Present in the Mystery

Sometimes all a caregiver can do for someone who is suffering is just to be present. To know that there is someone there who cares makes the world of difference. It saves the sufferer from the feeling of being abandoned.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Blessed Trinity. Each day we begin and end our prayers with the words, “in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit,” reminding us of the promise that Jesus made to his disciples to trust in him and that He will be with us always.

This was the most important assurance he could give them. He did not promise a trouble-free life, or even success. The disciples knew that if Jesus was with them, they would have the courage and strength to face whatever difficulties lay ahead.

A sense of the presence of Jesus with us does not change the world for us, but it can give us the courage to face it. We do not ask God to change the world to make life easier for us. We ask him only to assure us that he will be with us as we face difficult situations.

Down the ages, the followers of Jesus have not always behaved as Christians should. There have been bitter quarrels among them. Yet despite the failings of his followers, the promise of Jesus, “I will be with you always to the very end of time” endures.

God is always with us. But we are not always with God. Our busy lives cause us to get disconnected from God. When we get disconnected from God an enormous loss occurs. God is with us as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. And when we are with God, we are also with one another.

To be in a relationship with God is to enter a relationship with all that God is and all that God does. Our union with God is a union of concern for all God has created. We are initiated into that union at baptism, and at that moment we no longer live for ourselves. We are joined with the believing community, we become the Body of Christ.

The mystery of the Trinity cannot be understood with the mind but only entered with an open heart. May we progress ever further into this mystery and be conformed ever more closely to Christ, who is our hope and our peace.



THREE-IN-ONE DEFINES US

Are Catholics Christian?

This is a great question to ask on Trinity Sunday because the answer has to do with the central belief of Christianity: the Trinity. Michael Gormley explains the answer to this question in this adapted transcript from one of his Ascension Presents videos.

The answer is yes, Catholics are Christians. But what does it mean to be a Christian? That's an interesting question. A lot of confusion comes in when you talk to people whose denominations don't have a liturgical tradition. For example, if you take charismatics or Pentecostals into a Catholic Church with the smells, bells, robes, statues, and all the rest, the Liturgy often puts people off. They might say, "This doesn't seem Christian; it seems like witchcraft." But if you take a

Lutheran, a Presbyterian, or an Anglican into the Catholic Mass, they're more likely to say, "Yeah, what's the big deal? It's liturgy."

So, what do we mean by "Christian"? First, people who call themselves Christian must believe in the Trinity. Jesus Christ—when he came in the fullness of time, "born of woman, born under the law" (Galatians 4:4)—says he revealed to us that he is the Son, and thus, he

revealed to us the Father. He promised us the Spirit of the Father and the Holy Spirit, which will reveal all things to us. The Trinity is uniquely Christian. Jesus fulfilled the Jewish monotheism but revealed the deeper hidden truth of the very nature of God as three Persons in one God. So all Christians have to believe in the Trinity.

Second, Christians must believe that the Word of God, the Second Person of the Trinity—God the Son—became flesh, took on a full human nature, and united it to his one Divine Personhood. He is fully human and fully divine. These are the basics of the Nicene Creed and the Apostles' Creed. We pray these prayers that Jesus is "God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God." You cannot be a Christian if you do not believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God who, at one point in time, took onto himself a full human nature. Some religions say Jesus is not God, but in Scripture, he tells us he is God, and we Christians—we Catholics—believe him. He is no "one-calorie cola." Jesus is God, the real "thing."

We acknowledge not only that God, in his innermost mystery, is not alone; he's a communion of Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, but also, the Second Person of the Trinity, the Son, entered into the human story. These are the things that true Christians believe.

Michael "Gomer" Gormley preaches the Gospel to pew-sitting and lapsed Catholics alike. He holds three degrees from the Franciscan University of Steubenville: a bachelor's in philosophy, a bachelor's in theology, and a master's in theology and Christian ministry. Michael has worked in parish and youth ministry for decades. He co-hosts *Every Knee Shall Bow*, a seasonal podcast on Catholic evangelization, with Dave VanVickle.

