The Sacredness of Human Labor

There was a young man who never really knew what hard labor felt like. He was a college student studying drama, reading the works of great poets and authors, and acting in the local community theatre.

All that changed in 1939 when Germany invaded Poland at the start of World War II. Now along with other young men, the student found himself in a quarry, swinging a heavy sledgehammer, breaking rocks of limestone. He worked there for meager wages for 4 years. Despite what he had endured, he remained resilient, and faithful to his strong Catholic faith. The name of this intelligent student, this potential actor, this quarry worker was Karol Wojtyla whom we know as St. Pope John Paul II.

As Christians, we believe that our work matters not only for earthly progress or a way to make a living, but it is also for the development of the Kingdom of God. Our work is a form of continued preparation in God's creative plan.

As people of faith, whether we are compensated employees, a homemaker, a faithful volunteer, a manual laborer, teacher, lawyer, accountant or even retired, we all have been called by baptism to work for the Kingdom of God. Labor Day reminds us that when Jesus says, "Seek first the kingdom of God", it means doing that on behalf of others. Mindful of our sisters and brothers in need, we must act. God is working through us to right the wrongs we see. When we become aware of injustices, we must seek justice by advocating for the good. Our baptism calls us to do so for the common good of all.

This Labor Day, may we recognize all the laborers in the Lord's vineyard and embrace them for who they truly are - our brothers and sisters. Let us strive without ceasing to protect the sacredness of human life and together build a society that respects and uplifts each person's human dignity.

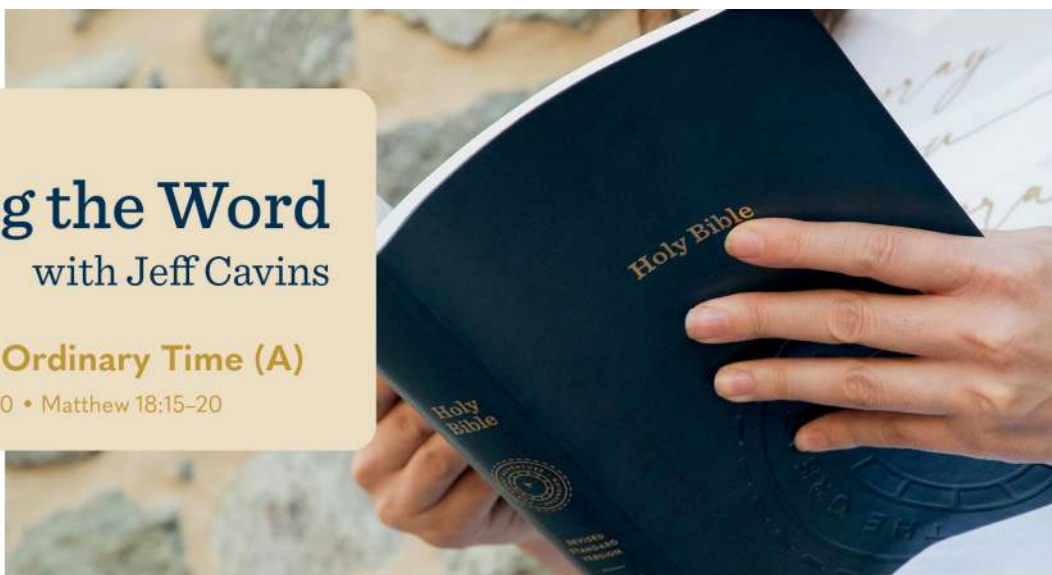

with Jeff Cavins

Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (A)

You Owe Others This Debt



Freedom from financial debt is something many people strive for, and rightly so. To live without owing banks or lenders brings a certain peace. Yet St. Paul reminds us in this Sunday's readings that there is one debt we can never pay off: the debt of love. He writes, "Owe nothing to anyone, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has

fulfilled the law" (Romans 13:8). Love, then, is not optional. It is the ongoing obligation of every disciple, a debt that deepens rather than diminishes with time.

This love is not simply sentiment. It is expressed in how we treat others, in choosing patience over irritation, forgiveness over resentment, sacrifice over self-interest. To love our neighbor means to will their good, especially their eternal good, and to act in ways that help draw them closer to God. The commandments, Paul explains, are all summed up in this one call to love.

The Gospel places this command into a very practical context. Jesus instructs his disciples how to address sin in their community: first privately, then with witnesses, and if necessary with the larger Church. At the heart of this process is not pride or vindication, but love. To confront another's sin is not to condemn them but to seek reconciliation, to restore communion, and to safeguard their soul. Love is patient and merciful, but it is also truthful and courageous.

Love is the foundation of all Christian living. It is the currency of the Kingdom of God and the measure by which we will be judged. When we choose love—even in conflict, even when wronged—we fulfill the law of Christ.

Living the Gospel

This week, identify one specific person with whom you feel tension, distance, or even resentment. Take one step toward love: Reach out with a phone call, offer a word of encouragement, extend forgiveness, or simply pray daily for their good. Love is not just a feeling—it is a choice to will the good of the other. As you do this, unite your act of love to Christ's own sacrifice and ask him to transform even the smallest offering into a seed of reconciliation.

The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers

The Church teaches that the economy must serve people, not the other way around. If the dignity of work is to be protected, then the basic rights of workers must be respected--the right to productive work, decent and fair wages, the organization and joining of unions, private property, and to economic initiative.

"The obligation to earn one's bread by the sweat of one's brow also presumes the right to do so. A society in which this right is systematically denied, in which economic policies do not allow workers to reach satisfactory levels of employment, cannot be justified from an ethical point of view, nor can that society attain social peace."

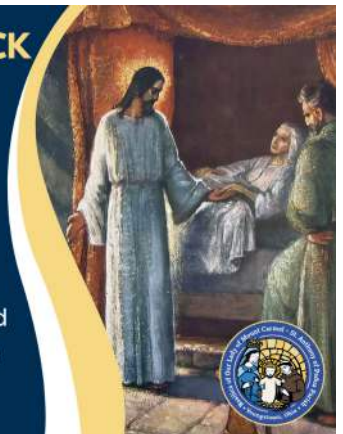
