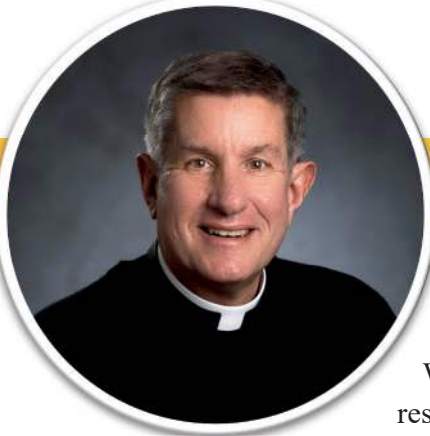

Peace be with you!

When Jesus said to his disciples “Peace be with you” following his resurrection he was doing more than offering a polite greeting. They were the first words of the resurrected Savior, a declaration of victory over death and a profound gift of wholeness, reconciliation and peace to a broken world.

Just like the disciples who were hiding behind locked doors, we live in a world with fear, fear of the unknown, financial instability, health crises or social unrest. When Jesus appeared, He offered peace that surpasses all understanding.

Jesus’ peace is not based on circumstances, but on His presence. It is a solid, unshakable peace that we can rely on when external pressures rise because He has already conquered the world.

The disciples had abandoned Jesus during His passion. They likely expected judgment or rebuke. Instead, Jesus offered them peace. This demonstrates that the resurrection is about restoration not condemnation.

We are called to use the greeting “Peace be with you” to mean I forgive you, I am ready to forgive, or I want to bring peace to this conflict. It challenges us to be peacemakers rather than peace-breakers in our relationships.

Immediately after offering peace, Jesus told his disciples, “As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” The peace we receive is not meant to be kept; it is meant to be shared. In a world ridden with division and violence, we are called to take this resurrection peace into the world as ambassadors of hope.

The resurrected Jesus’ peace is not a fleeting feeling; it is a profound reality that allows us to walk through life’s trails with confidence. It is a gift that transforms our fears into joy, our shame into forgiveness, and our daily life into a mission of reconciliation. Peace be with you. Those words were Jesus’ first words after the Resurrection and that wasn’t by accident. Christ doesn’t just want peace someday; he wants us to be agents of peace today.

DIVINE MERCY

SUNDAY

THE INFINITE LOVE OF THE RISEN CHRIST

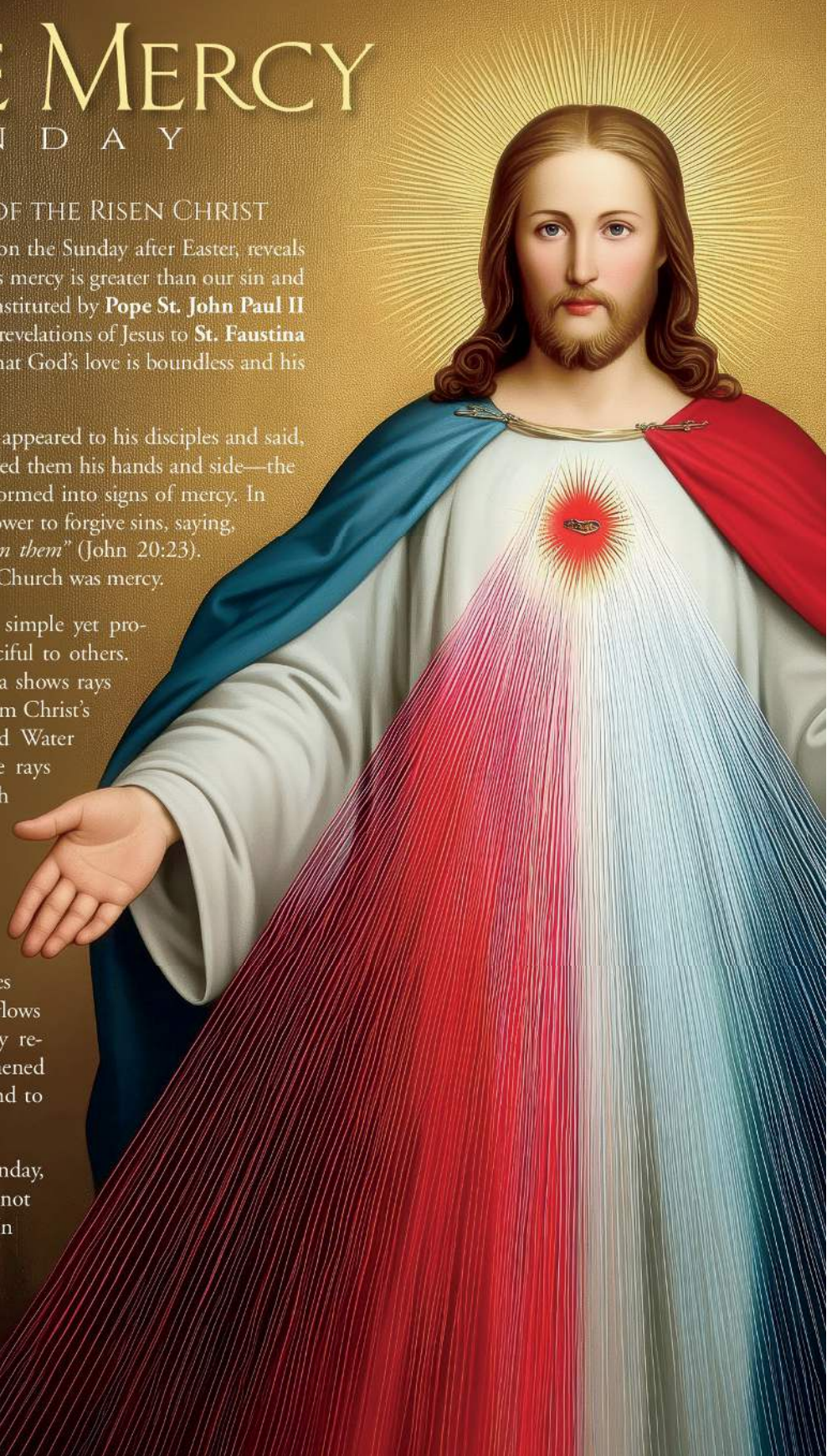
Divine Mercy Sunday, celebrated on the Sunday after Easter, reveals the heart of the Gospel: that God's mercy is greater than our sin and more powerful than our despair. Instituted by **Pope St. John Paul II** in 2000, this feast draws from the revelations of Jesus to **St. Faustina Kowalska**, reminding the world that God's love is boundless and his forgiveness ever new.

