VESTMENT COLORS

Violet White Black

Three options of vestments are made available for funeral Masses. **“Besides the color violet, the colors white or black may be used at funeral services and at other Offices and Masses for the Dead in the Dioceses of the United States of America”** (GIRM 346 e). In light of these options made available by the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, Our Lady of Mount Carmel Basilica makes available the options of violet (purple), white, or black (note: *black vestments available at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Basilica only*) vestments and veils for funeral services and Masses for the Dead. **Please coordinate the choice of violet, white, or black with the funeral director or pastor during planning.**

GENERAL INFORMATION

CHOOSING SACRED MUSIC

An important consideration in planning any liturgy is the choice of music. The use of music in the funeral rite provides a fitting way to aid in the worship to God while celebrating the sacred event of entrance into eternal life with Christ. Music for worship must be a medium of prayer, with words that express true Christian faith. As recommended in the document *Music in Catholic Worship* (Bishop's Committee on the Liturgy, 1972), liturgical, musical, and pastoral judgment must be considered.

Below are samples of appropriate music. Additional music is available and may be discussed prior to the funeral.

SAMPLE HYMNS**Entrance Hymn Samples:**

1. Requiem

It is preferred that the requiem chant be sung upon entrance into the church as this is the traditional chant

Offertory Hymn Samples:

1. Here I Am, Lord
2. Be Not Afraid
3. Prayer of Saint Francis

Communion Hymn Samples:

1. I Am The Bread of Life
2. Eye Has Not Seen
3. We Remember

Following the communion hymn, it is appropriate (though not required) for a hymn of thanksgiving/reflection to be sung prior to the final blessing.

Recessional Hymn Samples:

3. Sing With All The Saints in Glory

PLANNING THE MASS/LITURGY

The family and the pastor plan the Liturgy.

The family selects the readings from the Old and New Testament, Responsorial Psalm, Gospel Acclamation, and the Gospel. The readers should be Catholic, and should have previous experience as readers.

Family and friends may carry the gifts of bread, water, and wine in the Offertory Procession. They should be Catholic.

STIPEND

To the parish the Funeral Director will present a stipend of \$300. This includes the stipend for the priest and the organist/cantor.

FUNERAL POLICY GUIDELINES

The parish office is to be contacted at ... prior to the funeral. **Ordinarily, funerals are scheduled on Saturdays at 10:00am.**

THE PASTOR/RECTOR

The pastor is usually the principal celebrant. The pastor welcomes other priests to concelebrate.

FUNERAL PREPARATION MEETING

Please make arrangements through the main offices at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Basilica.

C-1 2 Maccabees 12:43-46

He acted in an excellent and noble way as he had the resurrection of the dead in view.

A reading from the second Book of Maccabees

Judas, the ruler of Israel, took up a collection among all his soldiers, amounting to two thousand silver drachmas, which he sent to Jerusalem to provide for an expiatory sacrifice. In doing this he acted in a very excellent and noble way, inasmuch as he had the resurrection of the dead in view; for if he were not expecting the fallen to rise again, it would have been useless and foolish to pray for them in death. But if he did this with a view to the splendid reward that awaits those who had gone to rest in godliness, it was a holy and pious thought. Thus he made atonement for the dead that they might be freed from this sin.

C-2 Job 19:1, 23-27a

I know that my Vindicator lives.

A reading from the book of Job

Job answered Bildad the Shuhite and said:

and that he will at last stand forth upon the dust;

C-10 Revelation 20:11-21:1
The dead were judged according to their deeds.

A reading from the Book of Revelation

I, John, saw a large white throne and the one who was sitting on it.

The earth and the sky fled from his presence

and there was no place for them.

I saw the dead, the great and the lowly, standing before the throne,

and scrolls were opened.

Then another scroll was opened, the book of life.

The dead were judged according to their deeds,

by what was written in the scrolls.

The sea gave up its dead;

then Death and Hades gave up their dead.

He will wipe every tear from their eyes,
and there shall be no more death or mourning, wailing or pain,

So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the Eleven and those with them, who were saying, "The Lord has truly been raised and appeared to Simon!"
