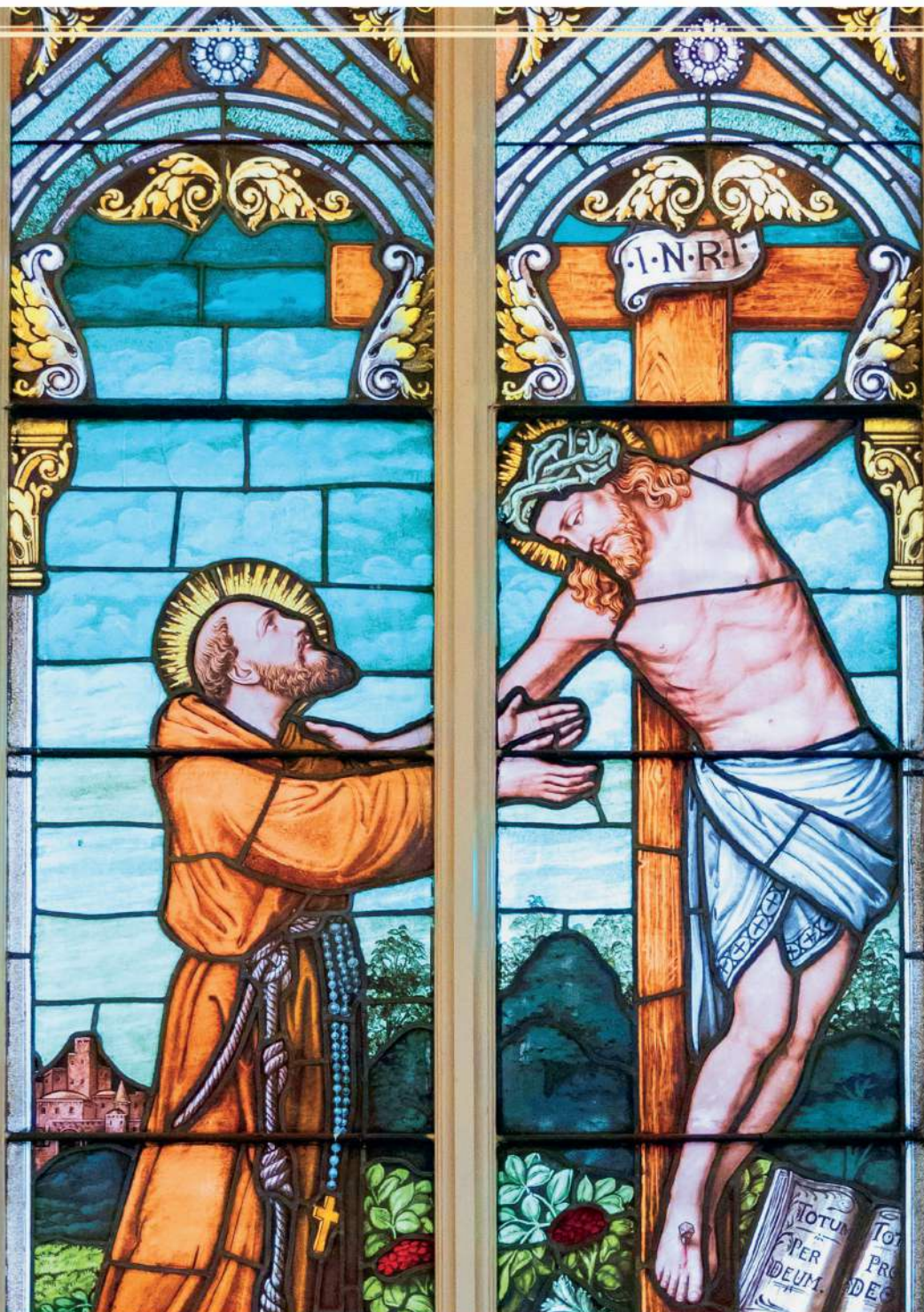

The Timeless Witness of St. Francis of Assisi

The heart of this weekend's celebration lies in the Jubilee of Saint Francis of Assisi, *Jubileo San Francesco*. This special Jubilee of Saint Francis proclaimed by Pope Leo XIV marks the occasion of the 800th anniversary of his death. The life of the *Poor Man of Assisi* shows that God's mercy works in history also through people who have opened their hearts to His Action. The Jubilee of Saint Francis is an opportunity for us to rekindle our faith, strengthen our relationship with God and with the community of the Church.