On that first Easter evening, Jesus appeared to his disciples and said, *"Peace be with you."* Then he showed them his hands and side—the wounds of his Passion now transformed into signs of mercy. In that moment, he gave them the power to forgive sins, saying, *"Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them"* (John 20:23). The Risen Christ's first gift to the Church was mercy.

The message of Divine Mercy is simple yet profound: trust in Jesus and be merciful to others. The image revealed to St. Faustina shows rays of red and pale light streaming from Christ's heart—symbols of the Blood and Water that flowed from his side. These rays represent the sacraments through which God's grace reaches us, bringing renewal and peace.

The feast of Divine Mercy invites us to turn to Christ with confidence, especially when we feel unworthy or lost. His mercy does not depend on our perfection but flows from His infinite compassion. By receiving his mercy, we are strengthened to share it—to forgive, to heal, and to love more deeply.

As we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, we are reminded that mercy is not merely a feeling but a way of life. In the face of every wound, Christ's mercy is the answer. In every darkness, his light still shines.
"Jesus, I trust in You."



ST. FAUSTINA
KOWALSKA:

APOSTLE OF DIVINE MERCY

St. Faustina Kowalska (1905–1938) was a Polish nun and mystic whose life and writings revealed the depths of God’s mercy. Born **Helena Kowalska** to a poor but devout family in Głogowiec, Poland, she entered the **Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy** at age 20. Her hidden life of prayer and service in the convent kitchen and garden became the setting for extraordinary mystical experiences.



Between 1931 and 1938, Jesus appeared to St. Faustina many times, entrusting to her the message of Divine Mercy for the world. He asked her to be his “secretary of mercy,” recording His words in what became the **Diary of St. Faustina**, a spiritual classic now read around the world.

In one vision, Jesus appeared clothed in white, with two rays—one red and one pale—shining from his heart. He asked her to have this image painted with the inscription: “Jesus, I trust in You.” He also revealed to her the **Chaplet of Divine Mercy**, a prayer for the salvation of souls and for the whole world.

St. Faustina died of tuberculosis at age 33 in Kraków, offering her sufferings for sinners and for the Church. Her message of trust and mercy spread rapidly after her death, leading to her canonization by **Pope St. John Paul II** on April 30, 2000, the same day Divine Mercy Sunday was formally established. Today she is honored as the **“Apostle of Divine Mercy,”** a witness that holiness can be found in humility, obedience, and complete trust in the love of Christ.

THE MESSAGE AND DEVOTION
OF DIVINE MERCY

The message of Divine Mercy is centered on one truth: **God’s mercy has no limits.** Jesus revealed to St. Faustina that his heart is an inexhaustible fountain of grace for those who trust in him. The devotion includes several key elements meant to help the faithful live and spread this message.

The **Image of Divine Mercy** depicts Jesus with two rays of light—pale for water, symbolizing Baptism and purity, and red for blood, symbolizing the Eucharist and life. The inscription, “*Jesus, I trust in You,*” is an invitation to place our confidence in His mercy.

The **Chaplet of Divine Mercy** is prayed on ordinary rosary beads and implores God’s mercy “on us and on the whole world.” The **Hour of Mercy**, observed at 3:00 p.m., recalls the time of Christ’s death on the cross. Through these prayers and acts of trust, Jesus promised great graces, especially the complete forgiveness of sins and remission of punishment, for those who approach him in faith, receive the sacraments worthily, and trust in his mercy on this feast.

THE HISTORY AND MEANING OF
THE DIVINE MERCY IMAGE

The **Image of Divine Mercy** was revealed by Jesus to **St. Faustina Kowalska** on February 22, 1931, in Płock, Poland. She saw Christ clothed in white, one hand raised in blessing and the other touching his heart, from which two rays—red and pale—shone forth.

Jesus told her, “*The two rays denote Blood and Water.*” The pale stands for Baptism, the red for the Eucharist. He asked that the image bear the words: “*Jesus, I trust in You.*”

The first painting was completed under St. Faustina’s direction by **Eugene Kazimierzowski** in 1934. Later, the version by **Adolf Hyla** became the most familiar throughout the world.

This image is more than art—it is a sign of mercy, calling all to trust in Christ’s love and to let his light renew the world.
