The Invitation of Lent

RETURN, REPENTANCE, RENEWAL, PREPARATION

Lent is a time of return, repentance, renewal and preparation. We stand in need of prayer, knowing full well our faults, challenges, strengths and hopes. As much as we must work on our individual hearts, Lent is also a time when we must stand and work on the heart of the community, calling our sisters and brothers to a change of life. How might we make a resolution to change something in the Christian community in which we live?

Return – Return to God’s people a portion of the material blessings we have received. Today as the Church of Youngstown we begin our Annual Diocesan Appeal. Every year as a Parish we are called to follow in the footsteps of the Good Samaritan and heed the call of Jesus to generously provide financial support for the care of one another through the efforts of Catholic Charities and other diocesan ministries. Our goal is \$85,000.00. Last year through your generosity we reached 67% of our goal. Thank you for helping us to be a vibrant and caring Church that responds to the needs of our brothers and sisters in need. I invite and encourage you once again to make a pledge to the Annual Diocesan Appeal. Appeal envelopes were sent to each household and are also located in the pews. Donations can also be made by scanning the QR Code on the front cover of today’s bulletin.

Repentance – Often Catholics seem to give the impression that they don’t look forward to going to confession in the same way they look forward to going to Communion. They look on Communion as a privilege and on going to confession as a duty to deal with their guilt. But confession is just not about guilt. It is also about God’s love and God’s mercy, the same love and mercy that we celebrate in the sacrament of the Eucharist. The Sacrament of Reconciliation (confession) is celebrated each Saturday. Please refer to the weekly schedule as to the times and places for the Sacrament of Confession.

Renewal – The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (#2181) states that the Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practices because of what happens at Sunday Eucharist. When we go to Mass on Sunday, we gather with the Christian community to hear the Word of God and to take part in the passion and resurrection of the Lord Jesus. Listening to the Word of God and sharing the life, death and resurrection of Christ in the community of believers are the basic elements of our faith. My life isn’t complete without regular contact with the Risen Christ and the Christian assembly isn’t complete without my presence. Obligation isn’t a popular word, but we are obligated to participate in Sunday Mass simply because of being Catholic. Neglecting Sunday Mass is simply inconsistent with what we profess to be.

Preparation – The Church’s formal laws of penance are relatively simple. From the age of fourteen, Catholics are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent including Good Friday. From age eighteen to fifty-nine they are also to fast (that is, eat only one full meal) on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Church does not call us to acts of penance because we must earn the mercy and forgiveness of God. God’s pardon is a gift. The Church calls us to acts of penance because it is important for us to remember that we are sinners, that we have misused God’s gifts for our own selfishness and that we are constantly in need of God’s mercy.

Q: Does Catholic Charities only serve people who are Catholic?

A: Catholic Charities doesn't serve people in need because of *their* faith. We serve people in need because of *ours*. We serve all people, regardless of faith or lack of faith, as our resources allow. A person does not have to be Catholic or referred by a Catholic Church or priest to receive help.

Q: What is the relationship between the Annual Diocesan Appeal and Catholic Charities?

A: Catholic Charities receives 60% of the funds raised through the Annual Diocesan Appeal for programs and services to those in need throughout our six-county diocese. The other 40% helps to pay for important diocesan ministries like Catholic schools; faith formation and lay ecclesial ministry; youth and young adult accompaniment; pro-life, marriage and family ministry; vocations; missionary discipleship; and more.

Q: I've heard of people calling Catholic Charities and not getting help. Does this really happen?

A: The practice of Catholic Charities has been to administer programs that address needs not being met elsewhere in the community. This means we do not have programs that address every need. We often refer people to other social service organizations who are better suited to help with particular needs. Additionally, demand for our assistance programs outweighs the resources available, so we are often forced to focus on the most vulnerable first. While we would love to help everyone who comes to us for help, it is not possible. We are charged with being good stewards of the gifts from the generous people of the Youngstown Diocese. We work very hard to ensure the dollars donated to us are used in an appropriate manner.

2025 Service Highlights

- Catholic Charities Regional Agency (CCRA) provided rent and security deposits to 442 clients, and utility assistance to 2,550 clients to stabilize their households.
- CCRA sheltered 72 persons fleeing domestic violence and 107 women and children who were homeless.
- CCRA was instrumental in opening a warming center for those experiencing homelessness during the cold weather, securing funding and partners in the community.
- CCRA was also instrumental in opening a medical respite unit (“Respite of Hope”) in a partnership with Mercy Health, Mercy Health Foundation Mahoning Valley, and Meridian Healthcare for homeless individuals leaving the hospital and needing recuperative care and housing referrals.
- CCRA partnered with United Way, Direction Home and Community Action (MYCAP) in response to a low income apartment building explosion. The agency was on the scene with the Red Cross the first night helping secure shelter, housing, medicine and essentials to displaced residents. CCRA continues to work with the partner agencies on long term housing solutions and basic needs for these displaced individuals.