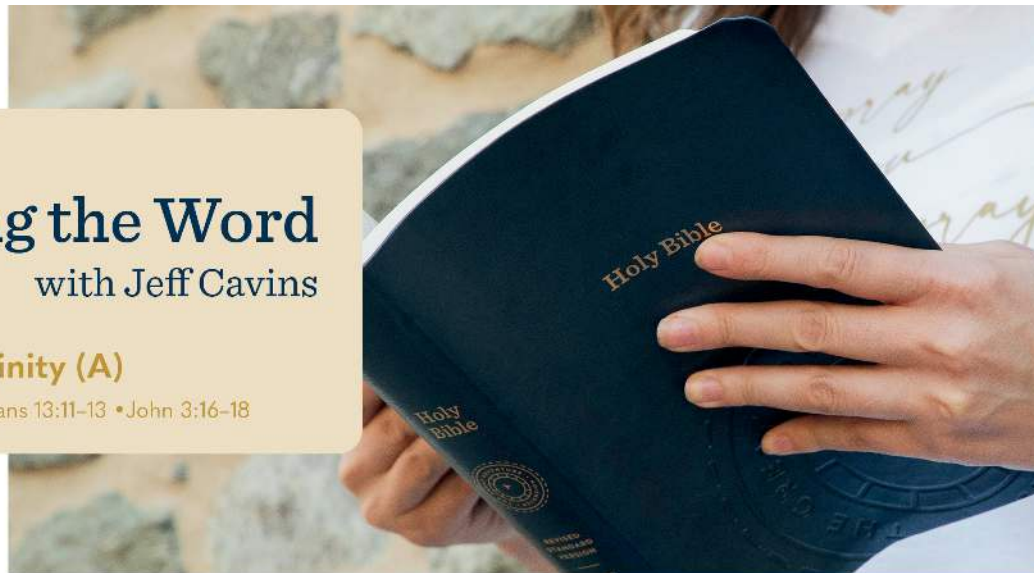

Most Holy Trinity (A)

Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9 • 2 Corinthians 13:11-13 • John 3:16-18



Caught Up in the Divine Life

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity invites us to contemplate not a problem to be solved, but a mystery to be entered. At the heart of our Faith is the revelation that God is a communion. He is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, one God in three Persons, united in an eternal exchange of love. From the very beginning of Scripture, this mystery is hinted at when God speaks of himself in the plural, revealing that relationship and communion are written into his very being.

The story of salvation unfolds from this truth. God creates out of love, not out of loneliness or need. The Father eternally loves the Son, the Son eternally loves the Father, and the love between them is the Holy Spirit. This perfect communion lacked nothing, yet God freely chose to create humanity so that we might share in his own divine life. This is the deeper meaning behind the familiar words of John's Gospel: "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son." The gift of the Son is about adoption into the very life of God.

St. Paul's blessing reminds us that this Trinitarian life is not distant or abstract. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit are offered to us here and now. Through baptism, we are drawn into this divine communion and made sons and daughters in the Son. Through the Holy Spirit, we are given access to the love of the Father. Our destiny is nothing less than participation in the life of the Trinity forever.

To believe in the Trinity, then, is to believe that love is the ultimate reality, and that we were created for communion. Life is about learning to receive and live from the love that already surrounds us, not striving to earn God's favor. The mystery of the Trinity reveals who God is, and it reveals who we are called to become: a people drawn into divine love, now and for all eternity.

Living the Gospel

This week, allow the mystery of the Trinity to shape your prayer and your relationships. Begin and end each day slowly making the Sign of the Cross, consciously placing yourself before the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Let it become more than a habit and instead a daily act of surrender into God's life.

Attend Mass this week with an intentional awareness that you are being drawn into the Trinitarian mystery. Through Christ, in the Holy Spirit, you are offered access to the Father. Receive the Eucharist as a foretaste of the eternal communion for which you were created.

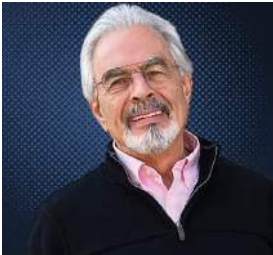