The figure of Saint Francis is particularly valuable in the context of spiritual fatigue. He does not propose more spiritual practices but simplicity and authenticity, a return to joy in small things, a faith lived in relationship, not only in events.

The year dedicated to Saint Francis can be an invitation to simplify prayer by deepening it, rather than multiplying it, to live the Gospel concretely rather than merely talking about it.

The life of Saint Francis shows that true imitation of Christ is not based on declarations or ideas, but on a concrete and real lifestyle rooted in the values of Jesus Christ. He reminds us of the timeless value of poverty and simplicity.

Saint Francis shows that peace is born from a converted heart, not from self-interested declarations or compromises without truth. In a world marked by conflict, violence and insecurity, his life is a call to build peace based on Christ the only Redeemer of humanity.

Your Faith in Focus

KEEP YOUR SABBATH HOLY

Why do we have to go to Mass every week?

Why Mass? The Mass is very specific, and the center of the Mass is the Eucharist. What are we doing as Catholics each Sunday and why? Today's reflection adapts helpful information about the Mass from the parents guide of *Chosen: Your Journey to Confirmation* (Ascension Press).

Source and Summit

As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches us, "The Eucharist is 'the source and summit of the Christian life'" (CCC 1324). It is the heart of who we are as Christians, as Catholics. In the Eucharist, heaven crashes into our lives. Whenever we go to Mass or visit a Catholic church, the living Jesus, the King of heaven, is there to meet us.

The Eucharist is Christ himself, truly present, under the appearance of bread and wine. This truth is so profound that we might not fully realize its meaning. In his hymn *Tantum Ergo*, St. Thomas Aquinas reminds us that what is hidden from our senses, we grasp with the help of faith.

At Mass, Jesus offers us himself, not merely encouragement or affirmation. Everything is

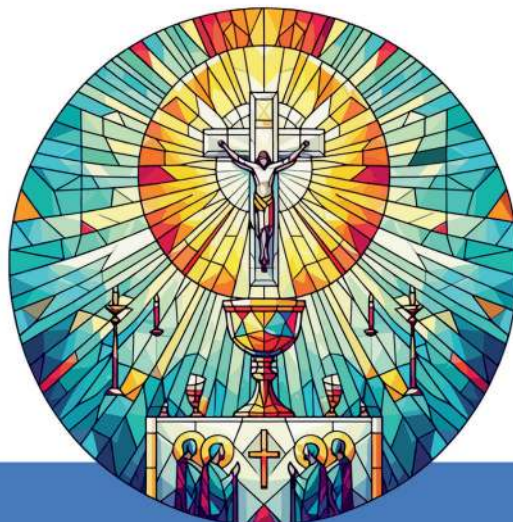
transformed, and we are united to God's love in the most intimate way. In Holy Communion, we are united with the living God—Jesus himself! What could possibly be more important?

Every Sunday, we are called to "conscious, active, and fruitful participation" in Mass (CCC 1071). Ignoring Sunday Mass has serious consequences. Most importantly, missing Mass deprives us of the gift of the Eucharist. Plus, when we intentionally skip Sunday Mass, we disregard the Third Commandment, "Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy" (Exodus 20:8), and we disregard Jesus' command to "do this in remembrance of me" (Luke 22:19).

To make Sunday Mass a pillar of your family life, make a fresh start by going to confession and Mass together, followed by a special meal. Consider how to help your family better engage in the experience. Before Mass—say, at bedtime the evening prior, at breakfast, or while driving to church—review the Sunday Mass readings together (usccb.org). Afterward, invite your child to share his or her thoughts about the readings or the homily.

Ponder and Pray

- When the question of why we go to Mass comes up, how do I answer my family?
- What are our family's Mass habits? What is one thing we can do to make our Sunday worship an even better experience?



Make It Your Own

One way that we enter into the Mass as Catholics is by spending time in the presence of the Eucharist outside of Mass. Make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament this week and journal about your experience (you may use the lines below). Ask Jesus this specific question: "Lord, how do you want me to meet you more deeply at Mass this week? How are you calling me to invite my family to draw closer to you?"