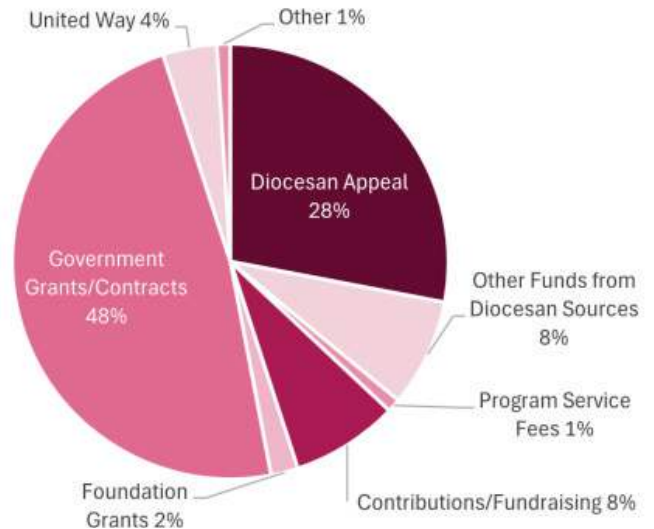

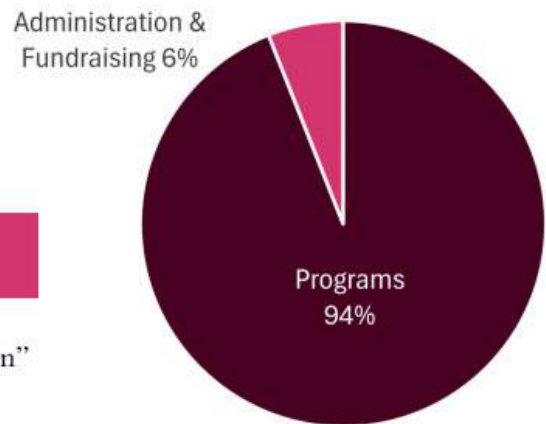

When do I...?

Fast and Abstain:

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday

Abstain:

All Fridays during Lent

Who has to...?

Catholics between the ages of 18 and 60 are obliged to fast

All Catholics 14 years and older are required to abstain

What is...?

Fast:

Eating one full meal, and two small meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Water anytime.

Abstinence:

Refrain from eating meat

Note: Persons that are physically or mentally ill, or are living with a chronic illness, and women who are pregnant or nursing are exempt from fasting.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION - WHAT DO I DO FOR A WHOLE HOUR?

One of the most common questions from parishioners about making an weekly Holy Hour is: "What do I do for a whole hour?" While "Pray, of course!" might be the anticipated response to this question, a good response consists of just one word: LISTEN. Listening, it seems, has become a lost art form in our culture. There are so many voices and so much noise competing for our attention that it makes it quite difficult to listen intently to anything. The Adoration Chapel is an ideal place to do just that.

Within the confines of the chapel, the "quiet" might seem a bit overwhelming at first. Be assured, with each visit, the "quiet" is transformed into God's Peace - so much so that you will long for that hour of peace with Christ in the Eucharist each week.

Prayer goes hand-in-hand with listening to God. While prayer can take on many forms during a weekly Holy Hour, four basic types of prayer can easily be remembered by the acronym: **A.C.T.S.**

ADORATION - Praise God. First, we come before Christ to adore Him and show Him reverence.

CONTRITION - Ask Forgiveness. We humbly apologize for our transgressions against Him and demonstrate deep sorrow for our sins.

THANKSGIVING - Be Grateful. We give Him thanks for all the blessings He has bestowed upon us.

SUPPLICATION - Seek Help. We ask God for those things we truly need.

Things to do during Eucharistic Adoration

Slowly read from Scripture until something "hits" you, then listen.

Pray a Rosary.

Let God look at you.

Tell God something that made you happy, then listen.

Tell Him what you are afraid of.

Tell God what angers you, then listen.

Speak to God about your loved ones.

Pray for an enemy.

Talk with Him about your work.

Sing a son for him in your heart.

Tell Him your failures and ask for help, then listen.

Count your blessings.

PARISH ENCOUNTER - FEBRUARY 22 - 25 - 6PM-8PM WITH THE SISTERS OF THE CHILDREN OF MARY



A Parish Encounter is a time for **personally and intimately encountering Jesus truly present among us under the appearance of bread**. It is a time to regain or strengthen the life of grace in our souls through the **Sacrament of Confession** and a time to be instructed in the beautiful truths of our faith and so to be motivated to build and/or strengthen our solid **daily** relationship with God in prayer.

The Children of Mary Community was founded in 2002 with the charism to quench the Thirst of Jesus to be loved in the Most Blessed Sacrament, as He revealed to St. Margaret Mary. They do this firstly with their own love: attending daily Mass and receiving Jesus with love in Holy Communion; daily adoration; and a life of prayer and apostolic work. The Sisters strive to make their lives a ceaseless act of love and to share the truths and beauty of the Faith with joy and simplicity.

The Sisters also quench His Thirst for love by spreading the great news that Jesus remains with us, substantially present in the Holy Eucharist, and encouraging others to return love for Love. Their external apostolates include Parish Encounters, retreat work, leading Holy Hours, teaching and praying with those in prisons, schools, nursing homes and the dying. They also make and distribute prayer cards and other materials to foster Eucharistic devotion.

Their Motherhouse is located in Newark, Ohio, and they have a Daughterhouse in Cincinnati. More information can be found at childrenofmary.net
