayed for, to build a deeper relationship, and to practice the art of empathetic listening.

Eucharistic friendship builds upon the dynamic that Jesus revealed in his relationships with the disciples and, above all, at the Last Supper—he takes bread, blesses it, breaks it, and gives it. It is important to take or receive what the other person has to share, to bless or lift it up in prayer, to let the Holy Spirit help break open an area for potential growth, and then to give of yourself in response. It is also important to recognize that this may not be a "one and done" conversation but is more likely to be a series of conversations and invitations, developing a real friendship with that person. Find an appropriate time to begin growing in your friendship, perhaps over coffee or lunch. Listen deeply for promptings from the Holy Spirit as you get to know your friend's joys and struggles. Share with them some of your own.

Listen respectfully when the conversation turns to spiritual matters, including their relationship with God and questions or concerns about the Church, and reserve judgment about their opinions. Some people might be ready to discuss the spiritual life after only a conversation or two, while for others it might take more time.

An evangelizing community knows that the Lord has taken the initiative, he has loved us first (cf. 1 Jn 4:19), and therefore we can move forward, boldly taking the initiative, go out to others, seek those who have fallen away, stand at the crossroads and welcome the outcast.