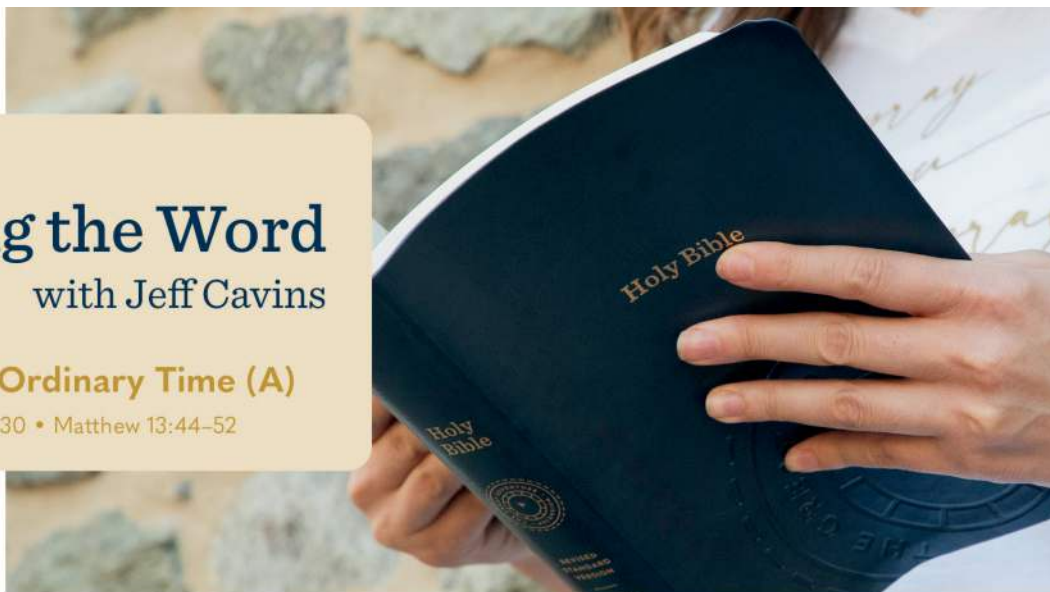

Encountering the Word

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (A)

1 Kings 3:5, 7-12 • Romans 8:28-30 • Matthew 13:44-52



The Pearl of Great Price



Every human heart longs for something that gives life meaning. People pour themselves into careers, possessions, hobbies, or relationships, often becoming consumed by whatever captures their desire. Yet today's Gospel rocks our foundations: Christ reveals that the only treasure worth giving everything for is the Kingdom of God. Jesus likens it to a hidden treasure or a pearl of great price, which is so valuable that one joyfully sells all else to obtain it.

This is not merely a call to admire the kingdom but to reorder our lives around it. The man who finds the treasure does not hesitate or grieve over what he gives up; he sells everything with joy, knowing the exchange is infinitely worth it. Likewise, discipleship demands a radical reorientation of priorities. When God's reign grips our hearts, lesser obsessions fall away, and we find the peace and joy that no possession or passing pleasure can offer.

The story of Solomon in today's first reading illustrates this wisdom. Solomon does not ask for wealth, long life, or power from God. He asks for an understanding heart to discern right from wrong. His request reveals that he treasures God's wisdom above all else, and God is pleased to grant it. True wisdom lies in desiring God himself more than any created thing.

St. Paul assures us that "all things work together for good for those who love God" (Romans 8:28). This promise does not mean that life will be easy, but everything in life can serve our sanctification when God's Kingdom is our greatest pursuit.

To live as disciples is to place Christ at the center of every decision, every longing, and every relationship. When we truly see the surpassing worth of the kingdom, we will not cling to the fleeting pearls of this world. We will joyfully give all to gain the one treasure that endures.

Living the Gospel

This week, choose one concrete way to place the Kingdom of God first. It may mean prioritizing prayer over entertainment, giving more generously of your resources, or making a decision based not on comfort but on faith. Let this act be a step toward making God your true treasure.

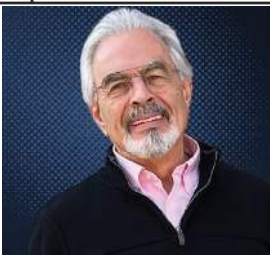
