An Important Decision

From time-to-time questions are asked about the sacraments.
Today we will look at the role of godparents for baptism.

Infant baptism is a time-honored tradition in the church. The Catholic Church views baptism as the first sacrament which washes away original sin, makes a person a child of God and brings them into the Church. When parents present their children for baptism, they profess their willingness to raise them in the faith. Assisting them are godparents who help guide and support the child on their lifelong spiritual journey.

The selection of godparents is a very important decision and should not be taken for granted. Those who are to be baptized may have one godparent or two. If two, one male and one female. The requirements for a baptismal sponsor are:

- Not be the father or mother of the one to be baptized.
- At least 16 years of age.
- A member of the Catholic Church who is living a life in harmony with the faith.
- Have received the sacraments of baptism, confirmation and Eucharist.
- If married, must be in a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church.

The godparent represents the Church, the community of faith, into which the child is being baptized and who will assist the child to grow in the faith. A Christian of another denomination may serve as a Christian witness together with a Catholic godparent.

As an end note the requirements for a baptismal sponsor are the same for a confirmation sponsor.

Encountering the Word

with Jeff Cavins

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time (A)

Isaiah 22:19–23 • Romans 11:33–36 • Matthew 16:13–20



The Gift of the Papacy



St Peter by Gerardus Laurentius Keultjes

In today's Gospel, Jesus poses a question that pierces the heart of every disciple: "Who do you say that I am?" Peter, speaking with faith inspired by the Father, confesses, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:15–16). In that moment, Jesus reveals his plan for the Church. He does not leave his followers in uncertainty or division, but establishes Peter as the rock and entrusts him with the keys of the kingdom. This is the beginning of the papacy, the office that would safeguard and hand on the Faith through every age.

The image of the keys recalls Isaiah's prophecy, where the steward, or prime minister, of the Davidic kingdom was given authority to act on the king's behalf. Now, in Christ's eternal kingdom, Peter is entrusted with this same authority, not for his own sake, but so the whole Church might be held together in unity. Whatever Peter binds or looses on earth will be bound or loosed in heaven, reminding us that this authority given to the Church is rooted not in human strength but in divine promise.

For us, this passage is not merely historical; it is profoundly personal. We live our faith with confidence because the Church, guided by the successor of Peter, teaches with the authority of Christ himself. This does not mean that popes are without weakness or sin, but that the office carries a special charism of the Spirit to guard the truth of the Gospel. In a world filled with conflicting voices and competing ideologies, the papacy stands as a visible sign of unity and a safeguard of truth.

To profess Christ as Peter did means not only to believe in him but also to trust the Church he built. The papacy is not a human invention, but a gift of Christ's love, ensuring that his sheep will never be left without a shepherd.

Living the Gospel

This week, pray intentionally for the pope, bishops, and priests who shepherd the Church. Consider offering a Rosary, a Holy Hour, or a small act of sacrifice for their strength and holiness. At the same time, reflect on your own role as a witness to unity. Ask yourself, "How can I be a living sign of faithfulness to Christ and his Church in my conversations, decisions, and relationships?"

Your Faith in Focus

A MAJOR RESPONSIBILITY

What is the role of a godparent?

When someone is asked to be a godparent, it is a joyful moment. In part, saying yes means getting dressed up, being there for a baptism, undertaking certain ceremonious responsibilities, and probably eating some cake after the Mass. But what is the deeper significance? What about after the ceremony? *Belonging*, Ascension's baptismal preparation program, answers those questions.

Sharing the Catholic Faith

A godparent's more important role kicks in after the ceremony: They are expected to help parents raise the child in the Catholic Faith. A godparent should be someone who can be a good example and spiritual mentor for your child. Although asking someone to be a godparent can be seen as a gesture of admiration and respect, it is most importantly about providing your son or daughter with a Catholic role model. Far from being merely a personal honor, being a godparent is ultimately about witnessing to one's own relationship with Jesus and the Church.

As with parenting, there is no exact prescription or "rule book" for how to be a godparent. Here are a few guidelines, however:

First, godparents should be actively practicing their Catholic Faith and striving to be a good witness of it. By

canon law, godparents must be confirmed Catholics in good standing with their own parish. (This is why a letter from their pastor is required prior to them being accepted as godparents.)

Second, godparents should be regularly invited to share their faith with your child over the years. The actual involvement of godparents can take many forms; it can even be effective long distance. Helping them to stay in your son or daughter's life will most likely require regular invitations on your part. As your child grows up, tell them about their godparents, and help them to keep in touch.

The special role of godparents can and should extend throughout your child's early years and adolescence. Hopefully, the relationship of spiritual support will remain meaningful even beyond those years.

- Who are your godparents? What has been their role in your life?
- Do you have godchildren? How can you connect more deeply with them?



Make it Your Own

Write a letter to your current or future godchildren. Here are some ideas for what to say:

- Assure your godchildren you will pray for them and develop a concrete plan to do so.
- Share your faith and testimony.
- Include some ideas for how to live as a faithful Catholic.
- Tell your godchildren how you became their godparent.
- Help them look ahead to Confirmation, share some information about how you were confirmed, and tell them the name you took and why.

Tip of the Week

Every day, pray for your godchildren and future godchildren.
