

Buona Domenica!

I became familiar with the famous St. Anthony of Padua Novena when I was a faithful grade school altar server at Immaculate Conception Parish, Ravenna. The novena in Ravenna was nine straight weeks, on Tuesday, and I learned quickly that St. Anthony was a Saint you could depend on.

When I began serving as a priest here in Youngstown, years later, Fr. Palermo of St. Lucy Church, Campbell, invited me to do a Mass and Novena of St. Anthony one Tuesday evening. After the Mass he said to me, "I'll see you next week." Little did I realize that I was making a commitment of 13 straight Tuesdays. There went my golf game! But it turned out to be a wonderful blessing. In Ravenna, they cut corners by reducing the Novena to nine weeks. But in Youngstown, no corners are cut. It is 13 weeks, because he died a Saint on the 13th of June.

In 1986, when I became the Pastor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church, I soon learned that the people of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, and up in Brier Hill at St. Anthony's, had a fervent devotion to the 13 week Novena. It has become part of me. This year's 13 week Novena will begin this Tuesday, March 18, following the noon Mass at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Basilica, and at 6pm following a Liturgy of the Word with Communion at St. Anthony of Padua Church. We have advertised it on Facebook, in the Vindicator, in the mailing sent to your house, and in the bulletin.

Forty years ago, the elders of the parish were many in number and it was common behavior to faithfully attend Mass and the Novena of St. Anthony. Those elders now, we hope, are in the Kingdom of Heaven and that leaves this Unfailing Novena in our hands. I encourage you to consider being faithful to the 13 week Novena. Let it become part of your own personal prayer devotion. It will be a blessing for you in more ways that you could ever count. You will never regret it. It is truly something wonderful for us to do every year as we go Along the Way.

The Light Is On For You Celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation

God never, ever tires of forgiving us! The problem is that we ourselves tire; we do not want to ask; we grow weary of asking for forgiveness. Let us never tire...! [God] is the loving Father who always pardons, who has that heart of mercy for us all.

Pope Francis, Angelus Address, St. Peter's Square, March 17, 2013

What Is Reconciliation?

When we sin, we hurt ourselves by wounding our relationships with God and our neighbors. In the Sacrament of Reconciliation (also known as Confession or Penance), God offers us forgiveness of our sins, and we accept and receive God's forgiveness by sincerely expressing our sorrow, by acknowledging and making reparation for our sins, and by resolving to do better in the future.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation has four parts:


- Contrition: A sincere sorrow for having offended God, and the most important act of the person confessing. There can be no forgiveness of sin if we do not have sorrow and a firm resolve not to repeat our sin.
- Confession: Naming our sins aloud to the priest, who represents Christ and the Church.
- Penance: The prayers or sometimes, the good deeds the priest gives, for our healing and the healing of those we have hurt by our sins.
- Absolution: The words the priest speaks by which "God, the Father of mercies" reconciles us to himself through his death and resurrection.

Going to Confession



- 1. The priest gives a blessing or greeting.
- 2. Make the Sign of the Cross and say, "Bless me father, for I have sinned. My last confession was..." (give weeks, months, or years).
- 3. Confess all your sins to the priest. (If you are unsure or uneasy, tell him and ask for help.)
- 4. Say, "I am sorry for these and all my sins."
- 5. The priest gives a penance and offers advice to help you become a better Catholic.
- 6. Say an Act of Contrition, expressing your sorrow for your sins.
- 7. The priest, acting in the person of Christ, then absolves you from





Act of Contrition



My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In His name, my God, have mercy.

Examination of Conscience

Ask God to help you make a good confession. In quiet reflection ask yourself: Since my last confession...

- ◆ Did I pray to God, daily and from my heart?
- ◆ Did I live and witness to my Catholic faith, joyfully & courageously? Did I take God's name in vain? Did I curse anyone or make false oaths? Did I engage in superstitious or occult practices?
- ♦ Did I attend and participate actively at Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation? Did I fast & abstain on prescribed days?
- ◆ Did I respect people in authority? My employer? Did I honor my parents?
- ♦ Was I violent or unnecessarily aggressive (e.g. physically, verbally, psychologically, etc.) with anyone?

- ♦ Was I prideful, stubborn, or rude with anyone? Did I hold a grudge?
- ◆ Did I abuse alcohol, prescription medications, or illegal drugs? Did I overindulge in food?
- ◆ Did I consent to, recommend, advise, or actively take part in an abortion? Did I use abortifacient drugs?
- ◆ Did I view pornography, entertain lustful thoughts, conversations or actions?
- ♦ Was I unloving to my spouse? Did I engage in adulterous activity (e.g. sexual, emotional, virtual, etc.)? Did I use contraceptives?
- ♦ Was I neglectful or the spiritual,

- intellectual, emotional, physical needs of my spouse, children, or family?
- ◆ Did I steal or damage another person's property? Was I honest and just in my business relations? Did I waste time at
- ♦ Did I contribute to the needs of the spiritually and marginally poor with my time and resources?
- ◆ Did I engage in gossip? Did I lie? Did I speak poorly of others? Did I judge anyone unfairly?
- ♦ Did I envy anyone? Was I jealous of others or covet another's belongings?



CONFIRMATION






IN HONOR OF ST. JOSEPH


